Book Review -- Women of War: The Italian Assassins, Spies, and Couriers Who Fought the Nazis

Often when history gets written, some people get left out of the story. Their contributions are either ignored, forgotten, or diminished. In Women of War: The Italian Assassins, Spies, and Couriers Who Fought the Nazis, Suzanne Cope aims to bring to the forefront the forgotten stories and contributions of the Italian women who resisted Nazi occupation and Fascist rule during World War II.

Below is the publisher's description of this fascinating book that focuses on the lives of four women resisting the forces of suppression and oppression. Their life stories - left out of the traditional annuals of history - serve as reminders of the importance of standing up for what we believe in.

"The gripping, true, and untold history of the Italian anti-fascist resistance during World War II, told through the stories of four spectacularly courageous women fighters

From underground soldiers to intrepid spies, Women of War unearths the hidden history of the brave women who risked their lives to overthrow the Nazi occupation and liberate Italy. Using primary sources and brand new scholarship, historian Suzanne Cope illuminates the roles played by women while Italians struggled under dual foes: Nazi invaders and Italian fascist loyalists.

Cope's research and storytelling introduces four brave and resourceful women who risked everything to overthrow the Nazi occupation and pry their future from the fascist grasp. We meet Carla Capponi in Rome, where she made bombs in an underground bunker then ferried them to their deadly destination wearing lipstick and a trenchcoat; and Bianca

Guidetti Serra who rode her bicycle up switchbacks in the Alps, dodging bullets while delivering bags of clandestine newspapers and munitions to the anti-fascist armies hidden in the mountains. In Florence, the young future author of Italy's new constitution, Teresa Mattei, carried secret messages and hid bombs; while Anita Malavasi led troops across the Apennine Mountains. Women of War brings their experiences as underground resistance fighters, partisan combatants, spies, and saboteurs to life.

Essential and original, Women of War offers not only a reexamination of the elision of women from vital WWII history but also a valuable perspective on the ongoing fight for gender equality and social justice. After all, these were the women who launched a feminist movement as they fought for the future of their country, and what that could mean for its women, all while under Nazi and fascist fire."

Suzanne Cope is a scholar and journalist and the author of *Power Hungry: Women of the Black Panther Party and Freedom Summer and Their Fight to Feed a Movement.* Her writing has appeared in several magazines and newspapers, including The *Atlantic, The New York Times,* The *Washington Post,* and *Los Angeles Review of Books.* She is a professor at New York University.



Family Recipe--Sweet Potato Pie

Convention in Visalia is now a fond memory; always fun getting together with friends and rekindling friendships. Kathy and I went a few days early to shop all the antique stores in the Visalia area – always a fun time.

Heading into autumn comfort food and pumpkins come to mind. This recipe is a combination of recipes from 2 great southern cooks (and entertainers) – Trisha Yearwood and Patti LaBelle.

Sweet Potato Pie

1 ½ cups canned sweet potatoes or 2-3 roasted, peeled and pureed sweet potatoes equaling 1 ½ cups (I use fresh)

1 cup light brown sugar (or a combination of brown and white sugar)

1/4 cup granulated sugar

2 large eggs

5 Tbls. butter, softened

1-2 Tbls. butter, melted, for bottom of pie crust

1/2 cup milk or half and half or evaporated milk (I usually don't have milk, but I keep evaporated milk in the pantry in case I need it for cooking) may need a little more milk to get a consistency you like.

1 tsp. vanilla extract

½ tsp. ground cinnamon

1 tsp. ground nutmeg

Pinch of salt

1 pie shell, uncooked (I use the Pillsbury pie crust that is found in the refrigerator section of the grocery store) Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Place

pie crust dough in a 9 inch pie plate, crimp edges to your liking. Brush the interior of the pie shell with melted butter. Sprinkle ¼ cup of brown sugar over the bottom of the pie shell. Bake until the dough is set and just beginning to brown, about 15 minutes. If the pie shell puffs – DO NOT prick.

Lower heat to 325 degrees.

