Cooley's Corner Thalassemia and Blood

Thalassemia, also called Cooley's Anemia, is one of the most common genetic blood disorders. Dr. Thomas Cooley and Dr. Pearl Lee first diagnosed thalassemia in 1925 when they discovered that the disease was prevalent among people from the Mediterranean region, including Southern Italy, Sicily, Cyprus, Malta and Greece. Thus, it became widely known as "Mediterranean Anemia." Today, thalassemia has a wide geographic origin, occurring also among people from the Middle East, South Asia, Southeast Asia, Southern China, and parts of the Pacific Islands and North Africa. Worldwide, almost 150 million people (or 2.9% of the population) carry the trait for thalassemia and approximately 100,000 children are born with severe forms of thalassemia every year. In the U.S., 2,000,000 people are estimated to be trait carriers.

Thalassemia trait, also known as thalassemia minor, developed as a protection against malaria. There is no scientific evidence that thalassemia trait causes symptoms and a person with thalassemia trait will never get the disease in the major form. However if two trait carriers have a child, that child has a 25% chance of inheriting thalassemia major, which is the severe form of this blood disorder.

People with thalassemia major are unable to make hemoglobin, which is the protein in red blood cells that carry oxygen to all parts of the body. This lack of hemoglobin production causes severe anemia. Consequently, the primary treatment for thalassemia major is routine blood transfusions every 2-4 weeks. People with thalassemia require blood transfusions throughout their lifetime in order to survive. A person with thalassemia major receives approximately 36 units of blood each year.

As a result of routine blood transfusions, patients with thalassemia are at risk for iron overload. Consequently, patients

must undergo a nightly infusion of the drug Desferal. Desferal is administered subcutaneously (in the fatty tissue) or intravenously (in the vein) using a needle attached to a small pump. Patients must wear the pump for 12-15 hours, 5-7 nights a week in order to remove excess iron from the body. If left untreated, excess iron causes severe toxicity and organ damage, especially to the heart, liver, and endocrine system. Compliance with Desferal therapy, although challenging, is often the key to a person's health and long term survival with thalassemia. There is no universal cure for thalassemia, but some patients may be cured by a bone marrow transplant (BMT). However, finding a matching donor is very difficult and a BMT is a high-risk procedure

The Thalassemia Center at Children's Hospital Research Center Oakland (CHRCO) is one of six Thalassemia Treatment Centers of Excellence in North America. Along with patient care, scientific research is a primary focus at CHRCO. As a result of improved technology, research, and a healthy blood supply people with thalassemia are living longer than ever before.

Getting tested for thalassemia trait is an easy process and a simple blood test. Ask your provider to check the following:

 \Box Hemoglobin electrophoresis with quantitative hemoglobin A2 and hemoglobin E

□ Complete Blood Count (CBC).

□ Iron Studies (free erythrocyte protoporphyrin, lead, ferritin, and/ or other iron studies.

Cord Blood and Stem Cells

As Catholics, we believe that all life is sacred, especially the unborn. So it is no surprise that the science of stem cell research and collection poses social, ethical and moral concerns. There are misconceptions surrounding stem cell research which are routinely presented in the mass media.

Here are a couple of common myths in the debate over stem cell research:

Myth 1: Stem cells can come only from embryos.

In fact, stem cells can be taken from umbilical cords, the placenta, amniotic fluid, adult tissues and organs such as bone marrow, fat obtained by liposuction, and regions of the nose, and they can be taken from cadavers up to twenty hours after death.

Myth 2: The Catholic Church is against stem cell research.

There are four categories of stem cells: embryonic stem cells, embryonic germ cells, umbilical cord stem cells, and adult stem cells. Given that germ cells can come from miscarriages that involve no deliberate interruption of pregnancy, the Church really opposes the use of only one of these four categories, i.e., embryonic stem cells. In other words, the Catholic Church approves three of the four possible types of stem cell research.

