






Pope Saint John XXIII Award Winner -- Dr. Al Howard

Al and Judy Howard, aka "Mama and Papa" got involved with abortion through Operation Rescue in 1983, barricading abortion clinics and even went to jail a few times for blocking clinics in hopes of saving unborn lives.

They began to go to the clinics, just the two of them, because no one else was out there and they HAD to do something about abortion. Al and Judy wanted to help fight the excuses women were facing when they thought having an abortion was the only option and most of the time that was housing. So, they began to take these women from the abortion clinics and moved them into their own home! Eventually they got so full they moved them into their Sunday School room at the church they were Pastoring in Downey, California.

Grand President's Award Winner -- Eva Stern

Eva Stern is an amazing woman. For an octogenarian, she has the energy, enthusiasm and heart that propels her to continuously serve others better than 3 people, half her age. She is immeasurably compassionate and kind.

Eva was born in Manhattan, New York but raised in Yonkers (right across from the original Otis Elevator Company). She attended PS6 Elementary School and Yonkers Hi and grew up in an Italian Polish neighborhood. She married and had a son, but in 1968 she and her son moved to East Palo Alto where she lived with her brother. It was a rough place in the early 70s, so Eva decided to move to Mountain View. She worked for the Palo Alto Unified School District from 1971 to 1997 when she retired. She loved music and first took private piccolo lessons, but her mom sent her a flute and she was hooked. She did so



well, she was invited to join the Mt. View Flute Choir. That's where she met the love of her life, Perry Stern.

Saint Teresa of Calcutta Award Winner--. Fr. Masseo Gonzales, O.F.M. Conv.

When Father Masseo Gonzales was a teenager, he was a juvenile delinquent, dropped out of school and was unemployed. He became a gang member, abused drugs and committed crimes resulting in a juvenile arrest record.

Father Masseo lived for the streets and eventually lost a portion of his right leg during a street fight, which resulted in an amputation below his right knee. He's often said this was a sign of God's plan for him because he was still able to kneel and pray.

After passing through this tragic life experience, he received forgiveness from his parents and consulted with his parish priest.

Dear Friends of the Italian Catholic Federation:



As we continue to face the challenges in our world and our daily lives, we send our thoughts and prayers to everyone. We pray for God to bring healing to our world and to help us to find the value in

kindness, respect and helping others. The Convention theme that was chosen this year, "A Year of Hope," is most appropriate as we continue our work with the Gifts of Love Program. We are one family in the eyes of God. It is in faith and to share our heritage that we do our work to help those in need, by bringing them hope, and we would like to select recipients for our Gifts of Love Awards.

As of the end of June, we have received \$709,102.23 in donations and granted awards of \$657,560.41 since the inception of the program. We know these are also difficult financial times, but we encourage our Branches, Districts and Individual Members to continue to contribute to the fund in any amount. With your help, we

can continue the important work of this very vital program. Our next meeting to review applications will be held in October.

For those of you who are unfamiliar with the Gifts of Love program, we have a fund from which we make awards to individuals with disabilities or agencies that assist individuals with disabilities. We do this throughout the year, in order to provide funds to individuals with disabilities to help them lead fuller, more independent lives, and to find greater inclusion within their communities. We also work with providing assistance to agencies whose goal is to do the same for their clients.

At this time, we would like to request applications from disabled individuals that may require special or specific aids or "tools" in order to complete their education, training or assist them in their daily lives.

In order to generate applications, the Gifts of Love Committee is again asking each Branch President to continue to mention the program and also, when possible, to publish a request for applications in their respective

How Las Vegas became Las Vegas

This is a little information of how Las Vegas became Las Vegas from LASVEGASNEVADA.GOV

1905

Las Vegas was founded as a city on May 15, 1905, when 110 acres of land situated between Stewart Avenue on the north, Garces Avenue to the south, Main Street to the west, and Fifth Street (Las Vegas Boulevard) to the east, were auctioned off by the railroad company. The completion of the San Pedro, Los Angeles & Salt Lake Railroad, linking Southern California with Salt Lake City, established Las Vegas as a railroad town. The availability of water made Las Vegas an ideal refueling point and rest stop. J. T. McWilliams laid out his Original Las Vegas Townsite (now Historic West Las Vegas) on what is now the west side of the railroad tracks.

191

Las Vegas was incorporated on June 1, 1911. On that day, voters in the unincorporated township of Las Vegas went to the polls and voted on the issue of incorporation. The results were 168 in favor of incorporation and 57 opposed. Las Vegas Age front page June 3, 1911.

