Pope John XXIII Award Winner Wayne Shaffer Bringing People Together

The Italian Catholic Federation is proud to present the 2011 Pope John XXIII Award to Wayne Shaffer of Branch 21, Santa Cruz. In the early years, Wayne served his country by becoming an Eagle Scout, serving four years in the US Navy and volunteered with the Selective Service Board for twenty years.

As a life long member and alumni of Holy Cross parish and school he served in many capacities from altar server, head usher, Eucharistic minister to president of the parish council.

He currently coordinates the outreach ministry to Sunshine Villa. He also gives his

time in maintenance projects for the church grounds.

"He is a kind and giving person and very generous to the needy," said Julie Locatelli, president of Branch 21, Santa Cruz. "He is truly a God-send to our community and we are all so proud that he is a member of the Italian Catholic Federation, Branch 21."

For 34 years, Wayne has volunteered twice a month at Dominican Hospital visiting patients and offering Holy Communion. He has been involved with St. Francis soup kitchen since 1989. He is currently serving his 15th year as president of the Board of Directors. He also co-founded and serves

Just like Pope John XXIII, Wayne tries to bring people together across whatever boundaries there might be: religious, social, economic, cultural, language, etc. He is a man of deep prayer and concern for social justice, especially for the most downcast and vulnerable. Indeed, Wayne “lights up” when helping a mother in need at Siena Maternity Home, which he co-founded, and he is especially animated when engaging people in social and, particularly, outreach activities.

“He has a special place in his heart for actions for those in need, and he is constantly working to lift them up, usually in the most gentle and unnoticed of ways,” said Rev. Mark Stetz, pastor at Holy Cross Church in Santa Cruz. “Wayne’s religion and spirituality are dynamically lived out in his actions and outlooks. Like Pope John XXIII, his prayer is incarnate in his life, actions and caring. And like the Pope who opened windows to let the Spirit in, Wayne dedicates himself creatively and reliably to bring about necessary change and improvement for many.”

After the passing of his brother in 1997, Wayne developed a private park as a memorial for his brother and friends. With athletic and religious themes, Wayne shares his park with various youth groups, scouts, service clubs and church groups. He is described as vibrant and vital parishioner. Just like Pope John XXIII, Wayne works to bring people together across whatever boundaries there might be. Wayne lives his faith out in ways that inspire many others to help others. While not seeking a spotlight, he is well known and admired for his generous service.

“Pope John XXIII was known for his deep desire – so integrated in his being – to unite people and get people to work together for the good of all. He was a pioneer in collaboration, visioning, and selfless service,” Rev. Stetz said. “Wayne Shaffer lives this out in ways that inspire many in our parish, diocese and civic community.”

“It is not an exaggeration to say that Wayne Shaffer is a ‘community treasure,’” said Ken Cole, Homeless Services Center executive director. “He is someone who ‘walks his talk’ and is known by his works. And his works are many.”

Over the years, Liana has organized many fundraisers for the Italian radio programs, Little Sisters of the Poor Aux., Cathedral School for Boys, and the Italian-American Community Service Aux. She has been co-editor for Italian TV programs, and a translator for recent Italian arrivals in the SF Bay Area.

“Over the years, Liana has worked for the church, the parish and the elementary school here in the Marina,” said Rev. John K. Ring, pastor of The Church of St. Vincent de Paul in San Francisco. “She has demonstrated her love of the church and the religious in various ways. When asked, she and her late husband, Aldo, readily agreed to assist at events at the church.”

At the branch and district level, membership recruitment has always been an important goal for Liana. With her branch officers, Liana attempts new avenues to attract members, such as creating a bowling league. Liana has been instrumental in promoting branch scholarships for the parish school and the ICF Scholarship Fund.

“It is due to her efforts and her branch officers that this branch has remained active and vital in the Federation,” said ICF Grand Treasurer and Past Grand President George Bacigalupi.

Liana’s work hasn’t just been noticed by the ICF... it goes a bit more global. In 1976, the Italian government awarded the title “Cavalieri della Stella Solidarita” for service to the Italian community.
