Message from our Spiritual Director

Dear Friends of the Italian Catholic Federation:

One of my favorite songs, that I used to hear my grandmother sing was... We'll meet again, don't know where, don't know when, but I know we'll meet again some sunny day. One of my favorite feasts of the liturgical year are the twin feasts of All Saints and All Souls, which are one twoday feasts. That is explained by the first word of both: "All." Everyone is there—we the living, all who have gone before us and all who will come after, variously described as "a great multitude," "a cloud of witnesses" and "every race, nation, people, and tongue." How comforting this is! All our families, friends, and all the great members of the Italian Catholic Federation. We will meet again in the joy of the resurrection.

There is a beautiful story about a secret garden: In the grounds of a country house there was a secret garden, once beautiful, now all overgrown with weeds. No one had entered it for ten years, not since the lady of the house had died there in an accident. The grief-stricken widower became locked in spiritual darkness, and his young son became paralyzed, absorbing into himself the wasting obsession of his father.

In this story, it takes the arrival of a niece, Mary, herself recently orphaned, to bring life back into the house. She refuses to accept the doom-laden atmosphere of her new

home and, with the help of a local lad, she discovers the secret garden, and together they restore it to life and loveliness. The paralyzed boy is brought in on the secret and when, for the first time in his life, he sees the beautiful flowers in bloom, he cries out, "I shall live forever! I shall live forever!" Finally, the grieving father, whose sorrow and obsession have nearly destroyed him, discovers the children in the resurrected garden, and his soul, too, comes back to life.

This world of ours is like that country house. A beautiful place, it knows too well the sorrows of suffering, the pain of loss, the doom of death. Children can only see the Secret Garden, and in our life, it is the grace of spiritual childhood that will enable us to see flowers in bloom, where once there were only weeds, to see life restored where life has been sadly ended.

The church invites us to pray for the souls of the faithful departed and to prepare for our own death. It is important that we maintain a relationship of love and faith with the deceased and that we view death and the afterlife in the light of the Scriptures. By remembering those who have gone before us, we relate to the history of human existence. At the end of life, death can deprive us of what is mortal, but it can never deprive us of what is divine. Having been stripped of mortality we will be clothed in a robe of immortalitv.

The feast of All Souls allows us to

be grateful for the life we have been given, for the people who have shared our lives and who have loved and supported us throughout our lives. Saint Ambrose wrote: "We loved them in life, let us not forget them in death.' Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Heritage -- Veterans Day Louise Vento

V eterans Day commemorates the courage and patriotism of men and women who served in the United States armed services. It is celebrated on November 11th

each year. Other countries, like Great Britain and France, celebrate November 11th as Armistice Day to celebrate the end of World War 1

Veterans Day celebrations in the United States include parades and speeches, special services are held at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington, VA. In 1919, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed November 11th as Armistice Day to remind Americans of the tragedies of war. A aw was adopted in 1938 to make it a Federal Holiday. In 1954, Congress

changed the name from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor veterans of all wars.

My husband, Russell, was in the Korean conflict. It was not considered a war. Last year, it was changed to the Korean War to honor the veterans who fought in Korea.

While tracing my family history. I discovered a draft registration for my Grandfather Manuel George. The record showed he was married and worked as a miner for the Guadeloupe Mines in New Almaden, California. He was not drafted because he had eight children. My Father Joe George was drafted in 1944 but did not serve because the war ended. My son Dan was born on Veterans Day in 1955.

Father A.R. Bandini – Great Writer

Recently I received some personal items of Father A. R. Bandini, from his great nieces. While looking through the books, some he wrote, I found an article cut out from a Bollettino that a San Francisco ICF member, Alma Rosellini, cut out and sent to Father Bandini's family.

Federation Co-founder A. R. Bandini, Great Writer

"While browsing through the 1977 issue of Columbus, the historical issue of the magazine commemorating Columbus Day, an article entitled "New Vibrations in the Italian-American Literary Scene" caught our attention.

It was written by Cecilia Ross, Ph.D. of the University of California at Berkeley, Italian Language Department, and recounted some of the accomplishments of Italian-American writers.

