## Notification of Intention to Run for Central Council at the 2016 Convention

### Application Process

1. Applications are available from the I.C.F. Office.
2. Candidates' completed applications must be received by the I.C.F. Office by August 1 in order to be eligible to run for Central Council.
3. A candidate who is not currently a Central Council Member must be a branch delegate to the Convention.

### Other Pre-Convention Deadlines

1. If you wish to place a full-page ad in the convention souvenir book; the ad contract, your photo and a message must be sent to the I.C.F. Office by July 1.
2. Candidate entries to be included in the Bollettino, must be emailed to both the I.C.F. Office and the Bollettino Editor by August 1. Email [admin@icf.org](mailto:admin@icf.org) and [icfeditor@gmail.com](mailto:icfeditor@gmail.com). Submissions should include a photo and an entry that does not exceed 300 words.

### Campaign Rules

1. Only one poster (maximum size 24 X 36) may be displayed in the area designated by the Convention Director.
2. Campaign flyers and non-consumable campaign favors may only be given out on Friday evening during "Meet the Candidates." Food and beverage items may not be distributed during "Meet the Candidates."
3. As voted upon at the February 2016 Central Council Meeting, there will be no candidate hospitality rooms. This decision was made in order to follow the hotel's quiet time policy. If a district hosts a hospitality room at any time during the convention weekend, there shall be no candidate posters, flyers or other campaign paraphernalia available in the hospitality room.

# Organizing a Membership Drive

Spring has arrived and it’s time to uncover the backyard barbeque and dust off the bocce ball set! With the celebration of Easter and arrival of Spring comes the time for all things fresh and new, including members for your branch. Start planning now so that your group will be well organized and prepared as the scheduled date arrives. Here are some easy guidelines to help you along:

1. Ask permission. Your pastor or parish administrator may already have a Ministry or Organization Fair scheduled for the year; gladly welcoming ICF participation. If not, find out which dates would work best with the parish facility schedule. Pick a weekend with the least conflicts.

2. Know the Rules. Your branch should be aware of any parish policies and procedures to be followed. For example, is it okay to set up tables in the vestibule, stuff flyers in the bulletins or make an announcement at the end of each weekend Mass using our two-minute short script? Knowing the rules ahead of time will maintain a healthy working relationship between your branch and the parish staff.

3. Get your members involved. There are plenty of jobs to go around, so delegate! The more people involved, the more excitement you will generate. Appoint a chairperson/committee to carry out the tasks listed below.

4. Develop a flyer/handout. It is a proven fact that a colored flyer will grab much more attention than a simple “blurb” in the church bulletin. If the parish allows, create a handout that simply explains the who’s, what’s, when’s and where’s of your branch. Remember to keep it simple yet informative; contact information, meeting times, location, membership eligibility, what is the ICF, etc. This is an effective tool for all of your branch events; put out these flyers at your dinners and

parish events too!

5. Coordinate with Parish Staff. If the parish allows for a bulletin insert, ask the office secretary how many flyers should be printed and when your branch members should be available to stuff the church bulletins. If you need extra help with this, consider asking the parish school or youth group if any of the children could use some extra community service hours. This is a great way to interconnect with other ministries within the parish. Make sure to print several extra copies for your Membership table.

6. Prepare an announcement. If the pastor will allow your branch to make a short announcement, use the two-minute script as a guideline. Appoint someone that is comfortable with talking in front of large crowds and has a clear speaking voice. If the pastor would prefer to do the announcement himself, supply information about the branch’s accomplishments and where your team will be located for the membership drive after Mass.

7. Create an ICF Membership Board. Using the Membership Kit that is available on the ICF website, appoint a member to gather branch photos and the necessary supplies to create your ICF Membership Board. Make sure to highlight Bishop’s Days, Corporate Communion Masses, Joint Installations, religious events, fundraisers, youth activities, picnics, etc.