1922

The Historic Westside School was built in Historic West Las Vegas on W. Washington Avenue and D Street. The building was the first



grammar school in West Las Vegas and is the oldest remaining school-house in Las Vegas. The school is listed on the city of Las Vegas Historic Property Register, and the state and National Register of Historic Places.

1931

Divorce laws were liberalized in Nevada, making residency easier to attain. A "quickie" divorce could be attained after six weeks of residency. These short-term residents stayed at dude ranches, which were working ranches taking in paying guests to help make ends meet. Surviving examples are located at Floyd Lamb Park at Tule Springs.



These early positive interactions and a welcoming atmosphere led to further participation during childhood and later developing into a Branch and District Officer as a teenager. She has served as Orator and Sentinel.

As a teenager, Danielle keeps very busy. At her parish, she is a weekday mass lector, is on the church cleaning committee and is a first communion catechism teacher. In her free time, Danielle enjoys leatherworking, woodburning and photography. Capturing images of ICF events is one of her joys.

Danielle is a regular at the National Convention and is always eager to offer assistance. Convention Director Rose McNeal shares, "At the 2017 convention in Sacramento, the kids' table had supplies to make thank you cards for our Chaplains in attendance. Danielle realized there were more Chaplains than cards. She quickly delegated the card making task to the children in

The first gaming license in Nevada was issued to Mayme Stocker at the Northern Club. Beginning in 1931, the construction of Hoover Dam brought an influx of construction workers, which started a population boom during the Great Depression and gave the valley's economy a needed boost. The Las Vegas High School now the Las Vegas Academy, was built at S. Seventh Street and Bridger Avenue. The opulent art deco style high school is listed on the city of Las Vegas Historic Property Register and the National Register of Historic Places.

1941

The Las Vegas Army Airfield (now Nellis Air Force Base) was built in the northeast. The western-style El Rancho Vegas hotel-casino, became the first themed resort on the Strip. This was followed by the Last Frontier (1942), Flamingo (1946) and Thunderbird (1948) hotels and casinos. On Fremont Street the El Cortez hotel-casino opened.

1946

Fremont Street from Main to Third Streets was named Glitter Gulch by the Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce.

1950

Tennessee Congressman Carey Estes Kefauver held hearings into the mob at the U.S. Post Office and Courthouse in downtown Las Vegas. This historic building at 300 Stewart Ave. is still in use today and is the home of The Mob Museum. Visitors can learn about the history of organized crime and the federal agents who fought against it in Las Vegas.

1966

On both Fremont Street and the Strip, hotels and casinos were engaging in

face lifts, remodels and multi-story additions. Howard Hughes began a buying spree of Las Vegas hotels and other businesses. His presence helped pave the way for the corporate ownership of hotel-casinos that followed.

1985

Starting in the mid-1980s, a period of unprecedented growth began. Annual population increases averaging nearly seven percent caused the city's population to almost double between 1985 and 1995, increasing 97.6 percent from 186,380 to 368,360.

1995

The Fremont Street Experience opened. The \$70-million canopy above Fremont Street provides visitors with a spectacular light and sound show. This creation also ended auto traffic on the street where teenagers cruised in the 1940s and 1950s.

2007

The three-block area known as the Fremont East Entertainment District opened. As part of its downtown revitalization efforts, the city's Redevelopment Agency contributed funds to this renovation in an effort to attract additional non-gaming nightclubs, cocktail lounges and entertainment hot spots to the area.

2012

The National Museum of Organized Crime and Law Enforcement (The MOB Museum) opened inside the former U.S. Post Office and Courthouse located at 300 Stewart Ave. The new City Hall, located at 495 S. Main St., opened for business in downtown Las Vegas, leaving the previous City Hall available for development by Zappos.com. The Smith Center for Performing Arts opened bringing Broadway productions, concerts, and a home for culture in Las Vegas.

Catholicism In Las Vegas

Since the ICF is going to Las Vegas for its annual convention, I thought that it might be interesting to discover how the Catholic Church developed in this city. The vast region

that is now known as greater Las Vegas was simply a large desert landscape, hardly populated at all.

