On Thursday, September 1, the Fresno District will welcome us at their "Night at the Races." Bet on the ponies and watch them race in a simulated experience. Trying to maintain a steady number of members in an ICF branch can be a bit of a challenge; increasing that number can be even more so. Following this, membership of some branches seem to waffle about with the same number for decades, while others say that their membership level sort of trickles away as the years go by. Still, there is a general impression that somehow Branch 36 is fairly successful at recruitment and doesn't have a particularly hard time filling its ranks.

Just the same, Branch 36 doesn't really do much different from any other branch. One

might say that perhaps luck plays a part because of its location. Well, having a large Italian community in its midst can't hurt but having relatives-of-relatives or friends-offriends who are members can only go so far. Notification of Intention to Run for Central Council at the 2016 Convention

Application Process

1. Applications are available from the I.C.F. Office.

2. Candidates' completed applications must be received by the I.C.F. Office by August 1 in order to be eligible to run for Central Council.

3. A candidate who is not currently a Central Council Member must be a branch delegate to the Convention.

Other Pre-Convention Deadlines

1. If you wish to place a full-page ad in the convention souvenir book; the ad contract, your photo and a message must be sent to the I.C.F. Office by July 1.

2. Candidate entries to be included in the Bollettino, must be emailed to both the I.C.F. Office and the Bollettino Editor by August 1. Email admin@icf.org and icfeditor@gmail. com. Submissions should include a photo and an entry that does not exceed 300 words.

Campaign Rules

1. Only one poster (maximum size 24 X 36) may be displayed in the area designated by the Convention Director.

2. Campaign flyers and non-consumable campaign favors may only be given out on Friday evening during "Meet the Candidates." Food and beverage items may not be distributed during "Meet the Candidates."

3. As voted upon at the February 2016 Central Council Meeting, there will be no candidate hospitality rooms. This decision was made in order to follow the hotel's quiet time policy. If a district hosts a hospitality room at any time during the convention weekend, there shall be no candidate posters, flyers or other campaign paraphernalia available in the hospitality room.

4. No campaigning may take place during convention sessions, activities or in the delegate registration area.

5. No campaign literature should be posted in the public areas or on the ICF Facebook page.

6. Registration workers should not wear campaign items.

7. Candidates should notify campaign helpers of these rules.

8. Campaign speeches will be held during the Saturday session and shall not exceed 2 minutes

Other Information

1. Candidates for Central Council will be announced in descending order in even years and ascending order in odd years.

2. 10 candidates will be elected to the Central Council, unless an unforeseen event takes place that will reduce the election to 9 Central Council Members.

3. Candidates should wear proper business attire at all functions; no campaign T-shirts, pins. etc.

ICF HISTORY HIGHLIGH

Father Floyd Lotito, OFM - The Tenderloin Priest

 ${f W}$ e continue this month with the ICF Awards Program. In 1999, The Italian Catholic Federation instituted the Mother Teresa Award. This award is given to a member of a religious order or deacon for exemplary humanitarian work. The first person to be honored with this award was Father Floyd Lotito of the Franciscan Order. The award was presented by then Grand President Nettie Descalso-DelNero at the Sunday morning session of the annual convention.

Father Lotito grew up in Los Angeles and attended the Theological Seminary in Santa Barbara.

He was ordained a priest in 1960. He would later receive a master's degree from Marquette University which would honor him as a distinguished alumnus. In 1961, Father was assigned to St. Mary's Parish in Stockton, CA where he became chaplain to ICF Branch 9. Father served in many other parishes before coming to San Francisco in 1968 where he was appointed Associate Pastor of St. Boniface Church in the Tenderloin District of the city.

In 1981, the Franciscans started the St. Anthony's Foundation in the Tenderloin to feed the homeless, seniors and the disabled. Father found his home here, working among the people of the area, an area of San Francisco that is home to the sick, the poor and a growing immigrant population.

Father Lotito served in many capacities at St. Anthony's, eventually becoming the Director of the Dining Room. The Dining Room serves about 2,700 meals a day. Volunteers from



civic, social and charitable organizations are encouraged to help serve the meals.