She had spoken to Teresita Piccirillo, an outstanding patron of the arts of anything Italian and also a prime mover, with her husband Louis, of establishing the Italian Chair for visiting Italians at Berkeley.

To quote from the article: "Teresita Piccirillo spoke to me about an author who, in her opinion, should not be omitted (among famous Italian-American writers)". Since she had known him for a long time, I asked her to write to me about him. This is what she sent me

A. R. Bandini was a writer for whom I had deep affection and admiration on account of his rare intellectual qualities and genuineness of his heart. He was modest and unassuming, loved Italy and recognized the importance of the great civilization. He came to the US in 1907 as a professor of Greek and Latin in a Catholic College in Rochester, NY, whence he moved first to St. Paul, Minnesota, then to California where he arrived at the time of the 1915 International Exposition. He was one of the very first to defend the Italian images in the US standing for the recognition of the Italian Immigrant as a strong ethnic force. He attained many of his goals

through his writings which appeared in the best national magazines, such as Harpers and Catholic World. In Stockton he founded the weekly Il Sole; in San Francisco he wrote for L'Italia, La Voce del Popolo and L'Eco d'Italia. A. R. Bandini's lighter accomplishments were both in the field of prose and poetry. At fourteen he wrote his first verse; in later years the Bride of Carmel (1947), and Fray Junipero of California (1949). His play Catherine of Sienna (1932) is set in a true medieval atmosphere. He dedicated his book Life is Too Short (1936), written in a lively and witty style, to his many friends. But his most outstanding literary achievement was, in my opinion, his translation of Dante's Divine Comedy (1929). He was the first to render in English Dante's terza rime. A. R. Bandini was also a good lecturer. In the forties and fifties he gave a series of Lecturae Dantis for the Leonardo da Vinci Society of San Francisco, of which he was a member, and for other organizations. He was a co-founder of the Italian Catholic Federation, a very active member of several lodges of the Figli d'Italia, always ready to vindicate the Italian immigrant.'

What Teresita Piccirillo did not mention is that almost every day, except Sunday, Father Albert R. Bandini, after attending his priestly duties, would retire to his study to read and write. He was revising his translation of Purgatory when the Lord called him to his rest.

What Cecilia Ross also did not mention was the fact that she was a scholar in her own right and was the niece of Father Bandini.

I never had the privilege of knowing Father Bandini, but reading this article and seeing some of the things he saved---like play bills from plays and operas when he was in New York and a few of the books he must have loved, including Pinocchio, he had to have been a fascinating person and we are blessed that he was part of our founding 99 years ago. His writings and prose may have been forgotten but he lives on in us the Italian Catholic Federation.

Life Tribute Josephine (Jody) Grace Balestrieri

January 6, 1931 – September 21, 2023

After 92 years of devotion to her faith, family, and friends, Josephine Grace Balestrieri passed quietly with rosary in hand, at her home surrounded by her three loving children. Her life was one of faith filled service to all. She was preceded in death by her Sicilian immigrant parents Pietro and Giuseppa Bozzo. Shortly after graduating from San Diego High School where she was a marching majorette, she married Thomas (Tom) A. Balestrieri on October 23, 1949. Together, they celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary in 1999, only to suffer the passing of her beloved husband on March 14, 2000. Their lifelong love affair began when Josephine was a mere 10 years old, her family relocating from St. Louis, MO, and moved next door to the Balestrieri family home. She knew it was love at first sight when leaning out of her bedroom window to steal fruit from the Balestrieri's loquat tree, her beloved Tom was there to squirt her with a garden hose!

Josephine was a lifelong professional secretary always in the service of others. She worked at Convair/General Dynamics from 1950-60 where a group of transplanted Texan engineers gave her the nickname "Jody". Later, she was the executive secretary to a WWII naval aviator turned biographer who exclusively wrote about his fellow fighter aces. Subsequently, she spent nearly 25 years as the parish secretary at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church. And throughout all this, she was the consummate volunteer at her children's schools as a producer of talent shows, coordinator for fund raising, and leading several cheerleading squads.

