

Follow Up on Membership

After a membership drive or some other type of membership activity, it is important to follow up on new members and potential new members. There are a number of things that a branch can do.

- When a new person joins the branch, the president should call that person and personally welcome him/her.
- New members should be given a list enumerating different ways in which they can help the branch. (See accompanying sheet). The branch can also develop its own list (preferably a check list) and have members indicate where they could best help. For example: help at the bar, help in the kitchen, possibly become an officer, sell raffle tickets, obtain raffle prizes, set up for dinners, be the branch photographer, serve on committees and many more. Impress new members with the good works of the ICF.
- New members could be given a free dinner and receive a free dinner if they bring in other members. Encourage members to enroll their children or grandchildren (family plan).
- See that new members are not sitting alone at branch events. Stop by, welcome them and engage in conversation.
- At a branch meeting, have new members introduce themselves and tell something about themselves.
- Assign a member (mentor) to new members, to call before a meeting, an event, and see that they are not left alone. Encourage them to sign up for some branch activity

The important idea here is that new

members are welcomed and made to feel that they have joined an organization which

is happy to have them and looks forward to working and socializing with them.

Other Pre-convention Deadlines

- 1. If you wish to place a full-page ad in the convention souvenir book; the ad contract, your photo and a message must be sent to the I.C.F. Office by July 1.
- 2. Candidate entries to be included in the Bollettino, must be emailed to both the I.C.F. Office and the Bollettino Editor by August 1. Email admin@icf.org and icfeditor@gmail.com. Submissions should include a photo and an entry that does not exceed 300 words.

Campaign Rules

- 1. Only one poster (maximum size 24 X 36) may be displayed in the area designated by the Convention Director.
- 2. Campaign flyers and non-consumable campaign favors may only be given out on Friday evening during "Meet the Candidates." Food and beverage items may not be distributed during "Meet the Candidates."
- 3. There will be no candidate hospitality rooms. This decision was made in order to follow the quiet time policy enforced at hotels. If a district hosts a hospitality room at any time during the convention weekend, there shall be no candidate posters, flyers or other campaign paraphernalia available in the hospitality room.

- 4. No campaigning may take place during convention sessions, activities or in the delegate registration area.
- 5. No campaign literature should be posted in the public areas or on the ICF Facebook page.
- 6. Registration workers should not wear campaign items.
- 7. Candidates should notify campaign helpers of these rules.
- 8. Campaign speeches will be held during the Saturday session and shall not exceed 2 minutes.

Other Information

- 1. Candidates for Central Council will be announced in descending order in even years and ascending order in odd years.
- 2. 10 candidates will be elected to the Central Council.
- 3. Candidates should wear proper business attire at all functions; no campaign T-shirts, pins, etc.

Family Recipes By Deborah Rodondi By Deborah Rodondi

Happy June everyone...I hope you got a couple of zucchini plants in the ground so that you can enjoy this next recipe all summer and fall. My mom (June) found this recipe and although delicious she found that by adding cheese it took this to a whole other level.

Fried Zucchini Flowers

12 Flower blossoms (whatever we harvested in 1-3 days), picked early in the morning, gently take out flower center and stem, lay flat in scot towel lined Ziploc until ready to use. Will usually keep in refrigerator several days, allowing you to collect enough for a meal. Do not wash before storing, as it will rot the flowers.

3 eggs

½ cup flour

1 Tbls. chopped parsley

1 Tbls. grated parmesan cheese

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. baking powder

½ clove garlic, minced

If you rinse blossoms cover in towels and let them remain there while mixing batter. I usually don't wash my blossoms, as I grew them and don't use pesticides.

Beat eggs, salt, flour and baking powder. Add parsley, garlic and cheese. Batter should form a fairly thick coating.

Heat oil (I use Crisco) (about 1/4 deep) in heavy pan (electric frying pan is great).

Dip one flower at a time in batter and fry to golden. Drain on paper towel. They will end up being about the size of your palm.

NOTE: We open the blossom and slide in a piece of pepper jack cheese before dipping in batter. Any cheese will work but the tanginess of pepper jack is our favorite. You can even put a teaspoon full of meat mixture inside. Be creative.

Some might put a sauce over the flower or have on the side for dipping; my family



likes it just the way it is. These also freeze beautifully.

Now in case your grandfather did not tell you a zucchini, pumpkin plant has a female and a male flower. They are needed for cross-pollinating and for the fruit to mature.

The window of time for pollination of zucchini is short, as male and female squash blossoms are open for only one day, opening in the morning and closing by midafternoon. Pollination, either by bees or you, is most effective in early to midmorning. One male bloom (on a long stem) has enough pollen to fertilize several female blooms (has a small bulbous area at the base of the flower, which when pollinated will produce the fruit).

Squash plants develop an overabundance of male flowers, which are delicious dipped in batter and fried, or eaten raw in salads. Be sure to leave a few male blooms for pollination or cross-pollinate yourself.

Since we stuff our zucchini flower we pick them in the morning when they are fully open, this makes it easier to open and stuff. If you pick in the afternoon you can still enjoy them, but stuffing will be difficult.

In the weeks (at least two) before donating, if possible, include iron-rich foods in your diet. If you donate blood frequently, taking a multi-vitamin is recommended.

Food has two types of iron — heme and non-heme iron. Heme iron is found in meat, fish and poultry and it is the form of iron that is most readily absorbed by your body. You absorb up to 30 percent of the heme iron that you consume.

Non-heme iron is found in plant-based foods such as fruits, vegetables and nuts. You absorb between two and 10 percent of the non-heme iron that you consume. Foods high in vitamin C – like tomatoes, citrus fruits and red, yellow and orange bell peppers – can also help with the absorption of non-heme iron.

Eating a well-rounded diet is important, however if you need to increase your iron levels, extra servings of the iron-rich foods below will help.


