Grand President's Monthly Message

Did you know... History of Mother's Day

In 1858, Ann Jarvis, a young Appalachian homemaker, organized "Mother's Workdays" to improve the sanitation and avert deaths from disease-bearing insects and seepage of polluted water. In 1905, when Ann Jarvis died, her daughter, Anna, decided to memorialize her mother's lifelong activism, and began a campaign that culminated in 1914 when Congress passed a Mother's Day resolution.



Following her mother's death, Anna Jarvis embarked on a remarkable campaign. She poured out a constant stream of letters to men of prominence — President William Taft and former President Theodore Roosevelt among them — and enlisted considerable help from Philadelphia merchant John Wannamaker. By May of 1907, a Mother's Day service had been arranged on the second Sunday in May at the Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia, where Mother Jarvis had taught. That same day a special service was held at the Wannamaker Auditorium in Philadelphia, which could seat no more than a third of the 15,000 people who showed up.

Mother's Day has endured. It serves now, as it originally did, to recognize the contributions of women. Mother's Day, like the job of "mothering," is varied and diverse. Perhaps that's only appropriate for a day honoring the multiple ways women find to nurture their families, and the ways in which so many have nurtured their communities, their countries, and the larger world.

The month of May is commonly associated with devotions to the Virgin Mary - "The Queen of May". Christian devotion to Mary goes back to the early third century. In his encyclical, *Mense Maio*, 1965, Saint Pope Paul VI acknowledged that the month of May has traditionally been a time when the Church has urged its people to offer prayers and acts of devotion honoring the Blessed Virgin Mary.



Heritage — Custom and Culture

People can create their own culture. Culture is also a way of life—no two cultures are alike. Once a culture was developed then the people took on customs.

A custom is the practice of preserving an idea or action and passing it down from one generation to the next. Customs include such things as how you can marry, an eating habit, a way of dressing, a game we learned to play and/or a religious observance. A person usually follows a tradition or a custom that is handed down to them by their ancestors. People rarely ask why the customs are the way they are or whether some other way would be better. People honor their customs and observe them whenever possible. Individuals find it amusing to discover that another group of people, from a different culture, do not observe the same customs that they observe. Like in Italy or Sicily, some customs of the north are not celebrated in the south. Like the San Giuseppe feast day, it is not celebrated in Northern Italy.

Each culture of people observes their

own customs that are passed from generation to generation — holiday customs, funeral customs, religious customs and marriage customs. Some customs are carried out each year at church festivals or Christian feasts. The people of Italy hold a joyous carnival just before Lent every year; this custom has been carried over into the United States with the Mardi Gras celebrations. Another custom or tradition is at Christmas with the display of the Christ child Jesus in a crib with Joseph, Mary, the Kings and Shepherds. Every year at Christmas I put the manger under my tree.

Some customs passed down are like when a bride gets married, she must have something old, something new, something borrowed and something blue. I am sure all of you have a custom that has been passed down from your grandparents to your parents to you. You may have already passed that particular custom down to your children and grandchildren. The custom I can remember growing up was that you could not enter a Catholic Church without a head covering because it was disrespect towards God.

Membership Committee Report: Where to Look for New Members?

During our recent membership workshops, ICF branch leaders shared with us several ways that they work with other parish and community groups. These cooperative efforts often lead to new members. We thought that we would share a few ideas with you in this month's column.

First, our parishes contain many ministries and organizations that share similar goals with the ICF. One branch in the Federation works closely with the *Knights of Columbus*. The two organizations assist each other in fundraisers and parish activities, such as fish fries during Lent and cleaning the church after weekend masses. Not surprisingly, they also share many members.

Another branch works closely with parish staff to assist with RCIA. They make lunches for RCIA members engaged in classes and workshops. Not only is this a great way to show

hospitality to the newest members of the parish, but it allows the branch to recruit new members to its branch.

Several branches have close relationships with Italian-American fraternities in their communities. They use these fraternities' halls for dinner meetings, fundraiser dinners, and other events. These fraternities in turn help them publicize ICF events and recruit new members.

Other branches work with local non-profits to feed the homeless, provide assistance to needy families, support new mothers, and serve their communities in other ways. Many of these non-profits contain Catholics who are unaware of the ICF and yet share many of our values. They make excellent recruits for our branches.

As we look to grow as a Federation, it benefits us to look outside the Federation to other organizations that are fertile ground for new members.

Annual Central Council

The Central Council is the governing body of the organization. Members keep the Catholic spirit intact and assure the integrity and continuance of the Federation.



Expand your commitment to the ICF as a Central Council Member. Candidacy is open to Members in all Branches. The age cap has been eliminated and it is no longer required to be a Convention Delegate to run.

Campaign Process:

- *Submit your candidate application, Bollettino entry and a headshot photo to the ICF office by August 1. (Firm deadline)
- *Optional full page yearbook ad is due to the office by July 1. (See yearbook information).
- *One poster (maximum size 24 X 36) may be displayed in the designated area.
- *Each candidate will be provided with one table at "Meet the Candidates." In lieu of hospitality rooms, this is your sole campaign area at the hotel to utilize if you wish to distribute flyers and campaign favors. Food and beverage related favors (including candy) are not permitted in our hotel contract. You may decorate your table avoiding balloons or confetti. Candidates are responsible for table cleanup following the Friday night festivities.
- *To maintain fairness, campaigning is not permitted during registration, sessions, activities, on the ICF Facebook page, or in the Bollettino (other than your candidate entry).
- *Campaign speeches will be held during the Saturday session - two minutes per candidate.

