condemnations. He is the most perfect example of the love that Jesus showed the world.



But some of my fondest memories of my childhood revolve around the wonderful times shared with my family and the many friends gained by our active participation in the ICF.

So, as we quickly are coming to the end of another year and look forward with optimism toward 2015, there are so many things to get accomplished; homes to decorate, holiday parties to attend, and lots of shopping to be done... As we struggle to find that "perfect" gift for someone we love or for that friend who has everything, think about what we treasure most as Italians and as Catholics... the answer to this question may be right in front of us; membership in the ICF!

The following is an excerpt from "Christmas Italian style – credit where credit is due" by Robert A. Masullo – Sacramento Bee Staff Writer; Dec. 20, 1987

"Although the U.S. has derived Christmas

traditions from all European countries, it is usually Germany (Christmas trees) and England (Christmas cards and plum pudding) that get the most credit.

Growing up in an Italian-American family, I suspected Italy must have its share of contributions. Start with the celebration itself. The earliest known Christmas did not take place until 336 A.D. – in Rome. Italians were the first to observe Christmas. They set the date. Christ's actual birth is unknown, but Rome's fourth-century Christians chose Dec. 25 to counter pagan holidays, honoring Saturn and Calends, which fell then.

By the middle ages, Christmas had diminished to a minor holiday. But in 1223 Italy revitalized it with the introduction of an artifact that remains popular throughout the Christian world. That year, Francis of Assisi, Italy's patron saint, asked Giovanni Vellita to prepare the first-ever presipio (Nativity set) for the hermitage at Greccio. Soon afterwards, Nativity sets were put up in churches throughout Europe. Some 500 years later two Neapolitans, King Carlo III and Gregorio Maria Rocco (a Dominican friar) extended their use to homes and public places.

The most important Italian tradition is the centering of the holiday around the family; summed in the maxim: "Natale festeggialo coi tuoi/ Capodanno con chi vuoi" ("Christmas you celebrate with your own/New Years with whomever you like"). Like many Italian traditions, this is spiritually rooted. Italians see Christ's birth underscoring the unity of Joseph, Mary and Jesus' family."

Instructions for Obtaining a Daily/ Special Temporary Liquor License

Y ou must fill out an ABC-221 form for any event that your branch holds that will include the sale of alcohol.

Form ABC-221 must be submitted to the local ABC District Office which has jurisdiction over the event location.

The form needs to be received, at your branch, within 10 days of the event.

Police Department approval may be required if your branch is hosting a large number of people, a casino night is held,

or it's the first time an event is being held at the location.

If conducting the event on church property, you must obtain the signature of the business manager of the church, or whoever else may be in charge.

If conducting a raffle in which wine or liquor will be included in a basket or other gift item, a \$100.00 Special Temporary License will be needed. This special license can be found in Section C on the ABC-221 form.

ITALIAN CATHOLIC FEDERATION HISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

David Botta & Carmen Kilcullen ICF Past Grand Presidents

- Around 1921, Luigi Providenza came to the Bay Area and began working for an Italian newspaper called "L'Unione" and traveled from Oakland to Bakersfield.
- The idea of starting the Federation came to Luigi as he visited Italian families and noticed that many did not attend Church.
- Luigi met Fr. Albert Bandini, who was Pastor of St. Michael Church in Stockton, and explained his idea of organizing the Federation. Fr. Bandini approved the idea and wrote the Statutes, By-Laws, Rituals, etc.
- On June 15, 1924, the first organizational meeting was held at the Immaculate Conception Church in San Francisco with 12 founding members which became the Central Council.
- In October, 1924, Archbishop Edward J. Hanna gave his approval to the Structure and Statutes of the Federation.
- On November 29, 1924, the Central Council was incorporated with 12 founding members. (Later known as Life Members.)
- On December 7, 1924, Br. #1 in San Francisco was inaugurated with 300 members.
- In March, 1925, the first issue of the Bollettino was printed by Fr. Bandini.
- On June 14, 1925, the first <u>unofficial</u> Convention was held in San Francisco with 5 Branches present. (12 Branches were needed to have an official Convention.)
- On May 29, 1927, the first official Convention was held in San Francisco with 13 Branches present. 12 members were elected to the Central Council plus the 12 Life Members making a total of 24.
- In 1929, the District and Branch Deputy program began.
- In 1941, the first Seminary Burse of \$500 was presented to Archbishop Mitty at the Stockton Convention.
- In 1950, the first Branch in Chicago was inaugurated.

