# Pope Saint John XXIII Award Winner Bradley James

Bradley James was born in Wisconsin during the Second Vatican Council. At 6 years of age he began his education with the School Sisters of Notre Dame. His parents recognized his early musical abilities and at 12, they arranged for him to begin music instructions with Constance Koehne, Wagner's granddaughter. At 17 he auditioned and won a scholarship from Robert Joffery to study with the Joffrey ballet in New York City, which began his career as a singer and dancer.

In the mid-80s while modeling and dancing in Los Angeles he began to anthroposophy with such luminaries as Manly P. Hall, Carroll Wrighter, Willi Sucher and Stephan Hoeller. In 1987, in Los Angeles on his way

to a movie with a priest friend from New York he met with the Nobel laureate Mother Teresa. She invited him to join a small group of people to open a house in Los Angeles for her sisters, the Missionaries of Charity. Soon after that meeting in 1987 he met the woman who would become Mother's successor, Sister Nirmala Joshi.

At the first meeting in the Los Angeles airport Sister Nirmala asked Bradley to write music to Mother Teresa's words and prayers. He sent a short note with Nirmala to Mother back to Kolkata and within a few weeks received the first of more than 15 letters giving him permission and encouragement to write music to her words.

After Mother Teresa, Bradley considers a major influence in his personal and spiritual

development the late sister Sylvia who at the time of her death a year before Mother Teresa was being considered Mother Teresa's successor.

"He proved to be a fine director [of the 11 am mass choir], singer, and accompanist, but, beyond that, we were all enthralled with the stories he would tell about his experiences with Mother Teresa and the Missionaries of Charity," said John Guerin, president of Branch 217. "Although he was only our director for a short time, we all felt that hearing these stories had brought us closer to God."

From 1990 until 2002 while continuing to volunteer with the missionaries of Charity, Bradley was co-owner of the hugely successful restaurant in Palm Desert California,

He served for twenty years on the governing board of Behavioral Health Center, Psychiatric Hospital, in Alhambra; and for 2 ½ years was the Development Director for St. John's Seminary in Camarillo.

Since 2001 Fr. Dave has been the local Chaplain for LEGATUS, a national Catholic business leaders association.

“What Fr. Dave has accomplished is rare and remarkable,” said John Allen, associate editor at the Boston Globe. “There is an enormous hunger out there among Catholic adults for information that’s both intelligent and faithful, serious but not dull, and that’s what Fr. In 2007, Fr. Dave joined the Order of the Holy Sepulcher, an international association that supports Catholic Charities, Schools, and Hospitals in the Holy Land.

Every June he hosts an exciting 12-day pilgrimage to the Holy Land where the group visits and investigates the places most people only read about in the scriptures.

In 2014, he finished his 12 year term as the pastor of his home parish where he grew up, at St. Paschal Baylon Church in Thousand Oaks, CA.

Father Dave works with the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. He has two objectives from Archbishop Gomez:

1. Establish guidelines and procedures for the continuation of the Lenten “University Series,” to be implemented in other areas or parishes in the diocese.

2. Write a procedures manual for new priests, particularly new pastors, for training in parish operations. Currently, the new pastor must rely on notes from a previous pastor, parish council and/or parish staff. This would be a comprehensive process, but could be tailored for individual parish culture.

“I am impressed with his amazing energy and creativity in creating and sustaining the University Education series,” said Rabbi Michael Lotker of Camarillo, California. “He and I have dialogued both personally, on community TV and in the University Series. His outreach to the Jewish community and his spirit of Ecumenical friendship is an inspiration to all who know him.”

“At a time when membership in our branch was dwindling and members were growing older, they led a campaign to bring friends and relatives into the branch,” said Mary Mazzo, Branch 354, Paso Robles.

When Irma is not busy with ICF functions, she often has her two granddaughters over for meals, homework or chauffeuring to their events while their parents are still working. David, for his part, never seems to slow down either. He is always aware of what is going on around and looking to see where he can help.

