Dear Friends of the Italian Catholic Federation:

The 2024 National Eucharistic Congress, taking place July 17-21 in Indianapolis, is expected to draw tens of thousands of people for Masses, worship, talks, workshops, and more, to celebrate Christ's true presence in the Eucharist. As we embrace this wonderful opportunity to bring Jesus to others in the Eucharist, let us ask ourselves and our Branches how we become a better Eucharistic people. Remembering that Jesus has opened the door for you, and through his Church, he invites you into a personal relationship with God, but God will not force you to choose Him.

Christ comes to us in the Eucharist, offering Himself to us: Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. He nourishes us, offering Himself as "our daily bread." It is easy for us to overlook this extraordinary gift. Even people who go to Mass each Sunday forget that Jesus is not merely symbolically present, but truly and substantially present. 
Therefore, we need to revitalize our commitment to gather in the Sunday assembly as God has summoned us to do, to share the Word, to engage in heartfelt praise and thanksgiving for this offer of covenant love, to eat and drink the Eucharistic elements-the real Body and Blood of Jesus Christ-and

to serve one another in all aspects of life. Yes, the presence of Jesus Christ in the bread and wine is real, is true and is substantial

As we continue to give God thanks for our 100th Anniversary, may we look for ways in our local Branches to take time to pray before the Blessed Sacrament. It was Pope Saint John Paul II, who in his encyclical letter, Church of the Eucharist, reminds us "The Church draws her life from the Eucharist. This truth does not simply express a daily experience of faith but recapitulates the heart of the mystery of the Church. In a variety of ways, she joyfully ex-periences the constant fulfilment of the romise: "Lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age" (Mt. 28:20), but in the Holy Eucharist, through the changing of bread and wine into the body and blood of the Lord, she rejoices in this presence with unique intensity.

"For the most holy Eucharist contains the Church's entire spiritual wealth: Christ Himself, our Passover and living bread. Through His own flesh, now made living and life-giving by the Holy Spirit, He offers life to men." Lost Members

Vince Piro, Membership Committee

It is a fact that the Federation loses many members each year due to cancellations. If we were to retain even a portion of those members, our membership numbers would improve significantly Recently, during a membership recruit ment workshop, a member asked us to develop some strategies to get back "lost members," those whose memberships are about to expire or who have already let their memberships lapse after many months. Here are some ideas

First, understand why they left. Understanding why your members lapse back and making sure others don't follow them out the door. Send lapsed members a survey to ask them why they left and what might make them return in the future. Be sure to regularly review for help with a specific event. Don't ask feedback and incorporate your learnings into branch.

Begin a re-engagement campaign. As step one, send an expiration date email. Connecting with members the moment they lapse is a great way to catch those who were on the fence about renewing or simply forgot to renew. Remind them that their membership ends today and that you hope they'll renew right away so they don't miss out on any benefits

Then, send a 30 days past expiration date email. Members might have been busy around the time of their expiration day, letting the membership lapse unintentionally. Checking in with them a month after expiration day gives them some space after your first email and still allows you to give them another chance to renew

valued they are and offer a chance to get them engaged. If they do not want to rejoin, send a membership ending email. When it is time to drop lapsed members from your branch, this is a good time to give them one last chance to renew and let them

know the official date they will no longer be a member of your organization. is critically important to getting them Be sure to make this message friendly and keep the door open for them to return in the future. A year later, if it seems appropriate, call

the lapsed member again, asking them them to rejoin at this point but get them involved in branch activities.

Even if they chose to remain non-members, send them a calendar of branch events at the beginning of the year. Send them the branch newsletter. Send them invitations and announcements of fundraiser and special events. Send them a Christmas card. Let them know that they are not forgotten.

In all messages, remind your lapsed members of the benefits the ICF provides, and try to re-kindle the relationship with those members whose interest may have faded. Thank them for being a member. Remind them of the value your branch provides your parish and community and that their membership helps support that mission. Keep the tone friendly and inviting.



This narrative recounts her experiences with the hatred and horror of genocide the brutal torture and murder of her people - but more importantly, it recounts how during this time her faith grows as she questions God and receives answers through prayer that challenge her to accept God's love unconditionally and to forgive her enemies unconditionally. It is a moving narrative as it illustrates the power of prayer and the requirement of Christian forgiveness.