The first Mass in the area was celebrated by Father Garces, OFM, in 1716, near the present-day city of Laughlin. Before the United States acquired all this land after the Mexican War, the area was under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of Sonora, Mexico. In 1840, the region was placed under the jurisdiction of Bishop Garcia Moreno, the first bishop of California. In 1886, the apostolic vicariate of Salt Lake City was established and included the area around Las Vegas. The first Vicar was Father Lawrence Scanlan who, as bishop, founded many parishes in the area now known as Las Vegas. The present bishop of the diocese is Bishop George Leo Thomas who was named in February 2018. He succeeded Bishop Joseph Pepe, a good friend of the ICF, and, presently, Bishop Emeritus of the diocese. There are now 26 parishes in the diocese along with many other religious venues.

In 1931, the Pope Pius XI created the Diocese of Reno which included all of the state of Nevada.

At that time there were some 8,500 Catholics out of a population of 91,000. Later, in 1995, because the area was growing so fast, the Holy See divided the Diocese into two – creating the Diocese of Las Vegas. Bishop Danial Walsh was installed as the first Bishop of Las Vegas on June 28, 1995. Corresponding to the great population growth of Las Vegas, many new parishes have been opened. The Catholic population of the greater Las Vegas area is about 620,000 Catholics out of a general population of

The Las Vegas churches are known for their beautiful choirs as many of their members perform along the Strip.

Tips for Donating Blood

Before Your Donation

- Maintain a healthy iron level in your diet by eating iron rich foods (red meat, fish, poultry, beans, spinach, iron-fortified cereals and raisins).
- Get a good night's sleep.
- Hydrate well in the days before your donation and drink an extra 16 oz. of water right before you donate.
- Eat a healthy meal before your donation. Avoid fatty foods (if there is too much fat in your blood, your donation cannot be tested for infectious diseases and the blood will not be used for transfusion).
- If you are a platelet donor, do not take aspirin for two days leading up to your donation.
- Recruit a friend to donate blood with you!
- Remember to bring your donor card and driver's license.

During Your Donation

- Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow.
- Let the person taking your blood know if you have a preferred arm and show them any good veins that have been used successfully in the past to draw blood.
- Relax, listen to music, talk to other donors or read during the donation process.
- Enjoy snacks and drinks in the refreshments area immediately after donating.

After Your Donation

- Drink an extra four (8 ounce) glasses of liquids and avoid alcohol over the next 24 hours.
- Remove the wrap bandage (if you had one put on your arm) within the next hour.
- Keep the strip bandage on for the next several hours.
- To avoid a skin rash, clean the area around the strip bandage with soap and water.
- Do not do any heavy lifting or vigorous exercise for the rest of the day.
- If the needle site starts to bleed, apply pressure to it and raise your arm straight up for about 5-10 minutes or until bleeding stops.
- If you experience dizziness or lightheadedness after donation, stop what you are doing and sit down or lie down until you feel better. Avoid performing any activity where fainting may lead to injury for at least 24 hours.
- Call the blood bank if questions arise or to report if you required medical care after donating blood.
- Continue to eat iron-rich food. If you donate frequently talk to your doctor about taking a multi vitamin with iron to ensure that you re plenish your iron stores. For more information on blood donation and iron: www.redcrossblood.org/iron.

What once was a housing center for missionaries in California is now a beautiful, large facility to house women (up to 12 moms and several children each). In doing so, they have housed over 7,000 women and have saved countless unborn lives.

His Nesting Place is not just a home but it's also a church where they truly instill the gospel to the mothers to change their lives. Taking these women in and truly becoming their family with the love of Christ

The Mission

The mission is to provide mothers and children a safe loving home and a church that instills the gospel and encourages change in hopes to make a transformation in their lives - turning them into the God fearing, hardwork-

The Program

Once a mother enters the program, she is encouraged to obtain her G.E.D., attend college, trade school, or a job-preparation program, or to seek employment. The emphasis of His Nesting Place is the restoration, personal growth, and education of the mother, which prepares her to be responsible for her own future. Also, unlike most other maternity homes, His Nesting Place is able to accommodate women who have other minor children besides their unborn child.

There is no time limit for the mother when she stays there, as long as she is meeting her requirements. The primary goal is to give each woman the opportunity to know and to introduce her to Jesus Christ as her personal Lord and Savior. New life can only come through Him

The Countless Ways ICF Funds Have Supported Cooley's Anemia

The ICF has donated \$2,221,754 to Cooley's Anemia (thalassemia) since it was adopted as the National Charity in 1982, under the direction of then ICF Grand President David Botta. The funds



have been used in a wide variety of ways.

Early on, before the Federal Government supported research for rare diseases such as Cooley's Anemia, the ICF was instrumental in supporting research that led to improved medication and technology. The advance made are the reason patients are able to survive into adulthood. Now that government grants fund research money can be put toward psychosocial care for patients and families.