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## ITALIAN CATHOLIC FEDERATION HISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

### Past Convention Memorable Events...

David Botta and Carmen Kilcullen  
Past Grand Presidents

The Italian Catholic Federation Convention is an annual event that everyone looks forward to. It is a time for all branches to get together, share ideas, participate in social events and generally reaffirm our commitments to the ideals of the ICF. Conventions have always been fun times and much preparation goes into the planning. This task is the responsibility of the Convention Directors' Committee which meets throughout the year to discuss and finalize the convention agenda. Since this is convention time, we would like to highlight some of the special events that have occurred in past conventions.

- The first official convention was held in San Francisco in 1927. At this convention, the structure of the Central Council was codified – 12 elected and 12 life members.
- At the 1935 convention in Santa Barbara, the payment of a “per capita” by branches to the Central Council was approved.
- The 1937 convention in Los Angeles saw entertainment by renowned tenor John McCormack and actor Leo Carrillo.
- At the 1941 convention held in Stockton, the Seminary Fund was established. The first Seminary Burse of \$500 was then presented to Archbishop John Mitty of San Francisco.
- During World War II, the conventions were postponed and restarted in 1946. The ICF declared St. Frances Xavier Cabrini as its patron saint following her canonization in June of that year.
- At the 1949 convention in San Francisco, the noted preacher Father Riccardo Lombardi addressed the gathering. At one of his other public engagements, he drew 20,000 people.

- The 1956 convention in Merced saw the beginning of the workshops. Topics included lay apostolate, leadership and expansion. A procession in the downtown area honored Eucharistic Day.

- At the 40<sup>th</sup> annual convention in San Francisco, in 1970, the first Pope St. John XXIII Award was presented to Dr. Joseph Middleton by the Grand President, William Descalso (1969-1972).

- In 1972, the first convention in Chicago took place. Cardinal Cody, 12 Bishops and 13 priests concelebrated the Mass.

- The celebration of the 50<sup>th</sup> year of the ICF took place at the convention in San Francisco in 1974.

- At the 1979 convention in Los Angeles, Grand President Robert Acquistapace (1978-1991) presented the Pope St. John XXIII Award to famed Hollywood actor Joseph Campanella. Also, at this convention, the first Grand President's Award was presented to Laura Bozzini of San Francisco.

- At the 1981 convention in Las Vegas, David Botta was elected Grand President (1981-1984). This year, 2015, he will celebrate 50 years as a Central Council member, the longest tenure of any CC member. Congratulations!!!

- In 1982, Cooley's Anemia was adopted as the official ICF charity, and at that year's convention, \$50,000 was donated to the program at Cedars-Sinai Hospital in Los Angeles. The program was later moved to Children's Hospital in Oakland where we continue our donations to this day.

## Registration Assistance Program - History & Success

In early 2012, Board members of Italian Catholic Federation Br. 291 were looking for a way to enhance our membership. St. Patrick's Parish in Arroyo Grande is fortunate to have a Catholic school associated with it. Board members were looking for a way to encourage young Catholic school families to become involved with our organization.

Our Board and membership realize that the cost of a Catholic education can be burdensome for families. What some of our members did not know is that families are required to pay an annual per child registration fee to hold the spot for the upcoming academic year. The registration fee fluctuates from \$150-\$250 per child per year. Financial aid is available but can only be used for tuition; it cannot be used towards the registration fee. After lengthy Board discussions, a draft of the Registration Assistance Program went before our general membership for approval and implementation. Our program succeeded in encouraging young school families to become involved with our ICF

Branch. For those branches who have a Catholic school associated with its parish, registration assistance is a win-win program for increasing branch membership and supporting parochial Catholic education. Your branch could institute such a program.

Once the Registration Assistance Program concept was accepted by our general membership we then shared our program with the school principal. Including the school principal from the very beginning is important to the program's success. We then introduced our program to the St. Patrick School parents. The program is set up so that Br. 291 families, who have children attending Catholic school, are eligible for registration assistance if they meet the following criteria:

- \* Maintain active membership within Br. 291
- \* Their children must be enrolled in a parochial Catholic school which requires an academic year pre-registration fee
- \* Families must participate in Branch fundraising activities and/or attend five (5) Branch meetings per year. (Branch fundraising activities in the fall are solely dedicated to the Registration Assistance

Program).