Throughout her time in hiding, Immaculee prays for hours a day, entering into a meditative trance at times. In prayer, she begins a dialogue with God in which she questions why this genocide is taking place and begs for protection from

However, Immaculee is challenged t put her faith into action. As she prays for protection, a demonic voice asks her. "Why are you calling on God? Don't you have as much hatred in your heart as the killers do? . . . How can you love God but hate so many of His creations?' She knows that she must learn to forgive the killers and she prays, "Touch my heart, Lord, show me how to forgive.' She struggles with forgiveness, but in the end, her love for God allows her to

learn to forgive and love those who have persecuted her people. To this reader, this was the most powerful lesson ir the book. In today's social and political climate, hatred and despise of those "on the other side" seems acceptable as people belittle and condemn those that disagree with them. What Immaculee's experiences remind us is that this i never acceptable to God.

As Christ challenges us, "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven."

Dear ICF Friends -

I hope this letter finds you all doing well. It was so wonderful to be back among ICF members this past weekend for the CC meeting and the 100th anniversary gala. (Thank you Br. 14 for inviting me!)

I wanted to apologize for being MIA for so long. COVID took a toll on my family, as we had to remain isolated for longer than most. Somewhere in there, I broke my knee and had surgery. Then in April 2023, I had a spinal fusion-it was 15 hours of surgery over two days which included a few complications. It was a tough surgery and recovery. Little did I know this would



be the easy part of the next year-plus. In the fall of 2023, I got a staph infection and sepsis. I was hospitalized for a week and had months of IV antibiotics. Unfortunately, all the infection was not cleared, and in January, I discovered an abscess on the scar on my back. I was also breaking out in a rash. Within 24 hours, I was admitted to UCSF urgently because the staph infection settled on my spine. All the equipment in my back needed to be replaced—and then some. The 7-hour surgery went fine except within days was in congestive heart failure. I was in the hospital for 2 1/2 weeks but home in time for Ben's 8th birthday. Ben and Matt have held up through this, and somehow, our family has made it out of what is hopefully the darkest of times. I was close to not making it and am incredibly grateful to be alive. Now, I am getting stronger all the time, will continue physical therapy for a year, and remain on antibiotics to suppress and prevent further infection. The best part is that my chronic back pain, the reason I had surgery in the first place, is no longer debilitating and mostly resolved!

My family and I did not get through all of this alone. We would like to extend our immense gratitude to the ICF. The branch donations, the personal donations, and the Gift of Love offset out-of-pocket medical expenses (totaling \$80,000 for two years). Most of all, we appreciate your love, friendship, and prayers.

I am back on the horse: trying to resume Bollettino articles; visiting branches (please contact me if you would like me to come visit your branch or speak at an event); and planning the convention blood drive. I am planning to be at convention and I hope to see you there

I can never adequately express how much you all mean to me. I have known many of you since I became involved with ICF through Cooley's Anemia in 1998-you are a family to me. Thank you again, from the bottom of our hearts. With Love and Gratitude,

Tips for Donating Blood By the Live to Give Committee

We hope you have signed up to donate blood and save lives at the ICF convention. For those of you donating we wanted to give you some tips for a successful and smooth

Maintain a healthy iron level in your diet by eating iron rich foods (red meat, fish, poultry, beans, spinach, iron-fortified cereals and raisins).

Hydrate well in the days before your donation and drink an extra 16 oz. of water

Eat a healthy meal before your donation. Avoid fatty foods (if there is too much fat in your blood, your donation cannot be tested for infectious diseases and the

If you are a platelet donor, do not take aspirin for two days leading up to your

Recruit a friend to donate blood with you! Remember to bring your donor card and driver's license.

Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow.

Let the person taking your blood know if you have a preferred arm and show them any good veins that have been used successfully in the past to draw blood. Relax, listen to music, talk to other donors or read during the donation process. Enjoy snacks and drinks in the refreshments area immediately after donating.

Drink an extra four (8 ounce) glasses of liquids and avoid alcohol over the next 24

Remove the wrap bandage (if you had one put on your arm) within the next hour. Keep the strip bandage on for the next several hours.

To avoid a skin rash, clean the area around the strip bandage with soap and water. Do not do any heavy lifting or vigorous exercise for the rest of the day. If the needle site starts to bleed, apply pressure to it and raise your arm straight up

for about 5-10 minutes or until bleeding stops. If you experience dizziness or lightheadedness after donation, stop what you are doing and sit down or lie down until you feel better. Avoid performing any activity

where fainting may lead to injury for at least 24 hours. Call the blood bank if questions arise or to report if you required medical care after

Continue to eat iron-rich food. If you donate frequently talk to your doctor about taking a multi vitamin with iron to ensure that you replenish your iron stores. *Thank you for giving the gift of life!* Source: https://www.redcrossblood.org/