Father Lotito's efforts to combat poverty and homelessness received local, national and international recognition. He addressed numerous audiences on the subject, developed a number of charity and volunteer organizations and served as a spiritual advisor to many community groups. In 2000, Father was invited to bless AT&T Baseball Park at its opening. In 2003, Father was recognized as the "San Franciscan of the Year'

In his later years, Father struggled with Parkinson's disease. He died on July 14, 2009 at the age of 74. The funeral service for him was held at St. Boniface Church in San Francisco

Convention - 2015

At this Convention, The Mother Teresa Award was presented to Father Dave Heney of Thousand Oaks, CA. by Past Grand President Bob Basuino. Father has written a number of books on modern moral issues and continues to write on various religious subjects. In his ten years as pastor of St. Paschal in Thousand Oaks, he guided the parish to be an instrument of good in the community by developing outreach programs. Presently, Father works with the Archdiocese of Los Angeles in developing two projects: establish guidelines and procedures in continuation of his "Lenten University Series" and write a procedures manual for new priests and pastors.

The Mother Teresa Award was certainly well deserved by the two priests featured in this article.

IRS AND STATE OF CALIFORNIA FRANCHISE TAX BOARD

As you are aware, the IRS and Franchise Tax Board for the State of California require annual tax returns to be filed by our Districts and Branches.

It is important to remember that all Districts and Branches now have two numbers - a Federal Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the IRS and a State Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the State

The IRS limit for the tax year ending 2015 is the following:

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file IRS Form 990 EZ or 990.

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file IRS Form 990-N which is an e-Postcard.

The State limit for the tax year ending 2015 is the following:

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file State Form 199.

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file State Form 199-N which is an e-Postcard. ***THIS IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND MUST BE STRICTLY FOL-LOWED***

Both Forms must be filed no later than May 15, 2016. The IRS and State strictly adhere to this date, so please take this process seriously.

Any District or Branch who does not file for 3 consecutive years will lose its tax exempt status with the IRS and the State. If you lose your tax exempt status you will have to file paperwork and pay a fine in order to regain your tax exempt status.

Included in the Financial Secretaries' packet are materials that the District and Branch Financial Secretaries will need to help them with this process. District and Branch Presidents - please work with your Financial Secretary to go over the information when it is received and see that the appropriate forms are filed by the due date.

Please make sure all District or Branch finances are in order and that Bank Statements are reconciled through December 31, 2015. Remember that the Gross Receipts are total amounts received without subtracting any costs or expenses. These amounts include, but are not limited to, Membership and Hospitalization Dues, Dinners, Fundraisers, Raffle Tickets, Income from Convention Raffle Tickets and Calendar Sales, Interest from all Bank Accounts, Monetary Donations, etc.

"They'll Take Too Much Blood and I'll Feel Weak."

If you weigh at least 110 lbs, you may safely donate blood. You have about two pints of blood for every 25 pounds of body weight, and your body makes new blood constantly. After giving blood most people can resume their normal activities.

"My Blood Type Is So Common, You Probably Don't Need It."

Not true. Some blood types are more common than others, but the rarest type of blood is the type that is not available when needed. Since whole blood and blood components must be transfused within a few weeks, we rely on regular donations of all blood types throughout the year.

"Other People Must Be Giving Enough Blood."

We need to collect about 450 pints of blood per day to meet the daily demand and the demand is rising! But, less than 5 percent of those who are eligible give blood. Consequently, the lives of many depend on the generosity of these few.

"I Give My Blood Voluntarily, But The Blood Center Turns Around And Sells It."

BCP and all other blood banks are nonprofit organizations. The blood center's goal is to keep costs as low as possible while maintaining a high quality blood supply. BCP charges a processing fee to recover the costs incurred in collecting, processing, testing and distributing the blood. This processing fee does not include hospital charges for cross matching, transfusion administration, etc.

Myths Dispelled About Donating Blood

Many people have common fears and misconceptions about donating blood and their ability to do so. Here are some answers to these common excuses.

"I Might Catch A Disease."

A new, sterile needle is used for each donor and then immediately disposed of properly. It is not possible to catch AIDS or any infectious diseases by donating blood.

"It Might Hurt When They Draw The Blood."

You might feel a slight pinch when the needle

is inserted. But someone who has to have emergency surgery with no blood supply will surely feel way more pain!

"I'm On Medication."