The median survival age for thalassemia major in 1975 was about 15 years. Those patients died of heart iron overload. Currently, the calculated median survival age for thalassemia major patients is about

65 years. While this is an incredible improvement, it also exemplifies one of the challenges that all modern children with rare genetic disorders face: while they are now surviving well into adulthood, there are too few adult providers with the special expertise required to manage them. Thalassemia is so rare in the United States that adult providers do not have the opportunity to develop adequate knowledge to provide quality care to patients. To conquer this obstacle, Children's Hospital Los Angeles (CHLA) is developing adult provider co-management networks between adult providers and pediatric specialists so that patients who have survived childhood can continue to have productive, long lives. Of course, parallel to this is the importance of making sure that every patient in the country, whether pediatric or adult, has access to the specialized centers of excellence. There are only about eight major thalassemia centers in the United States. Consequently, countless patients are managed in smaller community practices, as they do not live close enough to a major center.

As CHLA actively develops this program, it is the hope that it will become a model accepted by insurance providers for management of thalassemia patients. Currently, many insurance companies will not pay for a pediatric doctor to care for an adult patient. Working through all of the barriers and problems of developing an effective co-management model is very complicated and involves dealing with interpersonal relationships and development of trusting relationships between patients and their family practice doctors, as well as trusting relationships between centers of excellence and community providers. This process also requires close collaboration with participating patient-oriented community groups. CHLA has already been working on this problem actively for several years and has been able to get some philanthropic funding to support and pilot the development of a co-management program. It is Dr. Coates's intention to utilize the additional funds from the ICF to expand

this co-management program; patients' longevity and their quality of life depends on the success of this endeavor.



Family Recipe

Welcome to Las Vegas and the Orleans! I originally had a different recipe to share and then the light bulb went on. I do have my moments... We are at the Orleans. The recipe should have a New Orleans Flare to it. All my favorite Cajun and Creole recipes ran through my head and



The classic New Orleans sandwich combines sesame-crusted bread, homemade olive salad, and a few thinly sliced Italian cold cuts; like most great and simple foods it's the magic that happens when you combine these basic ingredients that elevates the sandwich to true greatness.



Said to have originally been created in 1906 by Salvatore Lupo (a Sicilian Immigrant) the owner of the Central Grocery on Decatur St. in New Orleans, when he suggested that customers place their typical lunch of sliced cured meat and pickled vegetables inside the bread instead of alongside it. It gets better as it sits at room temperature. Ideal party fare: make a few sandwiches, wrap them up and slice them as needed.

The Bread Difficult to find outside of New Orleans or Sicily. True muffuletta bread is a wide, round, flat loaf, covered in sesame seeds, with a soft crust and a texture somewhere between focaccia and ciabatta, which are good substitutes. The key on selecting good bread for the sandwich is that the inside can't be too soft (or it'll get soggy and fall apart), and the crust can't be too hard or tough (so that when you bite down the filling does not come out).

The Olive Salad Combines the sweet, sour, and olive oil-rich flavors that is reminiscent of Sicilian antipasti spread. As always recipes vary, but most of them contain olives, pickled celery, cauliflower, and carrots (giardiniera), garlic, olive oil and vinegar. Add some capers, roasted red peppers, cocktail onions, marinated artichokes and chopped parsley. If you like your sandwiches hot, some pepperoncini with the seeds or pepper flakes. Oregano. The olive salad can be stored for months in a

sealed container in the fridge under a protective layer of olive oil.

The Cold Cuts: There is flexibility in the choice of cold cuts used, select one item from the 3 meat categories:

- ground cured sausage: soppresata, sopressa, salami or pepperoni
- Mortadella or bologna
- Cured whole cuts: Capicola, coppa, prosciutto, ham or speck (lightly cured smoked ham)
- Cheese: Provolone or swiss

For the best texture, slice as thinly as possible. Build sandwich in thin layers, ending up with eight layers total, two of each item.

Ingredients

- 3/4 cup pitted mixed oil-packed olives (Green Pimento and Kalamata a good combination)
- 1/2 cup giardiniera (Italian-style pickled vegetable salad)
- ½ to ½ cup marinated artichokes
- ¼ cup chopped roasted red peppers
 2 tablespoons parsley leaves
- 1 tablespoon capers
- 1 medium garlic clove, minced (about 1 teaspoon)
- 3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
- Oregano to taste
- 1 large muffuletta-style roll- I use ciabatta rolls
- 1/3 pound each, thinly sliced meat from all three categories
- 1/3 pound thinly sliced cheese

Combine olives, giardiniera, artichokes, peppers, parsley, capers, and garlic in the bowl of a food processor. Pulse to chop until no pieces larger than 1/2inch remain. Transfer to a bowl. Add olive oil, vinegar and oregano, stir to combine. For best results, let olive salad rest overnight.

