



# Charter Trips to Italy -- Leaving on a Jet Plane!!

In 1964, the San Francisco and Los Angeles Districts of the Italian Catholic Federation sponsored a jubilee pilgrimage to Italy for interested members. This trip stopped in Paris and then went on to visit Assisi, Monte Cassini, Milano, the Lake Country, Turin, Genoa and the town of Chiavari (some 30 kilometers south of Genoa) Why Chiavari? The co-founder of the ICF, Luigi Providenza was a native of Chiavari. On this trip, he and his wife Augusta celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary. Therefore, they wanted the renewal of their marriage vows to take place in the church in Chiavari which Luigi had attended as a boy.

This particular pilgrimage left San Francisco on April 1, 1964 and lasted for 30 days. The cost of the trip was \$1290 and included meals, first-class accommodations, tipping, baggage handling and tour escorts.

On Wednesday, May 21, 1964, the group had a general audience with Pope Paul VI.

The trip was open to ICF members only.


John Figone Travel made the arrangements and Past Grand President Mario Cugia was the tour chairman. The Rev. Robert Brennan accompanied the group as the spiritual director.

This pilgrimage proved to be so successful that the ICF started yearly trips to Italy beginning in 1965. To participate on this trip and subsequent ones, one had to be a member of the Federation. This is why, in those years, membership in the ICF increased at a great rate.

The first trip, from San Francisco (June 7 to July 4, 1965) cost \$388 total. No wonder so many people signed up! In 1966, 4 ICF flights made the trip to Italy at a cost of \$435 per person. In 1967, flights were added from Los Angeles. Many people took advantage of this travel opportunity. Many who joined the ICF for the trips later became hard-working and devoted ICF members.

The trips continued until 1977, when new travel restrictions for charters and other travel regulations went into effect. The ICF trips were then discontinued.

Many people who remember the trips speak of them with great enthusiasm.

# New Procedure Regarding the Bollettino

## **ICF** Office

In our continued efforts to streamline operations and promote cost cutting measures, we will begin a new procedure regarding the Bollettino with the August/September (Convention) Issue.

Members who have not paid their dues for 6 months or more, will not be sent the Bollettino starting with the Convention Issue and going forward until such time as the dues are paid. Once the dues are paid, a member will begin receiving the Bollettino again. Members will remain on their Branch rosters, unless a cancellation notice is sent in by the Branch. Members are removed by the database system when they have not paid dues for 15 months. For Branches that order mailing labels, you should also be aware that labels will not be generated for members who are set not to get

#### the paper.

The Branch Financial Secretaries are sent delinquency reports starting with the quarter ending June 30. It is a report which lists only the members who have not paid their dues, in order to make it easier to follow up with these members. Please use this change as an incentive to make contact with these members and encourage them to remain and remit their dues. Reaching out to members personally, can often make a difference.

This will help to reduce postage and printing costs and eliminate mailings to members that may have chosen not to renew their memberships.

# The Importance of our Cultural Heritage

Not everyone feels a connection with their cultural heritage, but many people do. What is it about cultural heritage that draws these people to it? Some may think traditions are archaic and that they are unnecessary during these modern times. Perhaps for some, they aren't; but for others, exploring cultural heritage offers a variety of benefits.

Culture can give people a connection to certain social values, beliefs, religions and customs. It allows them to identify with others of similar mindsets and backgrounds. Cultural heritage can provide an automatic sense of unity and belonging within a group and allows us to better understand previous generations and the history of where we come from. Understanding our cultural heritage can give

a sense of personal identity. Another benefit that comes from preserving cultural heritage as a whole is the communal support. Those that identify strongly with a certain heritage are often more likely to help out others in that same community. Cultural heritage is made up of many things large and small. We can see it in the buildings, townscapes, and even in archaeological remains. Culture can be perceived through natural sources as well: the agriculture and landscapes associated with it. July is another great month for picnics and BBQ's, family reunions and District picnics. Last month I shared my Korean Chicken BBQ. This month we will go for the beef. A great cut of beef to BBQ is the tri-tip. Before it became the popular BBQ meat my firefighting brother informed my mom that it was great. So on his word she bought one and then roasted it in the oven like she did cross rib roasts...was not a pretty sight and definitely not very edible. I remember her calling me and sharing the disaster with me. So about the time it was becoming a little more popular mom and I were grocery shopping at a grocery store in Pleasanton, CA. The butchers there were always very friendly and loved to share info with the customers. Tri-tip was on sale, back when it was a really good deal. The butcher called our attention to the sale and mom informed him what she thought about tri-tip. He sweet talked her and told her if she followed his simple instructions she would be a convert to the tri-tip. Grudgingly she agreed to try one more time.

#### **BBQ Tri-Tip**

Marinade the tri-tip overnight in "Good Seasons" Italian Salad Dressing. We use the dry packets and make it ourselves. If you have their bottle it has lines for your measurements otherwise get out those measuring cups. My twist on the dressing is instead of red wine vinegar only I use  $\frac{1}{2}$  red wine vinegar and  $\frac{1}{2}$  balsamic vinegar and for the oil I use  $\frac{1}{2}$  vegetable oil and  $\frac{1}{2}$  olive oil. Even for salad this is a tastier version of the dressing...our Branch actually uses it on our salad for our

#### champagne bingos.

In a Ziploc I place the trimmed tri-tip and pour the marinade in (about  $\frac{1}{2}$  the bottle), push out as much air as possible and refrigerate overnight (I have been known to marinade for an additional day). I have even frozen it at this point ready to go for a future meal.

Take tri-tip out of refrigerator 2 hours before cooking so that it comes to room temperature. Taking the meat from refrigerator and cooking immediately shocks the meat and causes it to be tougher.

BBQ approximately 18 minutes on each side. Remove from BBQ and let sit for 10-15 minutes. By letting it rest all the juices won't run out of the meat when you cut it.

My dad was not a cook. The best he could do was boil water for Top Ramen. He loved the fact that this tri-tip always came out perfect and was now the second dish he could cook. To give Dad credit he could BBQ other things but he took great pride on his tri-tip expertise.

It was such a big hit that when it is on sale several get purchased and put in the freezer, ready to go at a moments notice.

Now recently my brother and I discovered the best way to have this left over.

Start with wonderful French bread (if you are from the SF Bay Area that would be sour dough). Slice the tri-tip very thin. I was lazy and used a dry mix to make Aux Jus. Make it according to directions. When ready take it off the stove and add the tri-tip to it to warm it up, then pile into your bun and dip your sandwich in the juice as you go. You can caramelize onions to go on this and even add cheese if you like. A little horseradish on the bun is all you need to make this a delicious and messy meal!