The Board calculates the amount of funds raised and then they determine how much is to be allocated based on the number of eligible children. The disbursed funds are sent to the schools involved with the names of the children of the participating families. The Board keeps an annual record of each family assuring criteria are met. The guidelines for this program are now part of our Branch "Standing Rules and Procedures."

This program has been very successful. Our family memberships have increased. The young members love working our fundraisers and those who support our fundraisers love the children. Their parents work hard and enjoy being members of a family organization. Parents are taking on leadership roles within the branch; learning from the best of the best—our long-time members. Our Registration Assistance Program is now fully implemented, benefiting our families and supporting our goal of encouraging Catholic education and Catholic values within our community. St. John XXIII Award. His award was presented by Grand President, Richard Valli (1987-1990). Danny was very gracious and did a whole comedy routine at the banquet.

- The 1994 convention was presided over by the first woman grand president of the ICF, Carmen (Solari) Kilcullen (1993-1995), who described it as a very special and memorable occasion.

Three more women were subsequently elected Grand Presidents: Nettie Descalso-Del Nero (1997-1999), Madeleine Vinci (2000-2002-deceased) and Jane Dianda (2011-2013).

- At the 1996 convention in Burlingame, CA, the first Family of the Year Award was presented to the Garfagnoli Family of Healdsburg.

- The 75<sup>th</sup> ICF anniversary was

celebrated at the 1999 convention, held in San Francisco. This convention featured an ICF Heritage Museum, displaying artifacts and photographs on the rich history of the organization. The museum also exhibited "La Storia Segreta" documenting the abuses against Italian-Americans during WWII. It was most informative and well-received. Also, the first Mother Teresa Award was presented to Father Floyd Lotito of San Francisco.

- A very successful 2007 convention was held in Scottsdale, AZ with the Arizona branches helping the Convention Directors' Committee.

- At the 2008 convention in Orange County, the first Young Adult Leadership Award was given to Richard Interrante and Michelle Rubi. (The actual first winner was Anne Interrante in 2004, but her award was given at a district installation).

- At the 2012 convention in Foster City, CA, delegates approved dual

membership in the ICF for those wishing to belong to two branches. Also, at the 2012 convention, the first ICF blood drive was held which proved to be very successful.

- The ICF Strategic Plan was presented to the delegates at the 2014 convention in Oakland. There will be follow-up discussions at this year's Las Vegas convention.

## BOOK REVIEW

### Beyond the Mafia: Italian Americans and the Development of Las Vegas by Alan Balboni

University of Nevada Press,  
2006 ed., 192 pp.

Since this year's ICF convention is in Las Vegas, I thought it would be interesting to review a book about Italian Americans in Las Vegas.

In *Beyond the Mafia: Italian Americans and the Development of Las Vegas*, Alan Balboni chronicles the history of Italian Americans in Las Vegas; however, rather than focus on the Mafia, Balboni focuses on ordinary Italians who made contributions to the city's economic and civic growth. Using over 100 hundred interviews, public records, and the documents of Italian American organizations, Balboni documents how Italian Americans found Las Vegas, and the West, to be full of opportunities for advancement and progress.

The book is divided into five chronologically arranged chapters: "The Early Years: from Laborers to Successful Entrepreneurs," "The Rapid Growth Years: Italian Americans Come to Las Vegas," "The Corporate Years: Italian Americans Prosper," "Italian American Organizations: Preserving Ethnic Heritage in a Time of Assimilation", and "Conclusion: The Immigrant Upraised." In the most recent paperback edition of the book, the author includes an afterward



which brings the story of Italian Americans in Las Vegas up to the present.