Responsibilities of Central Council Members:

- *Honor the ICF By-laws, Rituals and Central Council Statutes.
- *Attend Central Council meetings and the annual convention. Travel is reimbursed.
- *Serve and participate on the Central Council committees to which you are appointed by the Grand President.
- *Support and promote all ICF programs.
- *Inform the ICF office of any serious problem pertaining to the Branches and Districts throughout the Federation.
- *Serve as a Special Representative at events at the request of the Grand President.
- *Attend your Branch and District meetings, providing leadership as needed and assisting with ICF protocol.
- *Keep lines of communication open between Branches, Districts and the Central Council.


Book Review--Enter by the Narrow Gate: A Christopher Worthy/Father Fortis Mystery

Enter by the Narrow Gate: A Christopher Worthy/Father Fortis Mystery

By David Carlson
Coffeetown Press, 2016

In Enter by the Narrow Gate, a Detroit detective and a priest team up to solve two mysteries unfolding in New Mexico. The detective, Christopher Worthy, has been assigned a missing person's case involving a teenage girl that they believe has fled to the Santa Fe area to meet up with a young man. While there, his friend Father Fortis asks for his help in solving the ritualistic murder of a young nun. Their journey to solve the crimes leads them into the secret lives of Trappist monks and alienated teenagers as they discover the obscure religious practices and the cultures of the Southwest.



This is the first in the Christopher Worthy/Father Fortis Mystery series of mysteries. The series revolves around Christopher Worthy, a well-respected detective who is tormented by an unsolved mystery, and Father Fortis, a Greek Orthodox monk. Carlson had engaged this duo in mysteries that have

unusual twists and plots through six different novels.

In Enter by the Narrow Gate, Carlson uses his knowledge of philosophy and religion to introduce the reader to various less known religious practices and groups, such as the Penitentes of New Mexico, who were once known for their ascetic practices, which included self-flagellation in private ceremonies during Lent, and processions during Holy Week which ended with the reenactment of Christ's crucifixion on Good Friday. The book also explores the cultures of New Mexican Native Americans, offering an understanding into the region and its indigenous peoples.

The mystery itself keeps the reader turning the pages of this entertaining and engaging novel. Carlson does an excellent job of not showing his hand so that the reader does not solve the case of the missing girl or the murder of the young nun before the end of the novel. The main characters of Worthy and Fortis - while not fully developed in this first book of the series - have interesting back stories and create an

good team.

This book itself touches on various themes, such as redemption and reconciliation, from different perspectives and move the book from "just a light mystery" to a book that explores the struggles of human experience in the modern world and the ways that we deal with the challenges that face us.

David Carlson is Professor Emeritus of Philosophy and Religion at Franklin College. As well as being the author of the award-winning Christopher Worthy and Father Fortis mystery series, he is the author of Peace Be with You: Monastic Wisdom for a Terror-Filled World (Thomas Nelson Publishers), which was selected as one of the Best Books of the Year in 2011 in the category of Spiritual Living by Library Journal, and Countering Religious Extremism: The Healing Power of Spiritual Friendship (New City Press). David is also a media resource and frequent speaker on religion and terrorism, Catholic-Orthodox relations, and Christian-Muslim relations.


made. The most popular flavor was vanilla with cherries, chocolate chips were also a crowd favorite as well as those that were dipped in chopped nuts.



IRS AND STATE OF CALIFORNIA FRANCHISE TAX BOARD

As you are aware, the IRS and Franchise Tax Board for the State of California require annual tax returns to be filed by our Districts and Branches.

It is important to remember that all Districts and Branches now have two numbers - a Federal Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the IRS and a State Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the State

The IRS limit for the tax year ending 2023 is the following:

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file IRS Form 990 EZ or 990. Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file IRS Form 990-N which is an e-Postcard.

The State limit for the tax year ending 2023 is the following:

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file State Form 199.

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file State Form 199-N which is an e-Postcard.

THIS IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND MUST BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED

Both Forms must be filed no later than May 15, 2024. The IRS and State strictly adhere to this date, so please take this process seriously.

Any District or Branch who does not file for 3 consecutive years will lose its tax exempt status with the IRS and the State. If you lose your tax exempt status you will have to file paperwork and pay a fine in order to regain your tax exempt status.

Included in the Financial Secretaries' packet are materials that the District and Branch Financial Secretaries will need to help them with this process. District and Branch Presidents - please work with your Financial Secretary to go over the information when it is received and see that the appropriate forms are filed by the due date.

Please make sure all District or Branch finances are in order and that Bank Statements are reconciled through December 31, 2023. Remember that the Gross Receipts are total amounts received without subtracting any costs or expenses. These amounts include, but are not limited to, Membership and Hospitalization Dues, Dinners, Fundraisers, Raffle Tickets, Income from Convention Raffle Tickets and Calendar Sales, Interest from all Bank Accounts, Monetary Donations, etc. If you have any questions, or need help filing, please call the ICF Office at 1-888-423-1924.
