






It is a mystery but a wonderful doctrine that gives meaning to our lives.

Members Make All the Difference

Membership Committee

The ICF Central Council created the Strategic Plan in 2017 to guide the Federation into the future with a clear vision and set of broadly defined goals and objectives.

Four Core Strategies define the plan:

- #1. Membership and Retention;
- #2. Leadership;
- #3. Community Connections; and

The Task Force Committee of the Central Council has recommended Core Strategy 1, specifically *Retention* be the focus of the Federation for 2018-2020.

Currently, the Federation attracts many new members (approximately 718 in 2018); however, it loses nearly that number of current members, with additional loss of 199 members due to death each year. This has created an overall loss of membership. Below are suggestions to encourage positive branch growth and retention.

Create a Warm Friendly Environment

- Treat every member as a firsttime member; Welcome Them, Respect Them and Include Them.
- Remember that new members are evaluating whether they want to

Recognize and Welcome New Members

- Share this responsibility with the entire branch.
- Introduce them at their first meeting.
- Assign them to a table of welcoming members.
- Initiate new members to make them feel a part of your branch.

Provide Plenty of Resources

- Membership Roster and/or Contact List
- Annual Calendar of Events
- **Branch Newsletter**
- ICF By-Laws Ritual Book
- Website Address

Create Amici di Cuore

- **Buddy System**
- Assign a mentor to each new member family.
- The mentor calls assigned member before a meeting to invite them to attend.
 - Encourages new members to become a part of branch activities (fundraisers, church
 - activities, trips.....). Explains the "ways" of the ICF to the new members.
 - Invites new members to District events and the annual Convention.
 - Acts as a liaison between new member and current member-
 - Start Small and Lead into Leadership Roles.

Accept New Ideas and Ways

- New members can reinvigorate a branch with new ideas and ways of doing things.
- Members will want to learn about traditions and "ways."
- However, they will also want to put their own touches on things, making them become an integral part of the branch rather than just a worker.

Offer Family Activities

- Plan activities for the children at your branch meetings.
- Focus on family during special times of the year.
 - Christmas Party: Include the children. Have Santa Claus, La Befana, candy canes, small gifts, read the Christmas story, have the children sing carols.
 - Have a Giving Tree, where the children bring food for a needy family.
 - More activities can be found on the ICF website.

- Keep Business Meetings Short
 - Provide Written Agendas
 - Take Care of Day-to-Day at the **Board Meeting**
 - Email the Minutes and Treasurer's Report for Review
- Make It Interesting
 - Heritage Presentations

Grand President's Monthly Message

I remember one of my first ICF conventions as clearly as it was yesterday. Pasquale Esposito was singing on Sunday night to a room full of Federation members. Pasquale was, as always, entertaining and delightful, but that's not why I remember it. It was my grand-daughter's first dance with a boy! Gena, then only four years old, was so excited by Pasquale's music that she took to the floor with a young Joseph Pachinger. I couldn't help but smile.

Their dancing reminded me of one of the best things about the ICF, family and friendship. And I saw in these young ICF members the future of our federation. I envisioned the ICF many years in the future as a vibrant and growing organization.

Today, of course, the Federation faces many challenges, including a shrinking membership base, but the image of Gena's first dance stays with me as a reminder that we must work to keep the ICF a growing and vital organization for future generations.

To do this, we must work on membership growth and retention (including marketing). This is, in fact, the Core Strategy #1 of the ICF Strategic Plan. As Grand President, I am asking that this be the focus of this year's agenda on all levels.

At the national level, the Central Council is taking several actions:

(1) The Membership Committee is contracting with a professional film maker to create a promotional video that can be used to advertise the Federation on several media formats,

including social media. This video will be designed to attract new members by focusing on family, faith, and fellowship. It will emphasize the many good works that the Federation does



and the many charities to which we contribute. Its intent will be, in part, to encourage younger members, especially families, to join a branch. When completed, it will be available to local branches to use in their local parishes and communities to promote the ICF. It will also be used as part of a marketing strategy at a national level.

- (2) The Public Relations Committee has begun and will continue to redesign the Bollettino so that it can be used as promotional tool. The front page now features articles that will attract new members concentrating on what makes the ICF an organization worth joining. (As part of that move, the President's column, of interest mostly to members, has been moved to later in the paper.) It is hoped that you will take extra copies of the paper and place them in church vestibules and offices to promote the Federation.
- (3) The Central Council has created a National Branch, Branch 67, for people who want to join the ICF and do not live near a local branch. This online, virtual branch will have a members' only Facebook group with exclusive content, including spiritual talks and

sermons. We hope that you will encourage friends and others to join this branch. More information about Branch 67 can be found in this issue and on the ICF website.

