

IRS And State of California Franchise Tax Board

As you are aware, the IRS and Franchise Tax Board for the State of California require annual tax returns to be filed by our Districts and Branches.

It is important to remember that all Districts and Branches now have two numbers - a Federal Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the IRS and a State Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the State

The IRS limit for the tax year ending 2016 is the following:

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file IRS Form 990 EZ or 990.

Branches or Districts with <u>Gross Receipts</u> of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file IRS Form 990-N which is an e-Postcard.

The State limit for the tax year ending 2016 is the following:

Branches or Districts in California with <u>Gross Receipts</u> of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file State Form 199.

Branches or Districts in California with <u>Gross Receipts</u> of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file State Form 199-N which is an e-Postcard.

THIS IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND MUST BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED

Both Forms must be filed no later than May 15, 2017. The IRS and State strictly adhere to this date, so please take this process seriously.

Any District or Branch who does not file for 3 consecutive years will lose its tax exempt status with the IRS and the State. If you lose your tax exempt status you will have to file paperwork and pay a fine in order to regain your tax exempt status.

Included in the Financial Secretaries' packet are materials that the District and Branch Financial Secretaries will need to help them with this process. District and Branch Presidents - please work with your Financial Secretary to go over the information when it is received and see that the appropriate forms are filed by the due date.

Please make sure all District or Branch finances are in order and that Bank Statements are reconciled through December 31, 2016. Remember that the <u>Gross Receipts</u> are total amounts received without subtracting any costs or expenses. These amounts include, but are not limited to, Membership and Hospitalization Dues, Dinners, Fundraisers, Raffle Tickets, Income from Convention Raffle Tickets and Calendar Sales, Interest from all Bank Accounts, Monetary Donations, etc.

Quirky Reasons Italian New Year is Awesome

This is Italy, so food is of paramount importance, and although the traditional New Year's menu might seem like a random selection of foodstuffs, it's carefully thought through.

Lentils symbolize wealth and prosperity. Then you've got the sausage meat, replaced in some parts of Italy by stuffed pig's trotters, which again means good fortune for the coming year, because it is a rich food symbolizing abundance.

Finish your meal with grapes. These ensure you will be frugal with your newfound wealth, because it was thought that only someone with excellent willpower could save the grapes from the spring harvest time until the New Year meal.

In many parts of the world, card games and bingo are associated with the seniors, but at Italian New Year's Eve parties everyone settles around the table for a game of 'tombola' - like bingo.

Tombola was created in Naples in the 1700s as an alternative to gambling, which the church did not approve

of. King Charles of Naples made a concession to the Catholics and said he would ban gambling during the Christmas period only. But those sneaky Neapolitans found a way to get around the new law by playing tombola at home during the holidays.

Watch out for falling objects - in some southern parts of the country, it's traditional to throw possessions, particularly crockery, out of your window to show that you are ready for a new start in the new year, an alternative tradition is crashing pots and pans together at your front door, to frighten away evil spirits. True, this New Year custom isn't unique to Italy, but while other nationalities may simply enjoy the bright colors, Italians have a different reason for setting off fire workers. Per superstition, demons and bad spirits don't like loud noises, so this a way to ensure they're all scared off before the new year begins. Some people even say the pop of champagne corks is the reason prosecco or spumante are favored over normal wines - it's as good an excuse as any for a glass of fizz. Buon Anno!

ITALIAN CATHOLIC FEDERATION HISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

The Grand President of the Italian Catholic Federation... Who is This Person?

Since January begins the ritual of District Installations, we thought that it would be appropriate to discuss the role of the Grand President of the Italian Catholic Federation. It is the Grand President who presides at these installations.

The Italian Catholic Federation is run by a Board of Directors known as the Central Council. There are presently 20 members on this council. The presiding officer of the Central Council is the Grand President. He or she is elected at the Central Council meeting, held at the annual convention after the delegates have voted. The Grand President serves for no more than 2 consecutive years.

According to the Central Council Statutes, these are the duties of the Grand President:

- Supervise the administrative, financial and general welfare of the Federation.
- Preside at all meetings of the Central Council, Executive Committee and the Annual Convention.
- Appoint all Central Council committees.
- Call special meetings as necessary.
- Report on the condition of the Federation at the Annual Convention.
- Preside at District Installations

when possible or send a representative.

• Attend Bishop Days and make the presentation of the Sir Luigi and Lady Augusta Providenza Seminary Burse to the Bishop.

