Convention Update



Grand President's Monthly Message *A Joyful Lent*

Here we are halfway through Lent. May you find Joy during this Lenten season. Joy? Lent? Not two words you usually hear together. Think about it. We are given 40 days (not counting Sundays) to use as time of spiritual self-renewal, and this can be a joyous thing. And that's what lies at the heart of Lent. We

are spiritually recharging, renewing ourselves in faith in preparation for the biggest event of the liturgical year, the marking of Jesus' death and resurrection.



Did you know that our own St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was accepted into the Church on Ash Wednesday of 1805. I found this on a website called Seton Reflections. "Elizabeth quickly found herself truly far away from all so dear..." having been summarily dropped from her neighboring social set and disowned by her family. Still, upon making her confession and receiving the Holy Eucharist for the first time, Elizabeth was overjoyed:
"At last...at last, GOD IS MINE
AND I AM HIS! Now, let all go
its round — I Have Received
Him!" But this is the great secret of the season: you keep going, even though it is hard, and you feel like you've been here before, and you're slipping in the sand and getting nowhere. Suddenly, if you are looking for them, the blessings, and the graces you've already been given become apparent, and the promised land of further graces becomes enlarged in your sight, and everything... begins to make sense. And at that point there will be glory, but not of your own making. It will be Christ's glory, shining from your



Heritage — Easter and Passover Louise Vento

Once Carnival is over and we have had our fill of rich food, along comes Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Lent is determined by the date Eas-

ter occurs. Ash Wednesday can be as early as Febru-

ary 4th or as late as March 11th. Ash Wednesday makes it clear that the season of penitence has arrived. The priest draws the sign of the cross on the forehead of believers—a reminder that death is always near.

The date of Easter has changed over the centuries depending on the moon. Easter was initially celebrated on the first full moon of springtime. Before there was an Easter celebration, there was Passover which the Italians called Jewish Easter. The food served during the Easter feast is Easter bread (Popo Olivia), artichokes and the traditional Lamb. The Portuguese also serve leg of lamb, rice pudding and Easter breads (Folares). The lamb is a symbol of Jesus, and the eggs represent a new life and a return of spring. The Passover commemorates the time


Live to Give--Blood is Lifesaving

I was in and out of that lounge chair within half an hour leaving behind a unit of my very own blood. It may sound like I'm glorifying/ exaggerating/sensationalizing this event; and I am! St. Joseph's Table




A common feast during Lent is the Feast of St. Joseph. The Solemnity of St. Joseph is celebrated on March 19 in a variety of ways all over the world. The most well-known tradition is the St. Joseph's Table or St. Joseph's Altar, started in Sicily. This ancient tradition goes back to the Middle Ages. At that time there was an exceptionally severe drought in Sicily. No rain fell for an extended period of time, no crops would grow, and countless people died of famine. The peasants prayed to God for rain, and they also prayed to St. Joseph to intercede with God on their behalf. They promised that if God caused it to rain, they would have a special feast honoring God and St. Joseph. By a miracle, the rains came, and the crops were planted. With the harvest, the people prepared a feast of foods from their crops. This has become known as the Tavola di San Giuseppe. Through the centuries, people who have prayed for a favor and been granted the favor use this festivity to show their thanks. The "favor" requested must not be for personal gain or benefit. Some common requests are the safe return of a loved one from a war (a very common request during World War II), or that a loved one will be cured and survive from a serious, life threatening illness or accident.

ATTENTION BRANCH PRESIDENTS AND FINANCIAL SECRETARIES 2024 WILL BE AN OPEN ENROLLMENT YEAR FOR THE HOSPITAL PLAN

As a special offer for the 100th Anniversary of the Italian Catholic Federation, the Central Council voted to make two changes in the Hospital Plan for Individuals and Branches in 2024.

FOR INDIVIDUALS:

During all of 2024 the Hospital Plan will be open to every member, regardless of their age. The age 70 restriction is temporarily suspended for 2024, only, as an invitation for all members of the ICF to take advantage of this opportunity to enroll in our special plan.