Many medications, including allergy medicines, vitamins, aspirins, and blood pressure pills, do not affect your eligibility as a blood donor. Be sure to tell the medical interviewer what medications you are taking or have recently taken.

"I'm Anemic."

A trained technician will test a drop of your blood before you donate. If you are anemic you will not be permitted to donate that day. However, anemia is not usually a permanent condition. Just because you have been deferred or told that you were anemic does not necessarily mean that you cannot

If You Eat, You Never Die is the winner of The Chicago Tribune Best Books of 2008 and a 2008 Midland Authors Finalist Prize.

I sifted the flour, baking powder and cocoa first. Combine all the ingredients except eggs, molasses, vanilla and water in a large bowl. Mix well, make a well and add the eggs, molasses, vanilla and water. Work in and blend well.

Do not grease cookie sheets, sprinkle with flour.

Sprinkle flour on board or cookie sheet and roll out about one fifth of the dough the width of a walnut and the length of the cookie sheet. Cut cookie dough diagonally about every inch.

Place upright on floured (I used parchment) cookie sheet.

Bake 8 minutes at 350 degrees or until done (I baked 12-15 minutes). The cookie will be like a dense cake not hard like biscotti.

Cool and frost with icing made with powdered sugar, milk and flavoring. Jo uses chocolate. I used lemon juice instead of milk with powdered sugar; also tried with lemon juice instead of milk and unsweetened cocoa powder

with the powdered sugar.

These cookies are delicious, makes the house smell wonderful and are full of intense flavor ... The cookie itself is not really sweet, but the frosting gives a hint of sweetness. I am not a fan of sweets (although I love to bake) but I am having a hard time keeping my hand out of the cookie jar. I brought them to my Branch's St. Joseph's Table in March, and they were a big hit. I think I am going to try it with oranges instead of lemons and for a friend that can't have nuts will see what happens without the almonds. Will let you know how that goes.

Jo states that originally the recipe called for vincoot, made when they crushed the grapes for wine. She substituted this with molasses.

Convention Bylaw Submission Procedure David Botta Parlimentarian

Now comes the time of year that we must solicit proposals and/or amendments to the Branch Bylaws. The following is a brief review of the procedure followed in the ICF to accomplish this process and bring the proposals and/or amendments to the floor of the Annual Convention of the Italian Catholic Federation.

All branches are urged to consider, discuss and formulate a proposal to change, modify or abolish a bylaw as it pertains to all the Branches of the ICF. According to the Branch Bylaw Chapter XVII Art. 3 G proposals and/ or amendments to the bylaws shall be submitted in writing (signed by the Branch President and Recording Secretary) to the Central Council Office not later than April 30, 2016. Branch bylaw change proposals may also come from the Central Council through the Bylaws Committee.

Such submitted proposals and/or amendments are forwarded to the Central Council Bylaws Committee for review, as to form and content. If a question exists relating to the submitted proposal, the Chairman of the Bylaws Committee will contact the submitting Branch for clarification and if necessary revisions to make the proposal acceptable.

It is helpful to present the original bylaw followed by a copy of the modified or changed bylaw with the changes in bold type. The insertions should be in italics and the deletions either in strike out text or underlined. The proposal must be accompanied by a wellreasoned rationale for the proposed change.

The Central Council through the Bylaws Committee is authorized to eliminate proposals: (1) that are unconstitutional, discriminatory (except as to the age for benefits) or infringing on the fundamental principles of the Federation, (2) proposals defeated at the immediate previous Annual Convention cannot be presented at the immediate next Convention, except if the Central Council approves the proposal for representation.

Once the proposal is found to be constitutional and acceptable in wording and content, the Bylaws Committee will present the proposals to the Central Council at the June meeting for their information. At this point the Bylaws Committee will "certify" the proposals, and announce they will be presented to the delegates at the next Annual Convention. The order of discussions of proposals at the Annual Convention are prepared in advance by the Parliamentarian and approved by the Central Council.

The proposals to be presented at the Annual Convention will be sent to the Branches in advance of the Convention for their discussion and consideration. At the Convention the proposals will be presented to the delegates for their vote. Matters presented by the Central Council will have precedence in the order of discussion.

Once passed by a majority vote of the delegates at the Annual Convention the adopted bylaw change is immediately effective.