The Grand President, on his own, may attend other ICF functions and special occasions to which he is invited. He should be welcomed and introduced appropriately. At installations, a gift may be presented to him.

Dating from 1924, there have been 37 Grand Presidents. Most of them have been men, but four women have also joined the ranks. They are Carmen Kilcullen, Nettie Descalso-DelNero, Madeleine Vinci (deceased) and Jane Dianda. The first Grand President was John Musso, the owner of the former QFI stores, and the present Grand President is Leonard Zasoski, Jr.

Leonard Zasoski will soon be making the rounds of the 2017 installations. If you are attending any of these functions, introduce yourself to Leonard. He will be most happy to meet you and have a conversation. After all, these events allow us to "get close and personal" with our Grand President. He should not be left standing by himself, but included in the general mix of conversation.

Hope you have a successful installation and many thanks for assuming an office for the coming year. Tanti auguri per l'anno nuovo!!!



Thalassemia (Cooley's Anemia): An Overview

In 1925, Dr. Thomas Cooley first described thalassemia in Italian children with severe anemia, an enlarged liver and spleen, and changes in bone formation. Several years later, Dr. Whipple named the disease "thalassa anaemia" or "anemia by the sea", because of its link to the Mediterranean region. The name later evolved to Thalassemia. With the large immigration of people of predominantly Mediterranean ancestry to North America, the devastating effects of this disease became known to the affected communities and their providers. Seemingly healthy newborns became pale, sickly, with most dying by three years of age.

Largely due to strong support from Italian advocate groups, major advances have occurred in the treatment and prevention of thalassemia. The initiation of monthly blood transfusion enabled children to live relatively healthy lives until their teen years when they began succumbing to iron poisoning caused from the routine blood transfusions. By the late 1970's a medication was developed called Desferal, which is a medication that removes excess iron from the body. Unfortunately, Desferal needs to be administered through a needle infusion 12-15 hours every day. Fortunately though, with adherence to an intense medical regiment patients are surviving and often thriving into their adult years.

Quality of life now has become a major focus for patients and their families. People with thalassemia require specialized care needed to prevent complications. Each patient must be followed by a hematologist, endocrinologist, cardiologist, hepatologist, and a primary care physician. Nutrition, vision and hearing also need to be followed. Patients require access to specialized blood transfusions in order to avoid transfusion reactions. In the past, in order to monitor their iron levels, regular liver biopsies were necessary. However, now ferritometer (SQUID) and MRI technology (which started at Children's Hospital Los Angeles) is available to assess iron in the liver and heart. Marriage, fertility, employment and medical insurance are issues adults with thalassemia now face.

Specialized thalassemia programs were initially developed in the North East, especially New York, because of concentration of Italian communities. Now, with migration to the West Coast and immigration, thalassemia is now more prevalent across the U.S., especially in California. All 50 States have adopted newborn screening programs which diagnose thalassemia

(and many other diseases) at birth, rather than waiting for symptoms to occur. Now there are six hospitals in North America that specialize in thalassemia, the one at Children's Hospital Los Angeles is the national charity for the ICF.

Despite the increase in numbers, the needs of patients in general are not adequately being addressed by government and many health care providers do not have knowledge of Thalassemia. Thalassemia care costs close to \$100,000 per year. The special services needed for patients are often not available; therefore it is highly recommended for patients to be seen at least once a year at a specialty center. There is no universal cure for Thalassemia; however a bone marrow or stem cell transplant is a cure for some patients. It is recommended that a patient needs an exact match (a sibling) and it is a very high risk procedure. Currently, research in gene therapy is being conducted by Blue Bird Bio which shows promise for a cure.

In 2005, the first oral pill to remove iron was approved by the FDA. A second oral pill was approved in 2011. For many patients these oral medications take the place of Desferal, however the come with a long list of side effects. More research is being done to develop new medications.

Thanks to the Italian Catholic Federation's generosity we have been able to improve care for people with thalassemia. Research, the expansion of clinical services, and the outreach program are supported by donations by the Italian Catholic Federation. Patients know the support they receive from the ICF and consequently they feel for the first time the community really cares. Many no longer hide their disease due to feelings of shame and instead they are filled with a sense of hope.