FOR BRANCHES:

For any Branch member who becomes a NEW member of the Hospital Plan and pays their \$25.00 in January, February or March, the Federation will only bill the Branch for \$20.00. Thus, for each

Member who joins the Plan as a NEW member the Branch will earn \$5.00.

The \$5.00 reduction is only for those joining NEW in January, February or March. So, you must act right away to get this benefit. After March, the Branch will again be billed the entire \$25.00 for any new members to the plan.

HOSPITALIZATION PLAN – FACT SHEET

The following information briefly outlines the benefits, conditions and costs: BENEFITS

After ninety (90) days of membership in the plan, the fund will pay:

• \$75.00 for the first day, \$50.00 for the second day and \$25.00 for the third day and any additional days thereafter.

- \$500.00 per calendar year.
- \$500.00 lifetime maximum per illness.

- Payments are made directly to the member.
- No medical examination is required to join.
- All claims are accepted for up to one year after a hospital stay or outpatient

• \$25.00 per year - paid to the Branch Financial Secretary





Book Review--Giovanni's Tree: New Italian Folktales


Giovanni's Tree: New Italian Folktales

By Nicholas A. DiChario

In *Giovanni's* Tree, a collection of nine original Italian folktales,

Nicholas A. DiChario writes a series of tales that at once respects the traditional folktale form while giving it a contemporary context. It is a thoroughly enjoyable and thought-provoking collection of stories.

The Italian folktale tradition goes back to the 16th century with the first collection of known fairy tales The Pleasant Nights by Giovanni Francesco Straparola published in 1550. In 1634 and 1636, one of the most influential collections of Italian folktales was published under the pen name of Giambattista Basile. Titled Pentamerone: Lo cunto de li cunti ("The Tale of Tales"), this volume influenced the Brothers Grimm's famous anthology of folktales. Of course, many contemporary readers are aware of Italo Calvino's magical Italian Folktales first published in 1956



and translated into English in 1962. (I have reviewed this collection in this column in the past.)

DiChario's *Giovanni's Tree* continues this tradition with original stories that are founded in the genre of the conventional Italian folktale. In these tales, we find familiar characters: witches, devils, zombies, priests, rodents, peasants, magical items, sprites... Each tale centers around a fantastical plot that often ends in a surprising and satisfying twist. Despite the contemporary context of

many of the tales (the reader finds cars and marketing meetings mentioned in the text), one feels that these tales would fit comfortably among a collection of older folktales and fairytales - which is to say that they are utterly entertaining and intriguing.

In "Father Bernardo and the Country Devil," we find Father Bernardo faced with a dilemma after a member of the mafia brings his dead colleague to the priest's small town. To save his town from the wrath of mafia, he must come up with clever ways to provide for the 'sin-eating" of the deceased mafioso. This ultimately leads him to make a deal with a local devil. The increasingly clever plot reminds one of the folktales presented in Calvino's collection. In the end, one is left satisfied and comes to understand that evil must not always triumph over good - if one is clever and innocent enough.

In "Peppino and the Heartsick Sweater," DiChario creates one of the funniest and most eerie characters, a talking, heartsick sweater. Peppino,the main character, purchases the sweater at a seaside market from an old witch, Brunilda, despite her warning that it "has a history." The sweater falls in love with Peppino's girlfriend, Rosa, and when she leaves

Peppino, the sweater insists that it be reunited with her although she has left it behind. What follows is a hilarious story of twists and turns that leaves the reader laughing aloud but also a bit disturbed. In the end, Peppino returns the sweater to Brunilda in exchange for a goblet with "a history."

In the title tale, one reads about a magical tree that protects the valuable wine of a small Italian village from the ransacking Romans and provides the villagers with eternal life. Of course, this comes with a price. It is perhaps the most powerful and moving tale in the collection.

Giovanni's Tree is a volume of tales that will reward the reader with tales that both delight and provoke.