- (4) The Membership Committee will be working on a branding initiative that creates a consistent and modern image of the Federation: a promotional video, radio spots, parish bulletin blurbs, newspaper ads, and other promotional material.
- (5) The Expansion Committee is working to open new branches. In fact, in the last few months, it has opened new branches in the Chicago, San Diego and Los Angeles districts.
- (6) The Workshop Committee will be holding workshops on increasing membership and retention at District meetings. The strategies and information given at these workshops will be disseminated to local branches.

At the local level, there are many things you can do to increase membership and retention.

- (1) You can implement an Amici de Coure program that creates hospitable and welcoming branches. This program creates a mentoring program for new members that helps integrate them into your branch and make them active members. The Membership Committee will be working with local presidents and districts to implement this program early next year.
- (2) You can meet with your local pastor to discuss ways that your branch can support the parish and ways that he can help promote the Federation among parishioners.
- (3) You can work with other Catholic organizations, such as Newman

Clubs located at local universities and parish and diocesan schools, to encourage younger people to join the Federation. You can create youth auxiliaries within your own branch.

- (4) You can leave copies of the *Bollettino* in church vestibules and parish offices along with local contact information.
- (5) You can contact Mike Rossi, the chairperson of The Expansion Committee, with the names of parishes that might be interested in starting an ICF branch.

The ICF Strategic Plan, which can be found in the Membership Area of our website contains many more ideas for increasing membership and retention. I encourage you to read it.

It is my belief that with a focused effort we can stabilize and then grow our membership base. You see it is my hope to be an old man someday watching my granddaughter dancing with her husband at an ICF convention.



Family Recipes

Since my nephew, Tony, has started the Keto Diet (very low/no carb diet) I have been scrambling to find recipes that fit the profile of what he can or cannot have. It has been a challenge and the one thing he does is LOVE food. So I try and find alternatives that are tasty and leave you wanting to come back for more.

One day browsing Facebook I ran across this recipe posted by Diane Galeazzi, Branch 139 Manteca (thank you Diane for sharing). It is a vegetable dish and of course topped with cheese I figured it had to be good.

Little did I know that it would become a regular dish at our meals. Of course we have done some adjusting and probably never make it the same way twice.

It looks attractive and appetizing when it comes out of the oven and while cooking my nephew informed me it smells like pizza (of course without the crust).

This is a must have to wow your holiday guests.

Vegetable Casserole Dish

For a 7"x11" casserole dish

- 1 onion, thinly sliced; cut in half if too large
- 3-4 tomatoes, thinly sliced (I use kumato)
- 1 zucchini, thinly sliced on diagonal
- 1 yellow squash, thinly sliced
- ½ eggplant, With a peeler I peel strips of the skin off- so about half the skin is left on, thinly sliced-cut in half (optional)

Stack in baking dish on end, so vegetables are standing up. I try to alternate in the same order all the way through till I get to the end. Then it is whatever I still have on the cutting board.

Depending on which direction you go in the baking dish you will have 3 or 4 rows.

- Drizzle with olive oil (3 Tablespoons)
- Sprinkle with Italian herb seasoning (1-1 ½ teaspoons)
- Sprinkle with sea salt-to taste (I don't use any salt)



- Onion and garlic powder—instead I sprinkle 1 Tablespoon of minced garlic on top
- Top with shredded mozzarella ½ to ¾ cups—I have also used Mexican blend shredded cheese or jack and cheddar—whatever is in the refrigerator. Can even add a little Parmesan cheese to the above cheeses.

As always, the seasonings and cheese is to taste.

Bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes. For softer vegetables cook a little longer. For us, 30 minutes is perfect—the vegetables have blended yet keep their distinctive personalities.

Now the recipe said eggplant optional but I always put it in. Oftentimes I do not have the yellow squash, so I just

use more zucchini.

I have added thinly sliced crimini mushrooms (baby portobellos), red bell peppers, of course thinly sliced, and even brussel sprouts.

What is great you can make it the day before, and of course refrigerate it, for the next day. As a matter of fact I assembled one last night for tonight's dinner. It is also great leftover, although I would not know about that as my nephew always takes it for lunch.



In the East Bay District, Br. 215-Fremont makes soup for the Lenten soup suppers. Br. 343—Castro Valley collects food for the Second Harvest Food Bank.

In Stockton, Br. 139-Manteca volunteers at the Pregnancy Help Center, participates in funeral help, are school mentors and volunteers at a dental clinic. Br. 413—Angel's Camp cooks a Christmas brunch for the parish and has a Graduation Mass for seniors.

What Do People Do in Italy to Celebrate Christmas?

Christmas in Italy is celebrated over several weeks as Italians celebrate from early December, depending on the region, until the day of Epiphany, on the 6th of January. It is common practice for Italian children write letters to *Babbo Natale* (Father Christmas) asking for Christmas presents.

There is a festive atmosphere during the whole of December. Christmas markets with various stalls with typical food, Christmas sweets and gifts can be visited in many towns especially in Italy's northern Alto-Adige Region.

