
As I said earlier, we are only just beginning!




Every year the ICF convention is a highlight and this year was no exception. The 87th Annual Convention in Sacramento was a shining example of community, hospitality, friendship, and philanthropy. We are so honored to be included and as always enjoyed seeing old friends and making new ones.

Now, having been at the ICF convention for only my second time, I (Dr. Coates) was impressed by the same thing - a fantastic group of people driven to help others. I particularly enjoyed the stories behind those who received the awards.

Thank you for once again adopting the Thalassemia (Cooley's Anemia) Program at Children's Hospital Los Angeles (CHLA) as your National Charity and for the donation of \$75,000. We are grateful to the ICF Members, the Joe Liotta Trust, The Shirley Silva Trust and The Kemp Foundation Trust for their contributions. We are incredibly grateful for your support and realize how difficult fundraising is - we sincerely appreciate the tireless hard work and time that you put into your many fundraisers for thalassemia.

ICF funds have been used in many important ways and will continue to sustain specific outreach programs at CHLA. This includes our PASSAGES Transition Program and the development of adult provider co-management networks between adult providers and pediatric specialists so that patients who have survived childhood can continue to have productive, long lives. This program is unique to CHLA as we strive to be a leader in adult thalassemia care.

When I returned from the ICF meeting, I was reminded of the importance of the PASSAGES program you support. I ran into a 31year-old thalassemia "child" who made his way to the CHLA emergency room in March of this year through the adult network connections. He was in full heart failure at that time and the adult cardiologist wanted to do a heart transplant. Instead, he was admitted to a local adult facility and treated under the direction of his pediatric hematologist from CHLA (Dr. Coates). He now has normal cardiac function! What is even better, the adult service has gained an understanding of thalassemia and are now members of the adult network team. The work you do makes a huge difference.

"One Pot" Dinner

 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 pound ground hamburger

¹/₄ pound bacon cut into small pieces

1 cup chopped onions

2 cans (15 ounce) pork and beans

1 can (15 ounce) kidney beans, drained

1 can (15 ounce) butter lima beans, drained

- ¹/₄ cup brown sugar
- 1 Tbsp. liquid smoke

3 Tbsp. white vinegar 1 tsp. salt

dash of pepper

Brown ground beef in skillet, drain off fat and put into crock pot. Brown bacon and onions drain off fat. Add to crock pot with rest of ingredients. Stir well. Cover and cook on low 4 to 6 hours.

So the next time you have no idea what to bring to the ICF potluck, try this dish. Guaranteed to be a hit!

With an early morning start on Saturday, September 2, the delegates were ready to attend workshops that discussed the Strategic Plan; National Charity; Public Relations; Spiritual; Membership; Expansion; the Mentor Program; and Offices and Committees.

During the business session the Young Adult Leadership Award was presented to Antonio Costa and the Family of the Year was presented to the Pachinger Family.

After a busy morning, Grand President Zasoski concluded the morning business session, where the current and newly elected Central Council members then retired to lunch to vote on the officers of the Central Council.


Before the end of the session, Grand President Zasoski took a moment to say thank you to his family and the members of the ICF for supporting him during his two years as grand president.






