

Districts Stay Busy Through November with Bishops' Days





Membership Retention Ideas

We have all asked the question (especially the Financial Secretaries in the branch) why do people join our branch, are excited about joining, and within a short time—leave. Why is retention of our members such a huge problem for our branches?

I am told that all organizations are faced with this problem. Typically, new members are the least likely to renew their membership and this statistic is devastating for smaller branches who need new members each year to grow.

Solving the problem of keeping new members may be as simple as getting them involved. New members tend to stick with a branch if they associate in meaningful ways.

One of the most powerful internal motivators on the planet is the sense of meaning and purpose. Members want a chance to take part in something meaningful and important. They want to make a difference.

Here are some retention ideas that might work in your branch.

1. Show your members how belonging to the ICF will directly benefit them. For example our Bishop's day program is one of the most important charities that we support. Putting on a fundraiser to support this program helps provide tuition for the seminarians who become our priests in the future.

2. Develop a Mentoring Program in your branch. Assign someone to sit with the new members, explain the workings of the branch, invite them to participate in a fundraiser, call them before the meeting to make sure they attend.

3. Have everyone fill out an annual Member Interest Survey. Find out what your members want for your branch.

4. Ensure that all members are active to their level of comfort, and a little beyond.

5. Have comfortable friendly meetings.

6. Be warm, smile a lot and always say "Hi!". We often joke about the fact that it takes a week after convention to get the smile off our face. Those people do smile a lot and I love it.

Many of you have asked Laurice for a copy of the speech she gave while receiving the Pope John XXII Award. Here it is in its entirety.

In Giving We Receive--Pope John XXIII Award by Laurice Levine.

To: Monsignor Cardelli and Dearest Members of the Clergy; Madame Grand President Dianda; Central Council; Michelle Feldman and ICF Staff, ICF Members; Family and Dear Friends:

THANK YOU! Thank you all so much for this great honor.

A lot of you have walked up to me just in the last two days and told me that I am an inspiration. Frankly, I find this hard to believe – I don't feel very inspiring. I usually feel like I am a bit behind the 8 ball, always trying to catch up, and simply just trying to survive, beat the odds that are stacked higher with each passing year, and do the best I can in my daily life. I never feel like I am grand or even great and usually it is the exact opposite -- behind closed doors I am a very self-deprecating person – a habit I am trying hard to break.

However, even though I do not find myself to be inspiring, I have many people and things that I do find inspiring some of which I will share with you.

- 1. THE ICF all of you so loving, generous, you all care about and better the community in which you live while respecting and holding true to your faith and heritage. The ICF is an example of how together we can be great.
- 2. My Dear Husband, Matt I cannot list the ways and reasons as there are too many. He truly cares about me and the people he loves. He is intelligent and kind. We take care of each other and are the best of friends. And he surprised me with a trip to Paris for my 40^{th} b.day which was a dream come true!
- 3. My Mom and Dad taught me what it means to be a good Catholic and they imparted good values on me; hard work, generosity, patience, respect toward self and others.
- 4. My animals Our Birds always remind me to be happy and sing joyfully; and our Corgi, Jozz inspires me with unconditional love and reminds me to live in the moment.
- 5. My Doctors for their hard work, dedication and support to me and the Thalassemia community. If it were not for Dr. Vichinsky I would not be standing here today.
- 6. The late Walt Disney creativity and passion for family, fun and adventure.
- 7. Children I work with in hospitals, at camp, in my neighborhood see the world's beauty and notice the things we overlook. Show Wisdom, perseverance and courage despite painful circumstances.

One thing I have tried to do in my life is turn lemons into lemonade. Appropriately said in Reno – we cannot control the hand we are dealt, but we can control how we play our cards. I have always tried to make the best of my situation. I have never seen it as tragic – there are much worse things in life – or

wished that I did not have thalassemia. If I did not have thalassemia I wouldn't be here today. Fortunately, I have learned much from my experiences which I will share:

- 8. Life is PRECIOUS live it or lose it. Try and live each day to its fullest it could all end tomorrow.
- 9. Tell the people you care about just that that you care about them, that you love them. Tell them how much they mean to you today. Don't wait for their eulogy.
- 10. Take One Step at a Time: examples

When it comes to health challenges when I was given a choice at age 25 to go on blood transfusion therapy or die in 5 years, the choice was simple. However, I began receiving blood transfusions when I lived 3,000 miles from home and then started my 12 hour (now 15 plus) a day infusion to get out iron each night. I was totally overwhelmed. I could not imagine doing this for a week let alone a lifetime. So I took one day at a time. You can apply this attitude to other areas of life – such as when you are faced with big projects; and dealing with grief and loss. When changing the world seems like a lost cause, focus on your corner of it. If everyone did this, the whole world would be cared for.

Listen – Everyone has a story. I already know mine.

Let go of what holds you back. The negative things or people in life keep us from soaring.

Don't Give Up! There have been many a dark hour in my life – as there are in all of our lives. Times we want throw in the towel. For me it has been heart failure and other major health scares, death of dear friends, and my days before Matt when I was single and lonely. In these times I leaned on God and the Holy Spirit to give me strength. With time, healing and light will come out of the darkness.