DiChario's fiction has been nominated for the World Fantasy and Hugo awards, among others, and his stories have appeared in many magazines and anthologies, including The Best Alternate History Stories of the 20th Century. He has earned degrees: a bachelor's degree in English from St. John Fisher College in Rochester, New York, and a master's in liberal studies from SUNY Empire State College.





IRS AND STATE OF CALIFORNIA FRANCHISE TAX BOARD

As you are aware, the IRS and Franchise Tax Board for the State of California require annual tax returns to be filed by our Districts and Branches.

It is important to remember that all Districts and Branches now have two numbers - a Federal Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the IRS and a State Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the **State**

The IRS limit for the tax year ending 2023 is the following:

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file IRS Form 990 EZ or 990.

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file IRS Form 990-N which is an e-Postcard.

The State limit for the tax year ending 2023 is the following:

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file State Form 199.

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file State Form 199-N which is an e-Postcard.

THIS IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND MUST BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED

Both Forms must be filed no later than May 15, 2024. The IRS and State strictly adhere to this date, so please take this process seriously.

Any District or Branch who does not file for 3 consecutive years will lose its tax exempt status with the IRS and the State. If you lose your tax exempt status you will have to file paperwork and pay a fine in order to regain your tax exempt status.

Included in the Financial Secretaries' packet are materials that the District and Branch Financial Secretaries will need to help them with this process. District and Branch Presidents - please work with your Financial Secretary to go over the information when it is received and see that the appropriate forms are filed by the due date.

Please make sure all District or Branch finances are in order and that Bank Statements are reconciled through December 31, 2023. Remember that the Gross Receipts are total amounts received without subtracting any costs or expenses. These amounts include, but are not limited to, Membership and Hospitalization Dues, Dinners, Fundraisers, Raffle Tickets, Income from Convention Raffle Tickets and Calendar Sales, Interest from all Bank Accounts, Monetary Donations, etc.

Tips for Donating Blood

We hope you have signed up to donate blood and save lives at the ICF convention. If you have not and would like to do so, please contact Laurice Levine at Llevine 430@aol.com.

For those of you donating we wanted to give you some tips for a successful and smooth donation:

Before Your Donation

- Maintain a healthy iron level in your diet by eating iron rich foods (red meat, fish, poultry, beans, spinach, ironfortified cereals and raisins).
- Get a good night's sleep.
- Hydrate well in the days before your donation and drink an extra 16 oz. of water right before you donate.
- Eat a healthy meal before your donation. Avoid fatty foods (if there is too much fat in your blood, your donation cannot be tested for infectious diseases and the blood will not be used for transfusion).
- If you are a platelet donor, do not take aspirin for two days leading up to your donation.
- Recruit a friend to donate blood with you!
- Remember to bring your donor card and driver's license.

During Your Donation

- Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow.
- Let the person taking your blood know if you have a preferred arm and show them any good veins that have been used successfully in the past to draw blood.
- Relax, listen to music, talk to other donors or read during the donation process.
- Enjoy snacks and drinks in the refreshments area immediately after donating.

After Your Donation

- Drink an extra four (8 ounce) glasses of liquids and avoid alcohol over the next 24 hours.
- Remove the wrap bandage (if you had one put on your arm) within the next hour.
- Keep the strip bandage on for the next several hours.
- To avoid a skin rash, clean the area around the strip bandage with soap and water.
- Do not do any heavy lifting or vigorous exercise for the rest of the day.
- If the needle site starts to bleed, apply pressure to it and raise your arm straight up for about 5-10 minutes or until bleeding stops
- If you experience dizziness or lightheadedness after donation, stop what you are doing and sit down or lie down until you feel better. Avoid performing any activity where fainting may lead to injury for at least 24 hours.
- Call the blood bank if questions arise or to report if you required medical care after donating blood.
- Continue to eat iron-rich food. If you donate frequently talk to your doctor about taking a multi vitamin with iron to
 ensure that you replenish your iron stores. For more information on blood donation and iron:






St. Dorothy Parish Deacon-Tommy Green will be ordained on June 1st.