8. Set-up for success. Coordinate with the parish to set up a table in a well-trafficked area; a place that most everyone will pass by after each Mass. If the area allows, make a banner or large sign that is colorful and easy to read; drawing attention to your table. The table itself should include your Membership Board, ICF brochures, handouts, Bollettinos, posters, memorabilia, balloons; even some hard candies or small giveaway items. Everyone loves to get something for free!

9. Sign them up. Create an information worksheet for perspective members that include their name, phone number, email address and mailing address. In turn, have something to give them; a business card, brochure or flyer. Invite them to be your guest at the next branch meeting; be sure to let them know the date, time and location. Be sure to check out our “Branch Visitor” and “New Member” packets at [www.icf.org](http://www.icf.org) for more ideas and resources.

So before the “lazy days of summer” begin and everyone goes out of town on vacation, gather your branch members together and organize a Membership Drive. There is no risk and all reward, plus you will have fun in the process! # ICF HISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

## The Garfagnoli Family -- A True Family Affair!

In 1996, the Italian Catholic Federation initiated the Family of the Year Award. This award is given to an ICF family (can include grandparents, children, grandchildren etc.) that demonstrates Christian service in the parish and community and places high priority on participation and leadership in the Federation. The award is presented by the Grand President at the Sunday morning session of the annual convention. The first family to receive this award (in 1996) was the Garfagnoli Family of Branch 52 in Healdsburg, CA. Then Grand President George Bacigalupi presented the award.

This Italian-American family began their sojourn in America when Giuseppe and Miria Garfagnoli left their native Tuscany and made their way to California. Today, the family has grown to four generations living in Healdsburg and Santa Rosa.

Members of the family are still active in the Federation and have been involved in branch activities over the years. Giuseppe served as Branch President in 1997, 1988 and 1998. He and his family were known for organizing fund raisers, working behind the scenes on wonderful dinners and ready to serve wherever, whenever and however needed. He was also active on the Parish Council and served as Eucharistic Minister at the church. Daughter Linda Sherman served as branch president in 1986 and 1992-1995. She was also the president of the Santa Rosa District where, presently, she is the treasurer. Linda also served on the Central Council in 1996-97 and 2012-2014. Her husband, Glen, is a trustee for the district.

## Gaetano (Guy) Masciotra Passes Away

Members of the Italian Catholic Federation were saddened to hear of the recent death of Guy Masciotra. Many members may never have heard of him, but old-time ICFers remember him well. Guy worked tirelessly for the Federation for many years, traveling from California to Illinois starting branches. It is said that he alone was responsible for starting more than 100 new branches! Guy is a large part of our history and heritage.

Guy was born on January 13, 1922 in the Abruzzi region of Italy. He received his early schooling in Italy and later moved to British Columbia where he and his father started a fruit business. Moving to the San Fernando Valley, Guy again worked in the fruit and produce business delivering goods to the markets in the area.

Guy joined the ICF in 1952, becoming a member of Branch 101- Burbank. He held various branch and Los Angeles district offices and was elected a Central Council member in 1954. He was a Life Member Emeritus of the Central Council.

In 1962, Guy was appointed Assistant Field Director working alongside the ICF co-founder, Luigi Providenza. In this capacity, Guy began traveling everywhere, opening branches wherever possible. He built up good relationships with bishops and parish priests and had a special knack for motivating people to join the ICF. One did not say “no” to Guy! In 1969, he was appointed Field Director and Convention General Chairman. As Field

Linda’s sister, Laura, served as branch president in 1996. The grandchildren, Jason, Emily and Sabrina often helped at dinners and events. A third daughter, Nancy Holt, was a branch officer until she moved to Oregon.

Where are they now?

Sadly, Giuseppe passed away in 2010, a great loss for the Federation. His widow, Miria, now 89 years young, is the “Grande Dame” of the branch, respected and admired by all for her graciousness and friendliness. Linda and her husband, Glen, are both Santa Rosa District officers. Their daughter, Emily, is married and has a son. Son Jason works in the area and is engaged to be married.