In each chapter, Balboni focuses largely on those Italian American men (but only a few women) who contributed to the city's business and economic growth with some focus on social and civic life. Of course, most people know that Italian Americans were prominent headliners in the casinos and theaters (among them Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Vic Damone, Jimmy Durante, and Tony Bennett). However, Italian Americans were also heavily involved in the hotel and restaurant businesses. In fact, after World War II, a majority of dining establishments were owned and operated by Italian Americans. Other Italian Americans became architects, waste management operators, construction workers, real estate developers, and politicians. All contributed to the city's economic progress, and the city provided them with opportunities to flourish as businessmen and professionals. Through his research and numerous interviews, the author explains that "the city provided unique opportunities to Italian Americans willing to invest energy and expertise."

It is one intent of Balboni's book to illustrate that the influence of Italian Americans in Las Vegas goes beyond the Mafia's involvement in organized crime and gambling. He does not deny the influence of "The Boys," as he calls them, on the city rather he shifts the reader's focus to other contributors to the city's development. In doing this, he is able to move us beyond the stereotypes of Italian Americans often promulgated in the mass media. If his book is a bit one sided, it is in reaction and response to the one-sided images of Italian Americans in Las Vegas that are presented through the media.

Thoroughly researched, *Beyond the Mafia: Italian Americans and the Development of Las Vegas* provides an important contribution to our understanding of this important ethnic group to one of the country's fastest growing cities.

Color the sign:



coarsely (I find dice-chopping makes them too watery and they don't sauté as well)

1 pound fresh mushrooms, sliced

3-4 heads garlic

2 bunches parsley

fresh basil and rosemary

Italian Seasoning, to taste-I use about 2 closed handfuls

1/3 to 1/2 bottle red wine

Put tomato sauce and crushed tomatoes in a large pot.

In a little butter and olive oil (if needed-I fry without butter or oil) fry hamburger well, drain and add to tomato sauce.

Froth some butter with a little olive oil in pan and sauté onions until they are nicely caramelized, do the same with all the other vegetables and fresh spices and don't forget the crushed garlic. As you finish sautéing the veggies put in the pot with tomato sauce. "Nonie" always told me to make the perfect gravy you must froth the butter before you sauté the vegetables. The caramelizing of the veggies is what gives the sauce its great flavor.

This makes a very thick meaty gravy. Use consommé to thin sauce for desired consistency.

Salt, pepper and Italian seasoning to taste.

Add wine and simmer low to blend flavors for several hours. Stir occasionally to make sure it does not stick to the bottom of the pot.

Makes about 5-6 gallons.

Freezes beautifully.

Pasta sauce/gravy is one of the staples in an Italian kitchen. Many of us have our favorite recipe hopefully handed down from our mom's and or nonna's. The challenge was getting the recipe written down, as we tend to wing it when we have that pot on the stove.

The recipe I want to share with you was the one my branch used for our champagne bingos and when my dear friend Kathy Trevizo and I took over the challenge of making pasta sauce for 150 to 200 people, we were like deer in the headlights.

This recipe originated in the kitchen of Vittoria Gregori, our branch sauce maker from many years ago. Of course it was not written down, so one day her son Ario Gregori (the Late Past Grand Secretary of the CC) sat down and tried to follow what his mom was doing and estimated some of the quantities. Since then Kathy and I

took the recipe and put our spin on it. The measurements in the recipe can be raised or lowered depending on your individual likes and dislikes, but no matter how we put it together it always comes out delicious.

### Spaghetti Sauce for 100 People

12-15 pounds hamburger (2-3 big packages from Costco)

5 industrial size (Smart and Final) tomato sauce

1 industrial size (Smart and Final) crushed tomatoes

1-2 large beef consommé broth (can also use chicken)

1/2 to 3/4 pound butter

2 1/2 to 3 pounds carrots, chopped coarsely

2 heads of celery, chopped coarsely

5-6 pounds onion, diced or chopped

Gifts of Love –Pat Mages

- Successful in trying to expand judging areas this past year.
- Hope to have one more meeting before convention. Right now there are about 15 applications to look over. Still getting a lot of scholarships about 20 in this batch.
- 67k currently in account.
- Jan to May 2015 \$9,336 income, expenses \$1,950. Getting more applications from Disabled Vets and ICF areas and more from other organizations.