As a child in St. Louis, she regularly sang on a local radio station, later performed in her high school musical productions, and even sang and danced for local military personnel as part of a USO troupe. She sang Shubert's Ave Maria at countless weddings over the years and shortly after her husband passed, Josephine was an active member of the Southwestern College Concert Choir. With the choir, she would travel both locally and globally to perform at such venues as the Sydney Opera House, the Notre Dame Cathedral, multiple Italian basilicas, and Carnegie Hall (twice).

Her home was a perpetual place of comfort and hospitality. Everyone who entered her home was treated with love, respect, and above all dignity. These

were the lessons she would teach her children and grandchildren. Her faith was her foundation, and it would shape the lives of all who lived under her roof, visited her home, or had any professional associations with her. She was a Eucharistic Minister, lector, and religious education teacher as a member of her St. Rose of Lima parish.

Josephine dedicated more than 53 years of her life as a member of the Italian Catholic Federation (ICF). She was a charter member of Branch 229, holding multiple leadership roles at the local and district levels, and ultimately as a member of the ICF Central Council. Devoted to the church of her youth, Josephine was also instrumental in establishing the Amici Ball Committee to assure funds were raised for the preservation of the many artistic and religious treasures at Our Lady of the Rosary Catholic Church in San Diego's Little Italy. After more than a half century of service to numerous organizations, she helped raise countless amounts of funds to support the poor, local seminarians, and many other worthy causes. In 1985, Pope John Paul II bestowed upon her e papal honor Pro Eclessia et Pontifice in recognition of her lifelong service to the Diocese of San Diego. Her 92 years among us were nothing short of the quintessential master class in faith, kindness, and generosity. She will be missed by many and forever loved by her family and friends.

Taste: My Life Through Food by Stanley Tucci Gallery Books, 2021, 304 pp.

Stanley Tucci shares his two greatest passions in Taste: My Life Through Food family and food — and these passions animate the book, giving it life and mak-ing it a thoroughly enjoyable experience for the reader. As many know, Tucci is an actor, writer, director, and producer, most notable for his film Big Night, the well-received movie about two brothers running a failing restaurant. He is also the host of the Emmy nominated television show Searching for Italy. Taste is his autobiography as told through his memories of family, friends, and food.

Book Review--*Taste: My Life Through Food*



boy, Fourth of July celebrations were very important in our family. At this time all or most of my family members who had been part of the great wave of Italian immigrants were still alive. Compared to the abject poverty of the Italian south, America held for them everything Italy could not offer or would not allow. It was in America that their dreams of a new and successful life came true. They created Italian enclaves all over the country by sending for family and friends once work had been secured. America gave them the best of both worlds: a country where prospects were many, and the opportunity to surround themselves with extended family." Again, this perfectly describes how my Italian-American family with immigrant great-grandparents and grandparents felt about the Fourth of July and America, and I suspect its description would apply to many Italian-American and other immigrant families' experiences. And, of course, a meal was central to any holiday but especially the Fourth of July. As Tucci explains, "Food was the connective tissue that brought them, again and again, back into each other's homes, backyards, front porches, campsites, beaches, and hearts. The lubricant that is wine ameliorated any squeaky emotional wheels, just as at times it was fuel for any dark and dormant emotional fires. I remember many of these Independence Day celebrations being held at our house in northern Westchester. We would spend days preparing for the onslaught of rela-tives from both sides. Out of paper, string, and poster board, my father would make all of the decorations, from hand-painted pennants to red, white, and blue stovepipe hats. With the welding equipment he used to make steel sculptures, he would cut fifty-gallon drums in half lengthwise and place them on sawhorses. They were then filled with charcoal and old steel fridge/ freezer shelves were

placed across the top, thus creating two enormous barbecues. Over these makeshift grills, the ubiquitous hamburgers and hot dogs were cooked alongside Italian sausages, a simple culinary representation of the melding of two distinctive cultures. The sausages were served on long wedges with slowly sautéed onions and red and green pep-pers." Tucci's memories could be lifted from my own childhood memories and, suspect, many readers' memories.

In Taste, Tucci reminds us of the importance of family and friends and how meals are often "the connective tissue" that bring us together. Whether one comes from an Italian-American background or another cultural experience, I think there will be much that one recognizes in this delightful autobiography.