St. Nicholas Day

On 6th of December, many families celebrate St Nicholas Day. Children write letters to St Nicholas asking for gifts and they hang up either a sock or put a plate on the table on Nicholas day's eve. Sometimes even a St Nicholas visits the homes of children. Then children sing a Christmas carol or recite a poem.

If the children have been good children throughout the last year, they will get some fruits, nuts and sweets from St Nicholas, the naughty ones get usually also a sweet, but one looking like coal.

Christmas Meals Include:

Lo zampone (skin of a lower pig leg filled with minced meat)

Il cotechino (sausage, similar to salami)

Turkey

Lamb

Tortellini (ring-shaped pasta)

Il panettone (fruitcake)

Bombardino (a popular drink similar to eggnog)

Esta dei Sette Pesci (The Feast of the Seven Fishes)

For many Italian-American families a big Christmas Eve meal of different fish dishes is now a very popular tradition! The feast seems to have its root in southern Italy and was bought over to the USA by Italian immigrants in the 1800s. It now seems more popular in American than it is in Italy!

Common types of fish eaten in the feast include *Baccala* (salted Cod), Clams, Calamari, Sardines and Eel.

There are different theories as to why there are seven fish dishes eaten. Some think that seven represents the seven days of creation in the Bible, other say it represents the seven holy sacraments of the Catholic Church. But some families have more than seven dishes! You might

have nine (to represent the Christian trinity times three), 13 (to represent Jesus and his 12 disciples) or 11 (for the 11 disciples without Jesus or Judas!)!

The Christmas celebrations start eight days before Christmas with special 'Novenas' or a series of prayers and church services.

Presepe (Nativity Scene)

During the festive season and Christmas in Italy, a nativity scene, a 'presepe,' is usually put up in churches, town squares and often in houses and is for many the most important parts of Christmas decorations.

Did you know that the nativity scene display with a crib filled with straw, originally stems from Italy and is now common in many countries around the world. It is said that the crib scene was first used, when San Francis held his Christmas mass in front of a nativity scene and the people were admiring the beauty of the miracle of Christ's birth in a manger.

The Nativity scene is popular custom that has spread across to many countries.

The Urn of Fate

The Urn of Fate is a popular Christmas activity. Presents are put into a lucky dip and there is one gift per person. However, gift-exchanging also occurs on Epiphany.

The Ceppo (a Yule log)

The ceppo is also burnt during Christmas and must stay lighted until New Year's Day.

Zampognari (Bagpipers)

In the Abruzzi region, there is a tradition that bagpipers, so called 'zampognari' come into the towns and play their flutes and bagpipes for the people. They symbolize the shepherds who come in search of the new born Jesus baby.

On Christmas Eve, as in the old Catholic tradition, often no food is eaten during the day as this is a fast day. The festive celebrations start after midnight mass. Nowadays, 'Babbo Natale', the Father Christmas, brings presents to children on Christmas eve.

In true Italian style, gifts are exchanged only on January 6 that is the day of Epiphany. Then 'la befana', an old lady, comes in search to the houses for search of the Christ Child.

Children hang up their stockings, so that la befana can bring presents to the good children. In parts of northern Italy, the Three Kings might bring you present rather than Befana. The naughty ones get lumps of black sugar sweets. The arrival of 'La befana' is celebrated with traditional Christmas cake, the *panettone*, a sweet yeast cake.

Games Italians Play for Christmas: Tombola!

Tombola is a game that is very similar to bingo in the States where numbers are picked from a drum and called out, and players have to cover an entire row to win. It is played pretty much all over Italy from Christmas Eve to the Epihany while the little ones are waiting for La Befana to come with their presents. More modern sets come with chips or blots to cover the numbers, most people play the traditional way--covering the numbers with torn pieces of orange or tangerine skins or beans or lentils.

The boards are similar to bingo boards, but in Naples the boards are very different. Numbers range from 1 through 90, but the interesting thing is, each number on the board also contains a picture, usually with the name in Italian, Neapolitan dialect and some even have an English translation.

Tombola's roots lie in a fortune telling game that was used hundreds of years ago to predict the future or help understand the meaning of dreams. Each number is represented by a symbol or picture with a particular meaning. The really strange thing is--at least to us Americans--is that many of the pictures are downright rude or sexual. Even stranger is the fact that a religious picture might be right alongside a very naughty one!

Played casually in the home, people may play for small change or Euro coins, but they may also play just for fun... and offer toys, cookies or other dolci as prizes, usually letting the children win. When they do play for money, things can get pretty heated and loud. After all, these are Neapolitans, after all. The peel their oranges, eat the oranges, place pieces of peels on the numbers and laugh and talk for hours on end. It's all in fun and a great way to start the Holiday season on Christmas Eve, or to finish it off when playing on New Year's Eve. There are even television shows that play the game and offer prizes.




