Heritage -- Mardi Gras

Mardi Gras (MAHR dee GRAH) is a colorful celebration held on Shrove Tuesday the day before Lent begins. The date of Mardi



Gras depends on the date Easter falls each year. The celebration takes place at the end of the long carnival season. Originally carnivals lasted from Epiphany January 6th until Ash Wednesday. Roman Catholic countries have held carnivals before Lent for hundreds of years. Mardi Gras is a French term meaning Fat Tuesday. The term arose from the custom of

parading a fat ox though the streets of Paris on Shrove Tuesday. The French colonist introduced Mardi Gras to America around 1766. The custom became popular in New Orleans, Louisiana. It spread throughout the Southern states. Mardi Gras is a legal holiday in Alabama, Florida, Mississippi and eight parishes of Louisiana. The New Orleans' celebration is the most famous.

In New Orleans, Louisiana street parades begin two weeks before Mardi Gras held on Fat Tuesday. The parade consists of beautiful colorful floats and marching bands and people dressed in colorful clothing.

Yes, my nephew/godson/weekly tenant/taste tester/food critic Tony got married at the end of February to his



Dear Friends of the Italian Catholic Federation:


From the Church's earliest Tradition, Joseph has been celebrated as guardian of the Holy Family and he came to be revered as guardian of God's family on earth, as well, over time. We know more about Joseph from what he did rather than what he said. In the gospels he is a man of few, if any, words. Clearly his actions speak louder than his words. Joseph is a quiet man of action, not an action man! He is not presented to us as 'heroic' in the traditional sense. Perhaps because of this, he is considered as a silent and even invisible member of The Holy Family.

Joseph is a man of humility, courage, conviction, and commitment. He is a man of hope and faith who trusted in God who called him personally by his name. 2023 1st Year Scholarship Program

Information on the 1st Year Scholarship Program that was sent to high schools in November, has now been made available to the Districts and Branches and has been posted on our ICF website www.



icf.org via a link on the home page as well as in the documents in the Officers'

The New Deadline for Donations and Applications is April 1, 2023. This will allow additional time for students to apply and for Branches and Districts to follow up with the high schools in their areas. Please discuss participating in the program by making a donation of a full scholarship of \$400, if possible, or a partial donation of any amount. Partial Donations do help to make other scholarships possible when that money is grouped together. Individual Donations are welcomed as well. Please encourage your children, grandchildren or anyone you know who is eligible to apply. They can contact their high school counselors about the Italian Catholic Federation 1st Year \$400 Scholarship or they can download the application using the link on the homepage of the ICF website. These are the eligibility requirements for students:

A High School Senior, a total cumulative GPA (3 ½ years) of at least 3.2 and meets all of the requirements in either #1 or #2: 1) Are Roman Catholic and of Italian Descent and live within the Roman Catholic Dioceses of California, Illinois and Reno, Nevada (which also includes the other cities within the Diocese of Reno), only where Branches of the Federation are established. Or 2) Are Roman Catholic but need not be of Italian Descent or live where Branches of the Federation are established if either Roman Catholic parent, guardian or grandparent is a member of the "Italian Catholic Federation" - membership of a Roman Catholic parent, guardian or grandparent is mandatory for #2.

Again, please contact your local high schools where you would like to see applicants come from and make sure that they are promoting our scholarship program and have applications available.

Family Recipe

Recently I was flipping through a magazine and ran across this recipe. The word "Polenta" peaked my curiosity as you would not think dessert but a delicious main meal with stew. So, of course, I had to make it and my first taste testers were the Executive Committee of the Central Council and then, of course, my nephew Tony. A thumbs up from all.

Lemon Polenta Cake

Cooking spray for pan (I did not use)
1 cup stoneground yellow cornmeal (I used Polenta)

 $^{3}\!/_{\!4}$ cup unbleached all-purpose flour

1 ½ tsp. baking powder

½ tsp. sea salt (used regular table salt)

2 large eggs, room temperature

2 egg whites

1 cup granulated sugar

1/4 cup grapeseed oil

1 Tbls. Unsalted butter, softened (I used salted)

½ cup sour cream

1 Tbls. Grated lemon zest, more is always good

3 Tbls. Freshly squeezed lemon juice

1/4 cup powdered sugar



- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Line the bottom of an 8-inch round cake pan with parchment paper. Lightly coat the sides of the pan with cooking spray. (I use a spring form pan and eliminate this step)
- 3. Whisk the cornmeal, flour, baking powder and salt in a bowl; set aside.
- 4. In large bowl, beat the eggs, egg whites and sugar with a mixer on medium-high speed until pale and creamy, about 5 minutes. On low speed, mix in the oil, butter, sour cream, lemon zest and juice. Stir in the dry ingredients with a spoon until just blended.
- 5. Pour the batter into the prepared pan and bake until the top feels firm and a toothpick inserted in the center of the cake comes out clean, 35 to 40 minutes. Cool the cake in the pan

for 10 minutes, then run a dull knife around the edge of the pan to loosen it. Put cake onto a rack to cool completely. Sift the powdered sugar over the cake just before serving.

For some reason my baking powder disappeared from my pantry, so instead of 1 ½ tsp. baking powder, I substituted 1 tsp. cream of tartar and ½ tsp. baking soda.

I found the texture grainy with a wonderful lemon flavor. My nephew's comment was "I am going out on a limb here and this will sound sacrilegious by saying, this may be even better than the Italian Almond Cake, which I love!" Tony informed me last night that he will be very happy if both cakes just happened to appear at his house on his wedding weekend, which by the time you read this would have just taken.