Common Questions

The following questions are frequently asked about stem cell research:

What are stem cells and why are they important?

A stem cell is essentially a nonspecialized or "blank" cell, which is capable of becoming another, more differentiated cell type in the body, such as a muscle cell, nerve cell, or skin cell. Stem cells can be used to replace or heal damaged tissues and cells in the body. They are biological cells found in all multicellular organisms.

In mammals, there are two broad types of

stem cells: embryonic stem cells, and adult stem cells, which are found in various tissues. In adult organisms, stem cells and progenitor cells act as a repair system for the body, replenishing adult tissues. In a developing embryo, stem cells can differentiate into all the specialized cells such as blood, skin, or intestinal tissues.

What is umbilical cord blood?

Umbilical cord blood is the blood left over in the placenta and in the umbilical cord after the birth of the baby. The cord blood is composed of all the elements found in whole blood. It contains red blood cells, white blood cells, plasma, platelets and is also rich in hematopoietic stem cells. These stem cells in cord blood have immense potential to cure heart related disease, eighty diseases in blood, infections and genetic disorders.

There are several methods for collecting cord blood. The method most commonly used in clinical practice is the "closed technique", which is similar to standard blood collection techniques. On average, the closed technique enables collection of about 75 ml of cord blood.

Collected cord blood is cryopreserved (frozen) and then stored in a cord blood bank for future transplantation. A cord blood bank may be private (i.e. the blood is stored for and the costs paid by donor families) or public (i.e. stored and made available for use by unrelated donors). While public cord blood banking is widely supported, private cord banking is controversial in both the medical and parenting community.

As members of the Italian Catholic Federation and supporters of our National Charity, Cooley's Anemia at Children's Hospital in Oakland, it is our goal to help find a cure. Be well informed, spread the word to all your mothers, daughters, sisters, granddaughters, and nieces... all the women who are bearing children about how valuable the umblical cord is. A Look at the Good We Do

As we approach the compiling of our Apostolic/Charity Report, it is a good time to review all the good that we have done in the past year – both monetarily and with our faith.

A perfect example of how our Apostolic/ Charity work helps others is found in the story of Fr. Joseph Landi, the Parochial Vicar of St. Cecilia Parish in San Francisco as told by Rissa Singson in "Out of the World and Into the Kingdom."

In 1981, Joe is a wealthy and successful man, whose life is changed by a dream from God. God tells Joe there are many

roads to travel and for the first time, Joe articulates what is wrong with his life. When Joe wakes from the dream, he is not sure where the line lies between the dream and reality so he takes the Bible from the shelf and begins to read it. It is the story of a rich man who asked Jesus, "What must I do to have eternal life?" Jesus replied, "Keep the commandments." But the rich man persisted, "I have kept all these commandments so what more do I

these commandments so what more do I need to do?" Jesus replied, "If you wish to be perfect, go and sell all your possessions and give the money to the poor...then come and follow me." That's exactly what Joe did.

It took him three years to free himself of all business obligations, selling all his possessions but during that time he attended the University of California at Berkley to get the educational academic units he needed and took a teaching job for which he refused to receive payment.

It was only when Joe received a letter from the archdiocese saying he had been accepted did he tell his friends and family.

Following this dream and having given up all worldly possessions, Joe enters the minor seminary 1984 and then in 1985, St. Patrick's Seminary for 4 years. At age 51, it wasn't easy for him to become a student again but there he found peace and joy that can't compare with anything this world has to offer.

His deep faith made him victorious in the trials he encountered at the seminary. In 1990, Fr. Joe was ordained at the age of 57. His experience has definitely been a

boon to the Church. Besides his parochial duties, Fr. Joe is the archbishop's liaison in the Charismatic Renewal; edits "The San Francisco Charismatics" and on his vacations he serves as a chaplain on Holland America's cruise ships.