On behalf of the entire staff at the Thalassemia Center at Children's Hospital Los Angeles, and most especially the patients and families, we wish to extend our gratitude to you the ICF for your ongoing support of our Cooley's Anemia (Thalassemia) Program. We realize there are many charities that you can donate to and we are grateful that you continue to support our program.

Ten Reasons to Make Donating Blood Your New Year's Resolution

Live to Give Committee

- 1. One person every 2 seconds in the U.S. will have an accident, a heart or kidney transplant, a major surgery, cancer treatments, or suffer from an injury and will need blood
- 2. An automobile accident victim may use 50 units of red blood cells.
- 3. An organ transplant recipient may use 60 units of red blood cells, 6 units of platelets and 50 units of plasma.
- 4. Aperson with Cooley's Anemia/ Thalassemia requires a lifetime of blood transfusions and needs approximately 36-40 units of blood a year to survive.

- 5. A cancer patient may use 8 units of platelets per week.
- 6. A bone marrow transplant recipient may use 20 units of red blood cells and 120 units of platelets.
- 7. Only 5% of the population donate blood; 95% of the population will need blood at some point in their lives
- 8. There is a blood shortage in winter and summer.
- 9. You can save a life.
- 10. Donating blood is free!

A High School Senior, a total cumulative GPA (3 ½ years) of at least 3.2 and meets all of the requirements in either #1 or #2: 1) Are Roman Catholic and

of Italian Descent and live within the Roman Catholic Dioceses of Arizona, California, Illinois and Nevada, only where Branches of the Federation are established. or 2) Are Roman Catholic but need not be of Italian Descent or live where Branches of the Federation are established if either Roman Catholic parent, guardian or grandparent is a member of the "Italian Catholic Federation" - membership of a Roman Catholic parent, guardian or grandparent is mandatory for #2.

BOOK REVIEW

Good Americans: Italian and Jewish Immigrants **During the First World War** By Christopher M. Sterba Oxford University Press, 2003. 288 pp.

In Good Americans: Italian and Jewish Immigrants During the First World War, Christopher Sterba explores not only the contributions of Italian and Jewish immigrants during World War I but also how the war accelerated the assimilation process for these two distinct cultural groups. To measure the effect of the war on these immigrant populations, Sterba studies the experiences of the Italians of New Haven, Connecticut, and the Jews of New York City. Far from being a dry academic study, Good Americans is interesting and engaging due in large part to the author's ability to weave the stories of these first immigrants throughout the book.

Sterba does an excellent job of both comparing and contrasting the experiences of the Italians of New Haven and the Jews of New York, offering a complex analysis of World War I and the assimilation process of both groups. Of particular interest to readers of this newspaper are the experiences of the Italian-Americans from Connecticut.

In the early part of the 20th century, the Italians of New Haven formed a distinct colonia within the larger city. The Italian residents had built their colonia independently from the rest of the city and it formed a separate neighborhood in which the new immigrants would remain isolated from the rest of the New Haven community. The colonia had everything the new immigrants and their children could want: "religious institutions, mutual aid societies, newspapers, and ethnic businesses." Because they had formed an independent community, they rarely had a reason to interact with the federal government much beyond the post office. Also hindering their assimilation into the larger society, the immigrants faced discrimination and prejudice that prevented them from moving into positions of power within the city. However, as Sterba notes, these new immigrants "now viewed their residence in New Haven as permanent" and were ready "to move to the next stage of their settlement, from standing largely outside of the mainstream American public arena to asserting a major role in [American] politics and society." World

War I provided this opportunity.

The war effort required many more soldiers than were enrolled in the American armed services in 1917, so major recruitment efforts took place both at the local and national levels. The New Haven Italians responded to this effort by forming the "Italian Machine Gun Company," which was part of the Second Connecticut Infantry Regiment. The whole Italian-American community of New Haven – its leaders and its press -- supported the recruitment effort. Their recruitment efforts "eliminated any public criticism that Italians were not deeply committed to the war effort."

When the Italian-American men reached basic training, they were faced with discrimination and exclusion as they joined the all-New England Twenty-sixth Division. The Twentysixth Division had a proud "Yankee" tradition and did little to recognize or deal with the diversity in its unit. Sterba writes, "To a marked degree their experiences in the army replicated the segregated culture and society they had known in New Haven." However, as the Italian members joined the war and were merged into a new company, "The ability of the company's members to communicate in the same language (however broken an immigrant's English might be); their common knowledge of company practices and equipment; and their unfamiliarity with the people and ways of France helped to diminish, though certainly not erase, the cultural divide that previously separated Italian from non-Italian,

immigrant from native-born Yankee."