Laura has since married Dennis Jacques and they live in Santa Rosa. Laura’s daughter, Sabrina also works in the Santa Rosa area.

Nancy Holt has returned to Healdsburg where she now works and lives with her mother.

As one can see, The Garfagnoli Family was truly representative of the meaning and intent of the Family of the Year Award and well deserving of this honor.

2015 Convention – The 2015 Family of the Year Award was presented to the Zanini Family of Branch 354 in Paso Robles, CA by Grand President Bob Basuino. David and Irma Zanini and their children, Melissa, Brooke, Hope and Austin form a very active nucleus for the branch. They are regarded as the life and soul of the branch, serving as officers, helping with dinners and fundraisers, helping at nursing homes, recruiting new members and assisting wherever needed.

As with the Garfagnoli Family, we witness the spirit and enthusiasm that these two families continually bring to the ICF.

Director, he continued working with branches on expansion and, as Convention Director, he oversaw convention proceedings until he left the position in 1990. Luigi Providenza said of Guy, “I know more than many people, how much you have done for the ICF and only one Guy when it comes to the ICF.” Those of us who know Guy, know how much he did for the Federation.

In 1942, Guy married Eva Carrafa, who has also been an extremely important part of his ICF life. They were married for 73 years! Guy and Eva have two daughters, Emily and Linda, five grandchildren, and 9 great-grandchildren.

In addition to his ICF work, Guy was busy with other projects. He helped spearhead the campaign to build the Mother Cabrini Senior Housing. He also worked on the campaign to build the Villa Scalabrini Retirement Center. He has also done much work for the Italian community at St. Peter’s Church in Los Angeles.

In 1961, Guy received the Star of Solidarity from the Italian government, an award given to those who have worked in the Italian community for its betterment. In 2014, the Abbruzzesi and Molisani di California, awarded Guy “Il Distintivo D’Oro” (the Golden Pin), which comes from Italy and is given for meritorious service to an organization.

At the time of his passing, Guy was 92 years young and not in very good health. Our condolences are extended to his wife, Eva, and all his family. Rest in Peace, Guy!

## IRS AND STATE OF CALIFORNIA FRANCHISE TAX BOARD

As you are aware, the IRS and Franchise Tax Board for the State of California require annual tax returns to be filed by our Districts and Branches.

It is important to remember that all Districts and Branches now have two numbers - a Federal Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the IRS and a State Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the State

The IRS limit for the tax year ending 2015 is the following:

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file IRS Form 990 EZ or 990.

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file IRS Form 990-N which is an e-Postcard.

The State limit for the tax year ending 2015 is the following:

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file State Form 199.

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file State Form 199-N which is an e-Postcard.

\*\*\*THIS IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND MUST BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED\*\*\*

Both Forms must be filed no later than May 15, 2016. The IRS and State strictly adhere to this date, so please take this process seriously.

Any District or Branch who does not file for 3 consecutive years will lose its tax exempt status with the IRS and the State. If you lose your tax exempt status you will have to file paperwork and pay a fine in order to regain your tax exempt status.

Included in the Financial Secretaries' packet are materials that the District and Branch Financial Secretaries will need to help them with this process. District and Branch Presidents - please work with your Financial Secretary to go over the information when it is received and see that the appropriate forms are filed by the due date.

\*\*\*\*\*

Please make sure all District or Branch finances are in order and that Bank Statements are reconciled through December 31, 2015. Remember that the Gross Receipts are total amounts received without subtracting any costs or expenses. These amounts include, but are not limited to, Membership and Hospitalization Dues, Dinners, Fundraisers, Raffle Tickets, Income from Convention Raffle Tickets and Calendar Sales, Interest from all Bank Accounts, Monetary Donations, etc.

Family Recipes

Hope everyone had a delicious St. Patrick’s Day, St. Joseph’s table and Easter! Three such diverse events: a traditional American/Irish meal; what is often a potluck, with a chance to taste a lot of different recipes; and a religious holiday, steeped in family/heritage tradition.