Life's Biggest Challenges have been great gifts and I feel truly blessed. This Pope John Award is life changing and an immense honor because it is from you – the ICF. I genuinely love this organization and the amazing individuals who comprise it. I know membership is down and that is a challenge – but the quality of this group is unsurpassed. And my motto has always been quality over quantity.

The love and friendship that you have given me over the past 12 years has become one of my life forces. In times of pain and doubt I think of you and you give me strength, hope and courage. When I was very sick with pneumonia last year and felt like death would be a relief; I felt your love and your prayers and they gave me the stamina I needed to hold on.

You have treated me like your own beloved family and have witnessed me reach some of life's most wonderful milestones. Thank you for always believing in me, cheering me on, and for your genuine love and neverending support. I love the ICF – you all mean the world to me. You are my family and my dearest of friends.

Thank you from the bottom of my heart for honoring me with this magnificent award.



Task Force - Leonard Zasoski

Strategic plan and operating procedures were the tasks put before the committee by the GP Jane Dianda. Will be concentrating on the strategic plan. Will bring plan recommendation to the February meeting. February to June will be implementing the plan... getting feedback from branches, districts, etc; June to Convention will work on a workshop for Convention. This will conclude Phase one -- with the feedback, after Convention will adjust and continue on. This will be a living document, constantly changing and adjusting.

Scholarship - Deborah Rodondi

Scholarship information is being printed and will be sent out end of Dec. beginning of January.

Teresa Helfand asked if they were doing things wrong by giving their own scholarships or can they send the money in and ask that it go to a particular person. Deborah Rodondi stated that they can ask that a certain area or school get it but not an individual. And if we can't fulfill that we will call the President of that Branch or District to see if they will allow it to go elsewhere. Roselynne Jarrett pointed out that by getting the scholarship from the ICF program the student is then eligible for 2nd, 3rd and 4thyear scholarships.

Public Relations – Leonard Zasoski for Vince Piro

Who is responsible for the different factions of Public Relations: Nettie Descalso-Del Nero- Awards & Press Releases; Nina Malone-Resolutions and Communications; Vince Piro – Website and Bollettino Production with Michelle Feldman; Michelle Feldman and BG Zasoski-Bollettino proofreading.

The Bollettino October issue had several problems that caused it to be late: articles and columns were late, software glitches. To resolve these issues, will create a list of due dates that will be strictly enforced and new software has been purchased.

Michelle Feldman is looking at different printing companies due to current low print quality.

The committee will also be looking into online or electronic only subscriptions (on a voluntary basis). Even if a small number of members opt to get their paper electronically, this could save the Federation thousands of dollars.

Awards and Press Releases

Once a month, Michelle, Vince and Nettie will work on getting out two press releases to Catholic and Italian-American newspapers.

Nettie is working on an article and directions to be sent to Branch and District presidents on how to generate PR in their area.

We will review and revise the Awards forms later in the year with the hopes of streamlining the process and getting more applicants. However, we also want to be sure to use the Awards to stimulate publicity for the Federation, especially the Pope John and Mother Teresa awards. Let's think of some "big names" that are

deserving of such awards. Remember the awards are a good way to "publicize" the Federation.

Website

Recently went through an update in which old and outdated pages were revised or removed

The Calendar winners are now part of the online version of the paper

Added a Quarterly Treasurer's Report in Excel format (thanks to Rose Jarrett) and a Certificate of Appreciation in Word format under the Forms column.

Contact Vince Piro DIRECTLY with concerns and ideas about the paper, website, or other PR Committee matters.

Rose Jarrett suggested it would be helpful to post on the web and in the Bollettino the chairs and the members of the CC committees.

Live to Give-Nina Malone

27 units of blood collected at the convention. Will be educating individuals on who can and cannot give blood. Possible future articles from members who are donors or recipients. Looking into working in collaboration with other organizations on blood drives.

Heritage - Nancy Corsi

Wants to expand the recorded interviews to long-standing branch members.

Would like to create a picture yearbook. Will investigate the cost and see if it is feasible

Dante Galeazzi suggests someone film the Mother Cabrini event, so that it can be shared.

Membership - Roselynne Jarrett

Currently 11,212 members. Fewer delinquent branches this year than last.

Membership table at Convention passed out membership board kits. She has gotten feedback from some of the branches. Branches would like the template so they can adjust the info and personalize it with branch info.

To bring back the survey from 5 years ago and adding more. 1) A question postcard for why someone is quitting the ICF; 2) branch membership questionnaire; 3) individual member questionnaire.

Nina Malone suggested promoting membership with a free meal at the meeting.

Hospitalization – Patricia Mages

Trying to come up with ways of getting people to join the program might do some testimonials. Educate the Financial Secretaries and the Presidents to promote the program.

Have cleaned up the forms and applications so it appears less confusing to individuals.

Gifts of Love -Andy Pappani

\$61,000 in the fund. July 20th committee met, reviewed 50 applications, granted 10 requests for about \$11,000.

With Dante Galeazzi met with a cleric regarding starting a CCD program for the Diocese of Stockton. Right now 3 parishes in Stockton area have a signed mass.

Finance Committee- Roselynne Jarrett in for George Bacigalupi

The committee moved to accept the Proposed Providenza Fund Donations for 2013 PASSED.

Finance Workshop at Convention -- discussed the importance of filing your e-tax statements and sending in your financial reports. 6 months ago there were about 60 branches not sending in financial reports, about 50% have since turned in reports.