This is a great addition to your recipes, very easy to make and not overly sweet. A nice dessert to enjoy with a glass of wine.

Book Review: Failure...And Beyond: An Exploration



Failure...And Beyond: An Exploration By Lawrence W. Distasi Sanniti Publications, 2022

Many of us know Lawrence W. DiStasi as the author of books on the Italian-American experience during World War II, having authored *Branded: How* Italian Immigrants Became "Enemies" During WWII or Una Storia Segreta: The Secret History of Italian American Evacuation and Internment during World War II. However, he has also authored other books which I would call "ruminations" in which he explores a singular topic, engaging in contemplation and reflection as his mind goes over the topic repeatedly—searching and exploring the topic's many facets and approaching it from many angles. One such book is *Mal Occhio: The Under*side of Vision in which he explores the concept of the evil eye. In this book, he mixes personal experience and observation with research as he ruminates on the tradition of malocchio and evil itself. His latest book Failure...And Beyond is similar to this early work in that it appears as a rumination on a topic that blends personal experience and observation with study on the subject. It explores the topic through many different perspectives and is organic in its approach—not a systematic study of the topic. Rather it is a record of a mind that approaches a subject from different angles and experiences until it comes to an understanding that is more than the sum of its parts. And as exploration of a topic few are willing to discuss, failure, it is a fascinating and engaging book.

In part what makes the book so engaging is DiStasi's blending of personal experience and his reading on the subject. In fact, it is clear—as it was in Mal Oc*chio*—that it is his personal experience with the topic that is the genesis of the book. This personal experience remains the impetus that drives the exploration. The author's own experiences with failure begin with his father's failures in business. His father felt deceived by the American Dream and bitter over the corporate ruthlessness that left him and many people, especially immigrants, unable to achieve success. As DiStasi has told me, "In this, I think, [my father] resembled many immigrants—who thought they would find in America 'streets paved with gold' and ended up having to be the underpaid laborers who had to pave those streets." This disappointment led to health problems for his father, and he died at only 52 years old. DiStasi calls this his Ur Failure—the original / beginning of failure in his life. However, he also with brutal honesty explores his own failings—what he perceives as shortcomings in his pro-fessional and personal life. However, while the book is "personal," it is not an autobiography rather it is the author's personal exploration of the subject.

These personal experiences and observations lead to more contemplation on the subject of failure as DiStasi ruminates on American culture and society and various philosophical and literary explorations on the topic. (He draws from literature, philosophy, religion and science as he makes connections



between various fields.) He is critical of America's incessant drive for success as presented in the American Dream, which comes from what he sees as the success/failure paradigm in our culture: either you are successful, or you are a failure, a winner or a loser. However, DiStasi explores the topic enough to move beyond this simple dichotomy and the book becomes really an exploration of how success and failure are part of the process of life itself. It is difficult to summarize, but the author

moves the reader to an understanding that is "beyond failure," in which we come to accept life more fully as a totality born out of a unity, a process, which is the center of all life.

He moves us beyond a Darwinian understanding of the winners and losers of evolution—whether biological or social—to a more complex understanding of life and evolution in which all life is interdependent. The concepts of success and failure become just words as we come to understand that "life" moves beyond individual success—of a species, of a culture, or a person—and should be seen an organic whole. It sees life as "community." With this, it should not be surprising that as the book closes the author finds "answers" in religious and spiritual thinkers and prophets—finding parallels in the ideas of Jesus and Buddha, the later from whom he draws much

In some ways, DiStasi's understanding of life is not unlike our Christian understanding of life, for Christ often preached against individual success and spoke of success through community, through communion. And the paradoxes that ultimately illuminate DiStasi's thoughts remind me of our own Christian paradox: it is through death that we find eternal life. It is through failure that we find redemption. The old self "fails" and a new self is born "in communion with the saints" and one with The Trinity.

Kim's family encourages us to take a lesson from their vibrant and spirited daughter Kimberley to live your life and "to practice random acts of kindness." Amen God Bless





IRS AND STATE OF CALIFORNIA FRANCHISE TAX BOARD

As you are aware, the IRS and Franchise Tax Board for the State of California require annual tax returns to be filed by our Districts and Branches.

It is important to remember that all Districts and Branches now have two numbers a Federal Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the IRS and a State Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the State The IRS limit for the tax year ending 2022 is the following: Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file IRS Form 990 EZ or 990.

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file IRS Form 990-N which is an e-Postcard.

The State limit for the tax year ending 2022 is the following: Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file State Form 199. Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file State Form 199-N which is an e-Postcard.

THIS IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND MUST BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED
Both Forms must be filed no later than May 15, 2023. The IRS and
State strictly adhere to this date, so please take this process
seriously.

Any District or Branch who does not file for 3 consecutive years will lose its tax exempt status with the IRS and the State. If you lose your tax exempt status you will have to file paperwork and pay a fine in order to regain your tax exempt status.

Included in the Financial Secretaries' packet are materials that the District and Branch Financial Secretaries will need to help them with this process. District and Branch Presidents - please work with your Financial Secretary to go over the information when it is received and see that the appropriate forms are filed by the due date.

Please make sure all District or Branch finances are in order and that Bank Statements are reconciled through December 31, 2022. Remember that the Gross Receipts are total amounts received without subtracting any costs or expenses. These amounts include, but are not limited to, Membership and Hospitalization Dues, Dinners, Fundraisers, Raffle Tickets, Income from Convention Raffle Tickets and Calendar Sales, Interest from all Bank Accounts, Monetary Donations, etc.