This month I promised a recipe that was requested by an ICF member. Hope this helps. We all have our favorite rice torte recipes. In researching them I realize they can be very plain, with just a few eggs to a lot more, and tasty additions. One of my brothers’ had a favorite that we always had to make for him, here it is:

Torte di Riso

- 1 1/3 cup rice
- 4 cup boiling water
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 Tbls. oil
- 1 chicken bouillon cube

Bring the 4 cups of water to a boil. Add rice, salt, oil and bouillon cube; cook for 15 minutes. Let cool.

- Chop the following ingredients very fine and add to the rice:
- 3 Tbls. Onion
  - 3 Tbls. Parsley
  - pinch of oregano and thyme
  - 2 cloves of garlic or 1 tsp. garlic salt

- Next add the following ingredients to the rice mixture, and stir well:
- ¾ cup Parmesan cheese, minus 3 Tbls. For use later
  - 3 eggs, slightly beaten
  - 2 Tbls. Oil
  - ¼ cup milk

Oil bottom and sides of 9x13 inch baking dish. Dust with bread crumbs. Pour in rice mixture. Beat one egg slightly with 2 Tbls. Oil and pour on top of rice. Sprinkle with the 3 Tbls. Parmesan cheese that was put aside earlier. Bake in 375 degree oven for 30-40 minutes. Serve warm or cold.

NOTE: If desired you may make a pie crust instead of using bread crumbs. I have not tried it with the pie crust.

Rice Torte Rodondi Style

- 1 cup rice
  - 2 ½ cups water
  - 1 tsp. salt
  - 1 chicken bouillon cube
- Bring water to boil. Add rice, salt and bouillon, cover and reduce heat to low. Simmer until rice is tender about 20 minutes. Set aside and let cool.

- In a large bowl:
- 7 eggs, slightly beaten
  - ½ cup milk (I used evaporated milk)
  - 1 ¼ cups Parmesan cheese, grated
  - ¼ cup Parmesan cheese for top of Torte
  - 2-3 Tbls. parsley
  - 1-2 cloves garlic, minced
  - ¼ tsp. dry ground oregano, or 1 tsp. fresh
  - 1 bunch green onions (about 6), chopped
  - salt and pepper
- Add cooked rice. Stir to combine.

Brush an 11x8 inch baking dish with butter or olive oil. Pour mixture into baking dish and smooth with spatula. Sprinkle ¼ cup Parmesan cheese over top. Bake in 350 degree oven for 40-45 minutes, or until mixture is cooked through and set and lightly browned on top.

- ALTERNATES:
- 1) Instead of green onions use a medium yellow or white onion, sautéed until cooked but not browned.
  - 2) 2 medium zucchini, shredded.
  - 3) 1 cup chopped swiss chard, sautéed in olive oil with garlic
  - 4) 2 Tbls. Fresh chopped basil
  - 5) Use your imagination!
- NOTE: Freezes well.

In researching I combined many recipes from my cookbooks and came up with this one, and of course I used a Branch event as my tasting ground. It went over very well.

## Did You Know?

When I was four years old my parents purchased a five acre ranch in Los Gatos, Ca. I grew up in the Almaden Area of Los Gatos. I came across a book called “History of Los Gatos,” and since I grew up on a ranch in Los Gatos I decided to research Los Gatos. I found out our ranch was part of Rinconada de Los Gatos, which means “The corner of the Cats.” The town of Los Gatos was incorporated in 1887, it was a quaint town with a population of 1,645 people. It was the stopping place for wagons traveling the treacherous trail from Santa Cruz to San Jose, Ca. Forbes Mill was the center of industry for the town. People were attracted to the mild climate and the beauty of the area.

Did you know Los Gatos once had a perfume factory that produced Rose Water? They planted the famous Castilian Rose from Spain and each petal had to be hand picked by children. The cost making perfume was too costly, and after 10 years they gave up on making Los Gatos the perfume capital of the world.