While Fr. Joe can lay claim to many achievements as a priest, his most meaningful one would be bringing his family to the Lord. Two years after his ordination, Fr. Joe baptized his two brothers, two nephews and two grand-nephews—three generations all in one day!

Perhaps you might not find this a remarkable story except for the fact that Fr. Joe states he would not have been able to finish his last year at St. Patrick Seminary without the donations of the

Esty: A Novel/Memoir by Lawrence W. DiStasi & Margaret Weisz DiStasi

Sanniti Publications, 2013, 215 pp.

Mal Occhio: The Underside of Vision

by Lawrence W. DiStasi Sanniti Publications, 2008, 182 pp.

As a writer, Lawrence DiStasi has always examined the influence of the past on the present. His works (Una Storia Segreta, Mal Occhio, and The Big Book of Italian American Culture) explore how the stories and culture of Italian Americans influence the way we see the world today. However, his latest book, Esty, is his most intimate and personal writing to date, and it is because of this intimacy that it is, I believe, his most insightful and touching work.

In a recent email, he explained the unique origins of the book: "My latest book, Esty: A Novel/Memoir, . . . is in many ways a tribute to my mother. Years ago she handed me a manuscript about her early life in Hungary and before (the title, Esty, is her nickname for her mother, Esther, whose secret romance she begins her 'novel,' and herself, with). I, in turn, added commentary and episodes from her later life, plus an imagined dialogue between us, to make a book of it. As a working mother, she had no time to learn about fictional techniques, but she eventually found time to create this, her cry of liberation, her detailed account of how and why she escaped her orthodox Jewish father to marry an Italian immigrant, my father. The full account turned out to be more stunning than the legendary romance we children were weaned on."

This distinctive book can be read on so many levels, all of them both penetrating and entertaining. On the one hand, this is a memoir of a young woman's liberation from her abusive father, her rebellion and escape as she marries an Italian immigrant, who becomes her savior. It is also a family memoir as it recounts the family's origins in Hungary and immigration to the United States. It is also a romance. Actually it is a couple of love stories, for we learn of the romance between Esty and her Hungarian Duke and of the romance between Margaret, DiStasi's mother, and his Italian immigrant father. It is also the story of America, rich with immigrants who boldly cross ethnic lines to form new families and a new world. It is also a dialogue between a mother and her son as throughout the book DiStasi inserts his own commentaries, reactions, and responses to his mother's memoir. All of these work together -- each



aspect of the book informing and giving insight into another. The various stories from the past and the reactions to them in the present influence one another and begin to blend together so that we see that past, present, and future become one story similar to a tapestry with an intricate weave, one thread of the story adding color and depth to the whole.

And while the book has a complexity to it that gives it depth and perception into the universal human condition, it is also entertaining, a page turner. The reader gets caught up in the stories of its various characters, their challenges and victories, their lives. DiStasi also is also able to capture the voice and tone of different eras. For example, early on, the book has an almost fairy-tale tone while, later on, the book takes on a more modern voice. For example, the book begins with "In the foothills of the Black Mountains in a little village called Hadud in Hungary, there was a beautiful estate that belonged to the Duke of Von Ripacoff, who was given this place when he got married." Later in the book, the tone changes to a more modern style: "Ella asked me what I was crying about. I should be happy. But I couldn't tell her. Papa threatened me: If I told her he would beat the hell out of me and I knew he would." This ability to shift voice and tone draws the reader even further into the story.

Readers will find Esty both insightful and entertaining and well worth reading.

DiStasi's 1981 book, Mal Occhio: The Underside of Vision, has recently been reprinted. This book investigates the superstition of the evil eye in Italian culture as well as other cultures throughout the world. He explores how different cultures have perceived this phenomenon, explaining its roots in ancient societies to more modern ones, its influences on childrearing, families, and neighborhoods. He analyzes the symbolism of the eye in art and culture and comes to understand what the eye says about how we view ourselves. It is an engaging exploration into the human psyche.
