


gelo N o Italian Christmas would be complete without the sound of bagpipes. Everywhere from the piazzas of Rome to remote hillside villages, the Zampognari

(pipers) continue the tradition of festive bagpipe playing that dates back to ancient Roman times.

Traditionally, the pipers were shepherds who, in a bid to earn an extra income, would travel down from their mountain homes at Christmas time to perform for the townsfolk in their market squares. The regions where you're most likely to see a piper are Abruzzo, Basilicata, Campania, Calabria, Molise, Puglia, and Lazio.

The traditional dress of the piper is made of short breeches with criss-



crossed leather leggings, sheepskin vests with a woolen cloak and peaked cap. There are regional changes such as velvet jackets or neckerchiefs, but the look of the piper remains mostly the same as it has for centuries.

Legend tells us that of the shepherds who visited the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem, after gazing upon the baby Jesus, some took out their bagpipes and played. In keeping with the legend, the pipers will stop at public Nativity scenes for a few minutes of quiet contemplation.

Historically, the piper is accompanied by a shawm, a medieval woodwind instrument; however, today's pipers are usually accompanied by an oboe player.

They play traditional music, with a popular song being the Christmas hymn, *Tu scendi dalle stelle* (You come down from the stars), written by Saint Alphonsus Maria de ' Liguori,



the bishop of Sant'Agata de' Goti.

So, play your bagpipes, sing the traditional carols, and eat your favorite holiday foods. The one thing we have to remember, especially this year, is how much we have to be thankful for: our families, our faith, and our spirit, that have kept us together. It's family that counts, both our actual family and our ICF family.

However you say it — Buon Natale, Joyeux Noel, Mele Kalikimaka, Veselé Vánoce, Feliz Natal, Wesołych Świąt. The meaning is the same, from my family to yours:

Vi Auguriamo un Buon Natale e un Felice Anno Nuovo!





Apostolate/Charity Committee Reflections: The Catholic Church in Africa, Part 2

This is a continuation of the article from last month's *Bollettino* on the Catholic

Church in Africa. In 2009, when Pope Benedict XVI visited Africa, it was estimated that there were 158 million Catholics in Africa who belong to the Latin Church. But there are also millions

of members of the Eastern Catholic Church. These include the Alexandrian Rite Eastern Church, the Coptic Catholic Church, the Ethiopian Catholic Church and the Eritrean Catholic Church. By 2025, 230 million of the world's Catholics are expected to be Africans. The world's largest seminary is in Nigeria. Africa produces a large percentage of the world's priests. As of June 2020, there are 29 Cardinals from Africa and 200,000 catechists. The prospect of a possible Black African Pope sometime in the future excites many Christians.

The continued persecution of Christians by Islamists is one of the constant issues to resolve for the Church in Africa.

Celibacy, as a vow, is still a general challenge for the Church in Africa. In some remote areas, the situation of married priests is particularly vexing.

Pope Francis completed a 7-nation tour of Africa in 2019, hoping to discuss issues of peace and ecological matters with these nations. As was stated in the previous article, the Church in Africa has become associated with education, health care and sociopolitical reform. Certainly, the Pope's visit reflects a major commitment to Africa.

Interesting Fact:

The largest cathedral in the world is now the Basilica of Our Lady of Peace in Yamoussoukro, in the country of Ivory Coast (Cote d'Ivoire). It can accommodate 18,000 worshippers, but attendance is usually a few hundred persons. The country's President, Houphouet-Boigny, chose this city for the site of the Church as this was his birthplace. The President wished for it to become a pilgrimage site. Pope John Paul II consecrated the Basilica on September 10, 1990. Friends of mine who have visited it said that it is really something to see.

There is a great amount of information available on the Catholic Church in Africa on the Internet.

A Reminder: Branch Closure Process

This is a reminder to please follow proper protocol if you are thinking about closing a branch. This information is found in the Branch By-law book.

Article 7 - A. - No Branch shall vote to close on its own. If a Branch wishes to close, the Branch must write a letter of this intent to the Executive Committee of the Central Council, signed by the President and the Secretary

of the Branch, before any vote to close. At this time, the Executive Committee will appoint a Central Council Member to work with the Branch to resolve the problems and/or challenges facing the Branch and administrate the Branch if necessary. (Amended 8/2019)

Family Recipe Deborah Rodondi Grand President

Merry Christmas to everyone! Hope you are all staying well and healthy

and thoroughly enjoying your Christmas season. This is the time of year for anything pumpkin. Past First Lady Sid Pappani shared this with me recently. She said it was



delicious and very simple to make.

Pumpkin Bars

4 eggs

2 cups sugar

2 cups canned Pumpkin

³/₄ cup melted margarine (I used but-

ter) 2 cups flour

2 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. baking soda

 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. cinnamon

1 cup chopped walnuts

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Cream eggs and sugar. Add the rest of the ingredients in the order given. Beat until well mixed. Pour into a greased (I grease with butter) 11x17 jelly roll pan (cookie sheet).