Did you know Los Gatos was known for its cannery? In 1882 the Los Gatos Canning Co. was located on North Santa Cruz Ave. They not only canned fruit but also had a large drying shed for dried fruit. Most of the fruit was shipped to the East Coast. Hunts purchased the plant in 1935 and closed it in 1955 because the cost of running a seasonal plant was to costly. The closing of the cannery ended an era of history in Los Gatos.

John Bean who Bean Ave. is named after, developed the Bean Spray Pump to spray the fruit trees in the Valley. Later, his son-in-law, D.C. Crummey, started a plant on Julian Street in San Jose, Ca., to make cookers for the canneries. It was at that site that FMC (Food Machinery Corporation) was developed. My husband Russ and his father both worked for FMC.

Today, Los Gatos is still a quaint city and still a stopping place for people traveling on Highway 17 to Santa Cruz, Ca.

## Why Give Blood?

### Important Facts About the Dire Need for Blood

By The Live to Give Committee

- One person every 2 seconds in the U.S. will have an accident, a heart or kidney transplant, a major surgery, cancer treatments, or suffer from an injury and will need blood.
- An automobile accident victim may use 50 units of red blood cells.
- An organ transplant recipient may use 60 units of red blood cells, 6 units of platelets and 50 units of plasma.
- A person with Cooley's Anemia/Thalassemia requires a lifetime of blood transfusions.
- A cancer patient may use 8 units of platelets per week.
- A bone marrow transplant recipient may use 20 units of red blood cells and 120 units of platelets.
- A person undergoing heart surgery may use 6 units of red cells and 6 units of platelets.
- 95% of the community will need to receive a blood product in their lifetime, but only 5% of the population actually donates blood?(2-4% in the San Francisco Bay Area).

### Images of America: San Diego's Little Italy

Italians began arriving in San Diego in the late 1800s and early 1900s, many coming from San Francisco after the 1906 earthquake. They gathered together north of the city's downtown in an area that became known as "Little Italy." Images of America: San Diego's Little Italy records the life of this Italian-American neighborhood though the use of pictures and a brief narrative.



Chapter One, entitled "Getting Settled: The Italian Colony Takes Shape" focuses on immigration and assimilation. There are photographs of immigrants on ships arriving to the city, passports, citizenship papers, marriage certificates, and more. These pictures capture these Italian Americans in the early stages of their settlement in America. One picture that typifies the era shows Tony Balistreri and other immigrants aboard the Andrea Dora in 1955. It is full of smiling faces on a sunny day and illustrates the optimism of the new immigrants. Another picture is of three generations of the Carneglia and Marline families in 1917 as they gather on San Diego's waterfront. Strolling the waterfront was a favorite pastime for the Italian-American families and friends.

Chapter Two focuses on Our Lady of Rosary Church, the home of ICF Branch 230, which is located in the heart of San Diego's Little Italy. The church, founded in 1925, is a central part of Italian-American life in the neighborhood, a center for spiritual, cultural, and social life. Many photographs in this section illustrate the beautiful mural that adorns this traditional church while others show the many societies that were

formed at the parish by the new immigrants. There are also photographs of the famous and decorative processions that took place within the parish community.

Chapter Three is concentrated on the importance of family in San Diego. It is full of wonderful pictures of fathers and sons, mothers and daughters, and entire families spanning several generations. Several pictures of the Ghio family illustrate the importance of the family meal. There is a picture of a Ghio dinner table during the holidays filled with family and one of a family picnic table at Balboa Park.

Chapter Four focuses on fishing, a mainstay of the Italian-American community in

San Diego. Fishing was the foundation of the community's economy from its inception until around the 1940s. Many Italian-Americans fished for sardines and tuna, canned them, sold them, and cooked them in their restaurants. This chapter includes many pictures of Italian-American fishermen and cannery workers. It also shows several ships, the Conte Bianco, the Mary Barbara, and the

Venetian, the first two built by the National Steel and Ship Building Company. Other pictures show family-owned ships, such as the St. George, owned by the Balistreri family.