- Lisa Crudo spoke on a family that was helped. The medical social worker with office next to Lisa’s had a family with a severe case of bed bugs and they had to get rid of everything. Asked for \$500 for bed for children...Gifts of Love actually gave them \$1,000.

Hospitalization – Nina Malone

- Currently 409 members. From January to May 2015 received in dues \$7,462.50, in claims \$4,315.00. In UBS \$887,564.35, in BofA \$22,348.68. As of December 31, 2014 accumulated gains \$548,299.00
- Minutes from Feb 2009 stated to not let fund go under 400k suggested a 3-4% annual distribution. The 4% CC came up with not a recommendation of the actuary. The actuary felt we should not go under 400k and must keep the fund solvent. The 4% was just dipping into the interest and not touching the principal.
- Committee recommends for 2016 budget we transfer 5.07 % 45k to seminary fund, and 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year scholarship. ... Roselynn Jarrett and George Bacigalupi feels that we should not put in specific funds but to go into General Fund as we have in the past few years to help defray the general fund deficit. Many ideas discussed on how to divide the money. Intent of committee was to keep the two charities solvent.
- Dante Galeazzi amendment 34k to general fund remainder divided between 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year scholarship and seminary seconded by Marco Galeazzi. DEFEATED
- Nina Malone amended on behalf of the committee to increase distribution from Hospitalization for 2016 to 5.07% 45k with no specifications as to specific distributions until finance meets in October. Leonard Zasoski seconded. PASSED
- Claim form out of date unable to get to this year. Should be considered next year.
- Msgr. Cardelli commented want to wake up a crowd talk about money.

Presidents, explaining the vision of a buddy system, with a request to provide their Membership Chairperson’s contact information, to be used in further developing this program. The response as of February was only 6 branches. Followed up with another letter in March; this time addressed to District Presidents and Branch Presidents in smaller areas. Committee made phone calls and sent emails to get as much information as possible. As of today, 45 branches (35%) have responded with an appointment of a Membership Chairperson.

- When the second letter went out, the District Presidents also received a brief questionnaire that could help us assess the strengths and weaknesses of each area and where we might be most needed. Each committee member was assigned to contact various districts and areas in the months of April or May to discuss this questionnaire. Out of 22 districts and areas, 9 responded (41%). Reviewed the results of the survey.
- Anne Interrante-family memberships...questioned branches that had a large number of family memberships and will put together information for a future Bollettino article. Some ideas: child care, youth installation of officers, youth officer program, youth award at Branch or District level.

Public Relations –Vince Piro

Bollettino:

- On time last several months.
- Recipe and cooking column added.
- 120 signed up for getting Bollettino electronically. Richard Interrante working to see if there is a simple solution to make change in data base for this.
- Pros/cons on every other month for Bollettino. Lauren Kilcullen reported on findings. Currently loss of \$22,288.00 with 11 issues. Six issues with same per capita of \$6-profit of \$12,531.55. Six issues with per capita at \$4-loss of \$5,575.45. 12 issues with increase of per capita to \$8 loss of \$4,187.00. Before any committee recommendation regarding above would like to poll members at convention.
- The Bollettino arriving on time, the beginning of the month, for the past three months is a very positive milestone for the paper.
- Vince Piro states that CC has not increased per capita although the cost of printing and mailing have gone up.

- If we adjust the per capita charge the CC decides; if we raise dues it goes to the delegates.
- Some pictures in Bollettino are in color others in B&W. How does a branch get it in color? Michelle Feldman informed us color is on back page...sometimes the center page is color that the printer throws in as a bonus...she does not know about it in advance.
- Leonard Rossi we have to come up with money one-way or the other. Need to look at a dues increase. Michelle Feldman stated if we switched format completely we might be able to lower the cost.