Meanwhile, in a medium bowl, using an electric beater/mixer, combine the sweet potatoes, remaining ³/₄ cup brown sugar, eggs, butter, milk, vanilla, cinnamon, nutmeg and salt. Beat until thoroughly blended and smooth. Pour mixture into prepared pie shell. Sprinkle ¹/₄ cup granulated sugar over top. Allow pie to sit for 15 minutes before baking to allow the sugar to melt into the mixture.

Bake until a toothpick, inserted into the center, comes out clean. About 1hour 15 minutes.

NOTE: You can just pour mixture in an unbaked pie shell, but I found preparing it as stated above makes for an extra layer of delicious flavor.

Also, adding a little ginger (1/2 to 1 tsp.) and/or clove (1/2 tsp.) will make this sweet potato pie anything but boring.

Hoping you might like to share some of your specialties or the family recipes that have been handed down with the members of the ICF. Remember a good Italian cook measures with their eyes and heart!

MEMORIAL MASS: The day began with a moving Memorial Mass, presided over by Reverend Christopher Bennett, Spiritual Director, with Deacon Karl Welsbacher, Father Greg Kimm, and Father Mario Rizzo. Crystal and Allen Watts filled the church with beautiful music, while Deacon Karl read the Gospel.

Father Chris shared a heartfelt reminder that the two most important days in our lives are the day we are born and the day we return to God. As members reflected on loved ones lost this past year, he offered a comforting image of them seated at the banquet table with Jesus. He reminded everyone that heaven is being surrounded by family and friends—and that love is not something we merely talk about, but something we live.

SPIRITUAL WORKSHOP: Following Mass, Reverend Bennett led a spiritual workshop designed to help

participants reconnect and center themselves. It only takes one snowflake to create an avalanche.

Father asked "Are you a holy person?" and wanted those to stand up. Not many people stood up and Father asked why? Some people responded.

Is there something God cannot do? Yes. He can't not Love.

First thing in the morning—get up, go on your knees and say "Good morning dear Jesus, what can I do for you today?"

Women have so much to offer in the Church. A Mother's heart is so important to extend love to others.

The uplifting session encouraged reflection, renewal, and deeper faith.

MEMBERSHIP WORKSHOP: The Membership Committee—Vince Piro, Dr. Vincent Malfitano, Andy Pappani, Rosemary Cook, and Pat

Mages—hosted an interactive work shop exploring how ICF can continue to grow and stay relevant across gen-

Members discussed surveys on engagement, enjoyed brainstorming about new initiatives, and learned about creative outreach efforts, including the first ICF podcast: Bold Traditions—ICF Voices - Faith, Heritage, Traditions curated by **Dr. Vince.** For details, contact DrVince@ICFVoices.org."

TECHNOLOGY 102 WORKSHOP:

George Leonard (Co-President, Br. 36 Monterey) and Patrick Senge (Br. 438 & 450 Lincoln) led an eye-opening workshop on technology tools for branches. George shared how Monterey uses a database and email marketing through Wix to keep members connected and ensure events are sold out in advance. They use WIX.com for \$400/ year to host website. Their complete

membership information is stored in their own database in Wix that Br. 36 uses email marketing. Patrick guided participants through practical Excel tips, showing how spreadsheets can streamline tasks far better than calculators. Members left with practical skills to apply immediately in their branches. There are templates on icf.org

GENEALOGY WORKSHOP: Fr. Greg Kimm led a fascinating dive into genealogy research, showing participants how to interpret historical records such as the 1890 birth register and marriage indexes. He cautioned about common mistakes—like confusing witness names with fathers' names or mistaking declaration dates for birth dates. Helpful resources included the Italian government's archives (antenati. cultura.gov.it), Ancestry.com, and the free FamilySearch.org.

ITALIAN WORKSHOP: Francesca Taylor (Br. 67) brought Italian heritage to life through the lens of opera. She guided the audience through four classics—La Bohème, Don Pasquale, Gianni Schicchi, and La Traviata—explaining their choruses, dialogue, and the power of opera vocabulary. She encouraged everyone to use music as a bridge to culture: "Keep singing and keep music in our lives."