On the home front, the Italian-Americans of New Haven joined the national effort to support the war and this deepened their ties to their adopted country, but their support was due less to their loyalty to their new country and more to do with their ties to their Italian villages. This provincial loyalty, however, grew less during the war because Italian-Americans began to identify themselves more with an Italian national identity. Surprisingly, the popular mutual aid societies of the colonia, which often identified themselves with local Italian regions, joined ranks to support the war effort. By working together, the aid societies furthered the immigrants' sense of being from a unified Italy.

Upon returning home, Italian-Americans soon found that they faced renewed discrimination and prejudice, but too much had already changed. Their efforts and experiences during World War I had already begun to further their assimilation into mainstream American society. Feeling more part of the American fabric than ever, these Italian-Americans fought back and demanded their rightful place in society.

Because of his thoughtful and careful analysis, Sterba's book will be a welcome addition to the bookshelves of those interested in the immigrant experience and assimilation. From the experiences of the Italians of New Haven and the Jews of New York, we can learn many lessons as we attempt to integrate new immigrants into our country.

Family Recipes Grand Treasurer By Deborah Rodond

My December started out with the annual Rodondi Christmas party for about 40 people here at my house and concluded with a crab feed at my nephew Tony's future in-laws. Now is the time for New Year resolutions, college bowl games, the Super Bowl and taking down Christmas decorations. Well it is obvious to anyone who follows football that my team is definitely not in the playoffs for a spot in the Super Bowl. Yes, sadly the San Francisco 49ers had a VERY BAD season, the good thing is they can only do better next year! No matter who is playing in any of the games if you are throwing a party here are some great finger foods for the day.

This artichoke dip first came to my from a dear high school friend Diane and since then I have seen it in many variations.

Artichoke Dip

1 can artichokes in water, drain well and chop

1 small (13 oz.) jar marinated artichokes, drained and chopped

mix with:

1 cup mayonnaise

a little garlic powder

1 small can dices green Ortega chillies

1 ½ cups shredded cheddar cheese

Put into 8" casserole

Sprinkle with ½ cup cheddar cheese and paprika for color on top

Bake 20 minutes or until browned and bubbly at 325 degrees

Variation: Use sour cream instead of

Be creative many cheeses would work.

Artichoke Spinach Dip

13 ounces artichoke hearts, drained and chopped fine

10 ounce package frozen spinach, chopped fine and thawed

1 cup mayonnaise

1 cup grated parmesan cheese

2 ½ cups coarsely grated Monterey

jack cheese

1 Tbls. freshly grated Pecorino Romano cheese

Mix above ingredients, place in 8" casserole dish. Top with ½ cup Monterey jack cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes until cheese

Rather than cooking in a casserole this is great to spread on slices of French bread and broil in the oven until brown and bubbly.

Both the above are delicious with tortilla chips or French bread.

For a heartier appetizer there is nothing better than chicken wings. Easter 2009 my mom and I were tired of always making the same appetizers that the family always requested. So we decided to use the family as our test subjects for all new appetizers and we found some great winners that have now become some of our usual treats. Here is one of them.

Italian Mozzarella Wings

12 chicken wings, tips discarded and wings separated at the joint

8 ounces mozzarella cheese, cut into 24 cubes (I use pepperjack)

1 cup unseasoned bread crumbs

½ cup grated parmesan cheese

2 cups tomato puree

½ tsp cayenne pepper

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Cut a slit into meatiest part of each wing (I try to slide in behind the skin, so I can cover the slit with the skin)

Stuff each wing with a cube of cheese and pull meat and skin back over it.

In a shallow bowl beat the egg. In another bowl combine the breadcrumbs, parmesan and season with salt.

Working with one wing at a time, coat each with egg and then the breadcrumb mixture. Place on a greased rack set on a foil lined cookie sheet.

Bake until golden brown, about 40 minutes.

Meanwhile in a sauce pan, heat the tomato puree and cayenne over medium heat. Season with salt. Serve with wings. (I do not bother with the sauce)

Now what is wonderful about these is that I make a bunch of them and instead of cooking them I place them on a cookie sheet, freeze them and then store them in an airtight container in the freezer. Separate each layer with wax paper or plastic wrap. Ready to bake anytime you need a snack.