Split muffuletta roll in half and spread each cut surface generously with olive salad, making sure to include the juices when spreading. Layer half of each meat and cheese, repeat layers with remaining meat and cheese. Close sandwiches and press down gently to compress. For best flavor, wrap tightly in paper or plastic and let rest for 1 hour before serving allowing the bread to absorb the flavors. Cut into triangular wedges to serve and enjoy.

Can also be used in salads, as pizza topping, or serve with crackers or bread rounds.

Book Review: Beyond the Mafia: Italian Americans and the Vince Piro, Past Grand President Development of Las Vegas

Beyond the Mafia: Italian Americans and the Development of Las Vegas

By Alan Balboni

University of Nevada Press

When many of us think of Italian Americans in Las Vegas, we think of the Mafia's involvement in gambling and casinos, and while that is an important part of the Italian American history in Las Vegas, Alan Balboni in Beyond the Mafia: Italian Americans and the Development of Las Vegas shows us that the Italian American history in the city is much more diverse.

Balboni points out that the popular media's focus on the Mafia's connection to gambling has often "distorted the diverse and important contributions" that Italian Americans have made to Las Vegas' development. In fact, Italian immigrants and their descendants have been a part

of Nevada history since the 1860s when they came "to work as miners on the Comstock Lode." They soon became influential in the development of the state and "by the 1920s were well represented among ranchers, farmers, businessmen, bankers, and politicians in Nevada." The first Italians in the Las Vegas area came to labor on the railroad or in the mines. And while Italian Americans had to endure stereotypes—one paper noted their "volatile nature"—they were also more likely to attain economic success in this new city without long established racism and ghettos. And as a fact, the local newspaper often "accorded a good deal of respect to those Italians who achieved financial success." As the author points out, Italian Americans and other ethnic groups were allowed to assimilate "into the community at a much quicker pace there than anywhere else in the country. In return, they brought talents and interests that hastened the


city's development . . ."


Of course, it cannot be denied that the Italian Mafia was integral to the development of gambling and casinos in the city during the 1950s and 1960s and Balboni covers this thoroughly in his book; however, he gives a more complete picture as he discusses and documents Italian American success during the corporate years as well as

the role of Italian American organizations in assimilation into mainstream life.

Balboni's strength as a writer is his ability to document this history through hundreds of interviews, newspaper articles, records and more scholarly works. It is through this research that he is able to create a complete and fascinating history of Italian Americans in Las Vegas and illustrate that "all Americans in Las Vegas today are a well assimilated ethnic group" influential in all walks of life.

Alan Balboni is professor of history and political science at the Community College of Southern Nevada in Las Vegas.

The parish priest was a Franciscan priest who strongly influenced Father Masseo into becoming a Franciscan.

In 2006 Father Masseo Gonzales founded El Padrecito Ministries, which he has devoted to the blessed Mother and always seeks her intercessions and guidance. El Padrecito Ministries is a non-profit ministry located in the City of Guadalupe, California and situated in the northern most region of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

The non-profit was founded to work with youth, providing both direct evangelization: Instruction in the Catholic faith, talks, music, etc., and indirect evangelization; Fine Arts education, Folklorico dance and arts classes.

Father Masseo's past life experiences enable him to enter a marketplace characteristic of poverty, crime, and violence and practice his ministry. His street talk and hip-hop music are modern day evangelization or the vehicle he uses to reach the soul of Hispanic youth and convey the good news of repentance and salvation.

David Sanchez, Trustee of Br. 291, wrote in his nomination; There is no doubt Mother Teresa of Calcutta was worthy of sainthood because of her caring and dedication for the destitute and those dying in the slums of Calcutta. She treated and educated the poorest of the poor and believed the greatest poverty was being unloved. Her ministry was an example for all of us.

I believe Father Masseo possesses the same point of view and the same spirit of Mother Teresa with his ministry; he reaches out to the poor and less fortunate and sometimes those who have no direction in life or perhaps are "unloved."

It is for all of these reasons that he was nominated and received the Italian Catholic Federation Saint Teresa of Calcutta Award.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your Central Council member for these last 10 years.