- In 1957, the Federation began to recruit Missionaries to help with the spiritual needs of the members and to open new Branches. (Before this time, Missionaries helped the Federation as volunteers.)
- The first Branch in Reno was inaugurated.
- In 1959, the Hospitalization Plan and the Apostolate Fund were organized.
- The Central Council was increased to 15 Elected and 15 Life making a total of 30 members.
- In 1964, the Scholarship Program began with 8 Scholarships being awarded.
- That year also marked the beginning of the charter flights to Italy.
- In 1970, the first Pope St. John XXIII Award was presented to Dr. Joseph Middleton.
- In 1979, the first Grand President's Award was presented to Laura Bozzini, a charter member of #1 in San Francisco.
- In 1981, the Sir Luigi and Lady Augusta Providenza Seminary Scholarship Fund was approved.
- In 1983, the First National Charity Award in the amount of \$50,000 was presented to Dr. Carol Hyman for the Cooley's Anemia program at Cedars-Sinai Hospital in Los Angeles.
- In 1996, the Gifts of Love Program was approved.
- The first Family of the Year Award was presented to the Garfagnoli Family of Santa Rosa at the Annual Convention..
- The Organ Donor Awareness Program was organized.
- In 1998, the first Branch in Arizona was inaugurated.
- The Central Council was downsized to 24 12 Elected and 12 Life Members.
- In 1999, at the June Central Council meeting, the mandatory retirement age of 75 went into effect for all Life and Elected Members.
- The first Mother Teresa Award was presented to Fr. Floyd Lotito.

Where We Got The Bible: Our Debt to the Catholic Church

Where We Got the Bible: Our Debt to the Catholic Church was originally a series of lectures presented by Henry G. Graham in 1908-09. It was first published in 1911, making the publication over 100 years old. Of course, the material remains valid today, as it was when it first came out.

The narrative is a response to many different arguments presented by the Protestants regarding the Catholic Church's role in preserving the Bible. The Protestants claimed that the Catholic Church forbid the translation of the Bible to vernacular tongues, and that the general population was forbidden from having access to or reading the Bible. They also claimed that the Catholic Church martyred those who attempted to translate the Bible. Finally, they claimed that it was their protestant efforts that made the Bible available to the masses. Each argument is explored and answered.

As we all know, the Catholic Church actually preserved and copied Bibles for over one thousand years before the protestant reformation. Without the efforts of the Catholic Church, there would be no Bible. In fact, the Catholic Church predates the Bible as the Vulgate, the final, official compilation, was completed by Saint Jerome in the late 4th century. This presents a difficult protestant doctrinal problem as they believe in obtaining all of their Christian faith from the Bible, only. If so, how could there be Christians before the Bible was compiled?

Once compiled, passages from the Bible were read to all who attended Mass. It was not hidden. There are examples of translations of the Bible. The Venerable Bede was working on a translation when he died. There are not many translations that survived the centuries. As these books had precious stones in their cover and gold leaf, persons wishing to enrich themselves

with the precious metals destroyed many.

Protestant claims that the Catholic Church martyred those who attempted to translate the Bible must be looked at carefully. The Protestants point to Wycliff and Tyndale. Both were disaffected Roman Catholic clergy who fell away from the church and were teaching heresy. They were not Bible scholars. Their translations were not only full of errors, but also full of changes to the scriptures to support their positions. It was these works that were burned. The Catholic Church was exercising her authority to make sure that the scriptures that we have are correct. Wycliff finally died of a stroke (not martyred as Protestants would like to believe). It is interesting to note that Tyndale's Bible translation was so poor that King Henry the VIII condemned it. Yet, it was Tyndale's version that eventually was the basis for the English translation during Henry the VIII's time.

Since the early Bibles were copied by hand by monks who labored years to preserve them, the books were expensive. Ordinary people could not each have a Bible in their homes. The printing press finally made Bibles within financial reach of many.


The author's tone is almost conversational and is very easy to read. He presents each point clearly and with sufficient background that we do not have to be Bible scholars to understand the material. The Henry G. Graham was consecrated an Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh in Scotland. What is truly interesting is that he did not have a Catholic upbringing. As a son of a minister in the Presbyterian Church of Scotland, he was trained to be a minister himself and actually became one. As such, he was raised in an environment where the ministers considered "Catholicism to stand for filth and degradation, lying and dishonesty, and look upon it as the sure forerunner of temporal decadence, intellectual stagnation, and spiritual bondage" (pg 117). Despite this upbringing, he took a spiritual and intellectual journey to the Catholic Church. He realized that this journey would cut him off from family and friends. Even with this realization, he knew that he had to make the journey. He was not satisfied with the Presbyterian school of thought, based on the principles developed by John Calvin. The idea that each person can interpret the Bible seemed wrong to him, as he saw the results of this principle. There was never agreement even among his Presbyterian minister's group. He knew that Jesus intended for there to be one truth. His quest led him home to the Catholic Church. The story of his conversion is included in the book and is titled From the Kirk to the Catholic Church.