Chapter Five is about the pastimes and social structures of San Diego's Little Italy. It pictures schools, local businesses, and parks that were central to the lives of Italian-Americans. Washington School was an important part of many Italian-American lives as it taught the young children English and other subjects important to success in the United States. Many photographs feature Italian-Americans who proudly served in the United States Armed Forces while other show pictures around family life. One photograph was taken of the first parish picnic at Our Lady of the Rosary in 1927. It is a special panoramic that illustrates the unity and closeness of the San Diego Italian-American community.

Whether you are from San Diego or some other part of the United States, this slim volume will offer you insight into life as an Italian-American, illustrating the importance especially of family and church in community life. It will also be an inspiration to many seeking lessons from an earlier time in our history.

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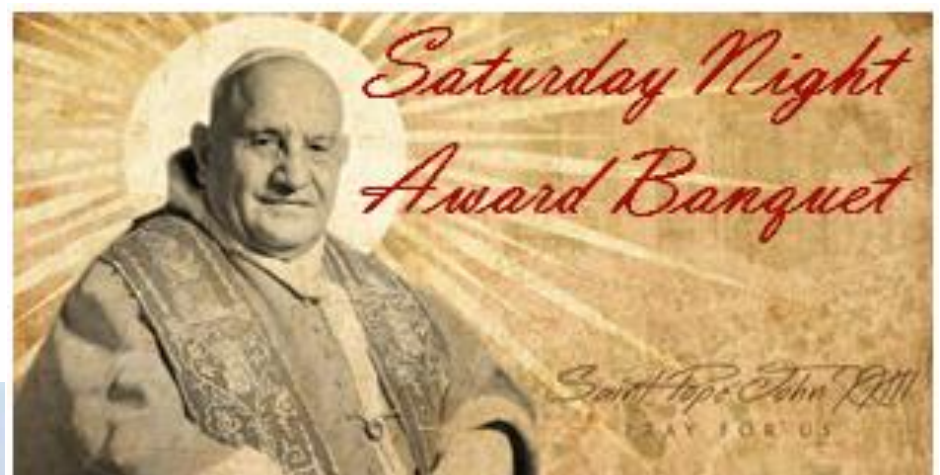

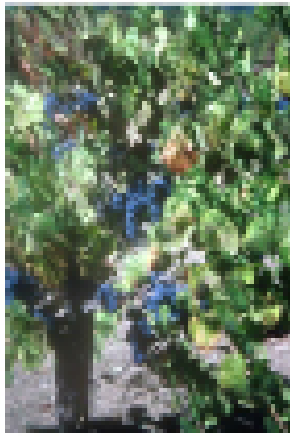

The story of St. Catherine of Siena parish began in 1853, when Dominican fathers began taking the ferry to Martinez from Benicia, then the state capital. They celebrated Mass in Brown’s store, one of the first buildings constructed in Martinez. Soon the congregation built an adobe church, then a small wooden building that blew over a few years later in a gale. In 1868, a steepled wood frame church went up on St. Catherine’s current site at Estudillo and Mellus streets.

The 1868 building was replaced in 1940 by the current stucco church with a turreted bell tower that still stands. The existing 1890 bell and some stained-glass windows were transplanted from the 19th century building. Some of the stained-glass windows bear the names of early Italian families who helped build the church.

St. Catherine of Siena cemetery, dating back to the early 1860’s, is perched on a steep hillside off Carquinez Scenic Drive overlooking the Carquinez Strait. There is a chain-link fence that separates the rear of the property from Rankin Park. Many of the early Italian fishers and their families are buried here. A few years ago the cemetery received an



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upgraded entrance path thanks to an Eagle Scout project by our current ICF Branch 13 Orator, Paul Pio Cook.

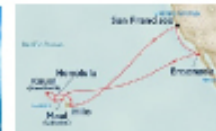

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


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