Scholarship – Deborah Rodondi

- April 20<sup>th</sup> judged 1<sup>st</sup> year scholarships.
- Received 369 applications for 1<sup>st</sup> year scholarships.
- In response to task set before us by CC at the February meeting to research what the feasibility of only students with family in ICF getting a scholarship. The committee feels that we should leave the program the way it is. In reviewing the 184 1<sup>st</sup> year scholarships we gave out this year -82 of them had family members in the ICF. 3 students that had family in the ICF did not get a scholarship; unfortunately the minimum GPA is 3.2-these three students had a 2.9 GPA. When reviewing applications students with members have an edge over other applications, but they must meet the requirements. Thanks to the donations in memory of individuals we were able to be sure that all students with family were able to get a scholarship. The committee feels that if we change the rules that only students with family get the scholarships a lot of branches will stop giving scholarships, or will give only when they have family eligible. We feel it will be the decline of the program.
- Teresa Helfand asked about scholarships for grammar school going into High School. To bring under the ICF umbrella we are asking too much of our branches and it would be difficult for us to control and monitor. Best if handled at the branch level. In one District 8 of the 10 branches give scholarships to grammar school students with the help of the school principal.

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# ICF donates over 1.8 million dollars to its National Charity -- Cooley’s Anemia/Thalassemia

The Italian Catholic Federation (ICF) adopted Cooley’s anemia (also called thalassemia) as its national charity in 1983 when David Botta was the ICF Grand President. The funds went to Dr. Hyman at Cedar’s Sinai, Los Angeles, and in 1994, when Dr. Hyman retired, donations went to the Thalassemia Program at Children’s Hospital Research Center Oakland (CHRCO), under the leadership of Dr. Vichinsky. The ICF has donated a total of \$1,864,754 towards Cooley’s Anemia since 1983, with \$835,000 going to CHRCO, which houses one of the six specialty centers for thalassemia in North America. The funds go to the following areas:

Research and the SQUID — Children’s Hospital Oakland conducts cutting-edge research to improve the quality of life for patients, as well as to search for a cure. The ICF has also funded state-of-the-art technology such as the SQUID (also called

a ferritometer) machine that measures iron in the body. Prior to the introduction of the SQUID machine, patients had to undergo an invasive surgical procedure called a liver biopsy to assess excess iron. The SQUID involves a simple scan and is completed in approximately 30 minutes. Children’s Hospital also obtained a specialized MRI machine that enables the measurement of heart iron, when previously there was no way to do so.

Patient Events — These include our Christmas parties, conferences, retreats, camps, and family nights. Such events are a vital part of our comprehensive care program and build on peer relationships and support, improve understanding of treatment and disease, and give patients and families the opportunity to get together and have fun!

Patient Sponsorship — Many patients live in remote areas of California and/or come from around the globe to visit our center. If U.S. patients cannot afford to travel, some ICF funds are used to offset their expenses. Patient sponsorship may also

include helping patients travel to a retreat, camp, or conference.

Patient Medical Expenses — The average cost of care for a thalassemia patient is approximately \$75,000 a year. This covers basic care, including blood transfusions, chelation (iron removal) therapy, doctor visits, and medications. If a patient undergoes hospitalization, then costs can escalate further. No patient is ever turned away from Children’s Hospital Oakland, and patients are cared for regardless of their ability to pay. Dr. Elliott Vichinsky often sees patients for free. ICF funds help pay for basic care costs that patients and families cannot afford.

Education and Outreach — Children’s Hospital Oakland has the only thalassemia outreach program in the United States - thanks to the ICF. We provide in-services to health-care providers, attend and present information at conferences, and distribute information at healthfairs and on college campuses. The goal is to raise awareness and educate the community on thalassemia. In 2012, we published the Thalassemia

Standards of Care for Providers 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition and the Thalassemia Research Update. Our Perspectives newsletter, which often highlights the ICF, is published twice a year. (Please contact Laurice Levine if you would like to be put on our mailing list.)

Special Projects — ICF funds are often reserved for special projects such as our 2006 “Live to Give” video. (Please contact Laurice Levine if you would like a copy.) ICF funds have also enabled us to revamp, re-write and update our website [www.thalassemia.com](http://www.thalassemia.com).
