Book Review -- Books on the Italian American Immigrant Experience



Pope Leo XIV reminds us, "No one is exempted from striving to ensure respect for the dignity of every person, especially the most frail and vulnerable, from the unborn to the elderly, from the sick to the unemployed,

citizens and immigrants alike." His beliefs are in line with decades old Catholic teaching and call on us to treat each person with dignity and mercy. However, in today's climate, the rhetoric surrounding immigration can often be heated with immigrants being demonized and stereotyped. Of course, many of us, the descendants of immigrants, know that this hatred and discrimination is not new. Our ancestors faced it. They faced humiliation and disgrace from others as they tried to make a better life for their families in a new world. Below are several books with their publisher's descriptions that tell us of this history and can act as reminders that we must treat each person with respect.

La Storia: Five Centuries of the Italian American Experience by Jerre Mangione

From the early Italian adventurers who played an important role in the European expansion across the Atlantic to the political and business leaders of the 1990s, this book tells a dramatic story. The heart of the story is the mass migration that took place between 1880 and 1924, when a whole culture left its ancient roots to settle in the cities and townsof America



Blood of My Blood: The Dilemma of the Italian-Americans (Picas Series, No. 7) by Richard Gambino

Blood of My Blood weaves together the history, sociology and psychology

of first, second, and third-generation Italian Americans. Its data is presented with scholarly precision; yet the author's personalized style, which he peppers with autobiographical tidbits, makes it immensely readable. Unlike most books written by academics, this one compels the reader to feel as well as to know.



Vendetta: The True Story of the Largest Lynching in U.S. History (22) (Picas series) by Richard Gambino (Author)

Eleven Italian Americans were ynched in New Orleans on March 14, 891. The lynching caused a crisis between the President and the Congress of the United States, between Washington and Rome. It also introduced a sinister word to America: Mafia.



Branded: How Italian Immigrants Became 'Enemies' During World War II - by Lawrence W. DiStasi

Branded is a chronological narrative of the WWII restrictions on Italian immigrants without U.S. citizenship, who were branded "enemy aliens" at the outset of the war. The story starts with the government's preparations in the days before the war, takes us through Presidential Proclamation


2527 in December 1941 which made 600,000 Italian immigrants 'alien enemies' of their adopted country, and then fills out the narrative of the restrictions, internments, and evacuations that many suffered, taking us to the postwar conclusion. For even after official government confirmation--in Public Law #106-451--that these events took place, large portions of the American public still have no idea that any of it happened; still history texts that omit the truth about what happened to Italian immigrants on the WWII home front. This is because the accepted public narrative of home front violations during WWII has traditionally denied omitted it.



The Italian Americans: A History Hardcover – by Maria Laurino

From extensive archival materials and interviews with well-known Italian Americans, Maria Laurino strips away stereotypes and nostalgia to tell the complicated, centuries-long story of the true Italian-American experience.

Looking beyond the familiar Little Italys and stereotypes fostered by The Godfather and The Sopranos, Laurino reveals surprising, fascinating lives: Italian-Americans working on sugarcane plantations in Louisiana to those who were lynched in New Orleans;



the banker who helped rebuild San Francisco after the great earthquake; families interned as "enemy aliens" in World War II. From anarchist radicals to "Rosie the Riveter" to Nancy Pelosi, Andrew Cuomo, and Bill de Blasio; from traditional artisans to rebel songsters like Frank Sinatra, Dion, Madonna, and Lady Gaga, this book is both exploration and celebration of the rich legacy of Italian-American life.

Readers can discover the history chronologically, chapter by chapter, or serendipitously by exploring the trove of supplemental materials. These include interviews, newspaper clippings, period documents, and photographs that bring the history to life.

As these books illustrate, immigration is a complex issue with many different experiences and stories. They illustrate that whatever one's stance is on immigration policy, immigrants themselves deserve to be treated with dignity and respect.



Apostolate -- Mission San Miguel ---**Oldest Catholic Church in USA**

The month of July holds deep significance for Americans, as we celebrate the founding of our nation on July 4, the day in 1776 when the Declaration of Independence was adopted. This powerful document

marked the beginning of the United States' journey toward democracy and self-governance.

However, long before 1776, another significant historical milestone was unfolding in what would later become the southwestern United States. In 1610, Spanish Franciscan missionaries established Mission San Miguel in what is now Santa Fe, New Mexico. This mission is recognized as one of the oldest Catholic churches in the continental United States

The missionaries who founded San Miguel were part of broader efforts by the Spanish to establish religious. cultural, and social institutions in the New World. Their goal was to share the Christian faith with the Indigenous peoples of the region.

Like many early mission churches, Mission San Miguel has undergone several restorations over the centuries, yet it retains key elements of its original adobe construction. The church features a single rectangular nave and measures approximately 24 feet high, 70 feet long, and 25 feet wide. The front of the mission faces west and is distinguished by a central bell tower.

Inside, visitors will find a number of religious paintings, including depic-tions of Jesus Christ, St. Michael the Archangel, St. Teresa of Ávila, St. Francis of Assisi, and the Annunciation. Mass continues to be celebrated at the church, with a regular Sunday service.

f you are visiting Santa Fe, Mission San Miguel offers not only a place for spiritual reflection but also a meaningful connection to the early religious and cultural history of the region. It remains a cherished landmark in the story of American faith and heritage.

As we celebrate Independence Day, it's fitting to reflect on one of the most enduring symbols of American freedom: the *Liberty* Bell. Located in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the Liberty Bell is a treasured relic of the



nation's founding and a timeless icon of liberty and justice.

The bell is most famously associated with July 8, 1776, when it was reportedly rung—alongside other church bells across Philadelphia-to mark the first public reading of the *Declaration of* Independence. While historians debate whether the Liberty Bell itself rang on that day, tradition has firmly linked it to this defining moment in American history.

Commissioned in 1751 by the Pennsylvania Provincial Assembly, the bell was intended for the Pennsylvania State House, now known as Independence Hall. It was cast in London and cost around £150, or approximately \$300 at the time. Upon arrival, the bell cracked during a test ringing and had to be recast twice by local founders John Pass and John Stow, whose names are still visible on its surface.

Inscribed on the bell is a verse from the Book of Leviticus:

"Proclaim LIBERTY Throughout all the Land unto all the Inhabitants Thereof." — Levítícus 25:10






Heritage — The Legacy of the Liberty Bell Let Freedom Ring







The Liberty Bell weighs more than 2,000 pounds and is primarily made of copper and tin. It was traditionally rung on Independence Day and other important occasions until 1835, when it developed a major crack, reportedly while being rung during the funeral of Chief Justice John Marshall. Since then, it has been symbolically struck on rare and significant occasions.

Today, the Liberty Bell resides in the Liberty Bell Center near Independence Hall, where it continues to inspire millions of visitors each year. Though it no longer rings, its message still resounds: a call to freedom, unity, and justice for