Bake 25 minutes---In my oven, I baked 30 minutes.

Cool and frost.

Frosting:

1 - 3 oz. package cream cheese (I had an 8 oz. cream cheese in my refrigerator---so I used half)

- 6 Tbls. butter
- 1 tsp. vanilla 1 Tbls. milk

2 cups powdered sugar

Put cream cheese and butter out to get to room temperature. Makes it easier to blend.

The name "bar" is deceptive. It is more of a very moist cake. I would add maybe some nutmeg and or pumpkin spice to give it another element of flavor. I cut into 2-inch squares and some 1X2 inch pieces.

Shared this with work, Stewart's Floral (Frankln Lopes' shop) and the duck club—no crumbs were left. Besides everything is better with cream cheese frosting.

Sending out a thank you to Helene Quilici, a neighbor to my Aunt Rosemarie Gregori, for sending me a card letting me know that she enjoys the recipes and thanking me for continuing the recipe articles.


As is customary, here is a list of books that would make great Christmas gifts for children. Books are a great way to pass on traditions and cus-






Then one night, Piccolo makes a discovery that threatens his carefree life and his independence and starts him on a new and special kind of adventure.

A Tribute to Mother Cabrini

2021 has been a special year, as it marks the 75th Anniversary of the Canonization of Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini - "Patron Saint of Immigrants" and champion of the poor and needy. In commemoration of this epic year, and to honor one of the Patron Saints of the Italian Catholic Federation, we reflect on the story of Mother Cabrini and her Missionary Sisters.

SAINT FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI

Maria Francesca Cabrini was born in Sant'Angelo Lodigiano (south of Milan), Italy on July 15, 1850. She was the youngest of 13 children. Although she was sickly as a child, she helped her parents on the family farm. Even as a young child she was drawn to a missionary life of poverty, chastity and obedience and service to God.

In 1880, together with 7 other young women, she founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. A few years later, Pope Leo XII asked her to go to the United States to help the many poor Italian immigrants, who were faced with the challenges of a new culture, language and acceptance. In 1889, Mother Cabrini arrived in New York. Upon her arrival, she visited with Archbishop Corrigan and told him of her plans to establish an orphanage. The Archbishop doubted that she would be able to overcome all of the problems and difficulties associated with establishing such an institution. He attempted to dissuade her. However, with an undying faith in God, energy and perseverance, she started her orphanage. For the next 28 years, Mother Cabrini traveled throughout the United States founding orphanages, schools and hospitals. While most of her work was done in New York, Chicago, Seattle and New Orleans, she also founded many institutions throughout South America and Europe and later Australia.

Although Mother Cabrini had to overcome many obstacles – revolutions in South America, political unrest, lawsuits, lack of funds, and even opposition from other members of the clergy – she succeeded in her missionary work.

In 1909, Mother Cabrini became a U.S. citizen. She died at Columbus Hospital in Chicago on December 22, 1917. After the verification of 2 miracles, she was beatified on November 3, 1938, and on July 7, 1946, Mother Cabrini was canonized. She became the first naturalized American woman to be canonized.

MISSIONARY SISTERS OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

For over 140 years, they have continued the apostolic missionary work begun by Mother Cabrini. Through the years they have established and staffed orphanages, schools, hospitals and other facilities throughout the world. Today they are present in 17 countries on 6 continents. Their missionary work with abandoned children, exploited women and the neglected, broken and elderly as well as their struggle to stop modern day slavery - human trafficking - is never ending. They remain ready to reach out and answer the many cries of despair and fear of the poor, needy, sick and oppressed with compassion in many communities.

The Mother Cabrini Chapel and Library will be open for Open House this fall and for the Annual Mother Cabrini Pilgrimage, Mass and Luncheon on December 5, 2021.

Saint Joseph: Our Spiritual Father A new documentary film by Knights of Columbus

A new documentary, St. Joseph: Our Spiritual Father, produced by the Knights of Columbus, sheds light on one of the most hidden protagonists in the Bible. The 60-minute documentary premiered on October 10 for a six-week run on ABC- affiliated stations across the country through a part-

Knight of the Knights of Columbus. "The truth is that he models for each one of us the importance of prayer, obedience and courage in our lives. I encourage everyone to watch this documentary as a way to go to St. Joseph, increase their devotion to him and allow his example to inspire us in our many challenges." Using reenactments, interviews with scholars and the inspiring witness of contemporary people with a devotion to St. Joseph, the documentary offers an opportunity to learn about Jesus' foster father from a historical perspective and the extent to which a devotion to him can be life-changing.



"A spiritual father is forever interceding before God for your sake," said Mother Agnes Mary Donovan of the Sisters of Life, interviewed in the film. "He cares for the good of your life. He cares that God's plan within your life be fulfilled."

TIPS: Try cherry, rhubarb, peach, apple or combination fruit pies.

Microwave an 8-inch 2-crust fruit pie 6 or 7 minutes; microwave a 10-inch pie 8 to 9 minutes.

Low heat prevents burning.