ICF PROGRAMS & FUNDRAIS-ING: Lisa Crudo explored creative strategies for planning engaging branch activities and building participation across the community. It covered best practices for organizing successful fundraisers, from setting clear goals to promoting events and maximizing

support for ICF charities.

ADOPTION OF RULES/REGULA-TIONS to ensure smooth voting procedures; led by Grand Parliamentarian Leonard Zasoski, Jr. This included setting ground rules for speaking and discussion.

CREDENTIAL REPORT explained by Grand Secretary Lauren Kilcullen highlighted 129 voting delegates present including Central Council members. Three chaplains were also present.

TREASURER'S REPORT described by Grand Financial Secretary Lisa Crudo reviewed the financial packet, including profit and loss projections.

BYLAWS discussion led by **Vince Piro** encouraged everyone to complete and submit a membership survey. Also, dues which are due in January each year, are going from \$39.60 + \$2.40 for Apostolate fund per person to the proposed and adopted to \$42.60 + \$2.40 for Apostolate fund in 2026.

CENTRAL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

followed the candidates speeches where each shared two-minute speeches outlining their visions for ICF's future prior to voting for 8 of the 10 candidates.

PODCAST PRESENTATION: Dr. Vince Malfitano shared how communication has transformed since ICF was first founded. Back then, there were no cell phones or emails—but today, in our second century, digital communication is essential. Most people now get their

news and information online, often through podcasts. Vince highlighted how podcasts can be a powerful way to connect with younger generations who are searching for faith but struggling to find a connection. Unlike the *Bollettino*, podcasts can reach them where they are. He invited members to share their thoughts and suggestions on "Family, Faith, Heritage, and Tradition" by emailing him at DrVince@ICFVoices.com.

DISCUSSION ON FUTURE OF AWARDS

Led by Lauren Kilcullen, this session raised important questions about the awards program. Some felt there were too many awards, while others thought the award packages were too complex. Suggestions included reducing the number of awards from five to three, allowing more time to complete the packages, or encouraging branches to put greater effort into recognizing deserving individuals and groups.

He described his ministry with Contemplatives in Action, which led to the creation of a lunch ministry that has distributed over 23,000 lunches since April 2020. He affirmed his commitment to continue this mission.







REMARKS FROM BISHOP JO-SEPH V. BRENNAN

The Bishop of Fresno, serving since 2019, spoke on the value of earthly life and God's bounty:

"This earthly life is so valuable...life we have to engage in our love for our brother and sister and that's what our God's Bounty is."

He shared how every parish in the Fresno Diocese now celebrates a St. Joseph's Table, a tradition he has introduced. Though not Italian, he said, "I like to think of myself as a citizen of the world."

CLOSING PRAYER was offered by Father Christopher Bennett:

"May God continue working in us to do something wonderful tomorrow."




























CONVENTION GENERAL SESSION

- OPENING PRAYER
- RESOLUTIONS AND COMMU-**NICATIONS**

NATIONAL CHARITY PRESEN-**TATION to Dr. Thomas Coates** was presented with a check for \$48,800 for the thalassemia program. He thanked everyone and said "Given everything going on, not just the amount...but the spirit that shows every year. Helping others is a hoot...and we need that more than ever." He related that there were now two cures for thalassemia that involved gene therapy which costs approximately \$2.5 million.

Laurice Levine shared that this year CHLA would have an outdoor Fall Fest at the end of September that could be attended by ICF. The Christmas party would still be on restricted terms due to flu season.

Discussion about Scholarship Ideas led by chairperson Carmen Kilcullen. The scholarship program started in 1965. Some of ideas/concerns branches suggested were that they want the scholarship money to go to their communities instead of going out of the area.; the dollar amount should be increased from \$400 to maybe \$1000. It would be better to have few scholarships at an increased amount; given fewer first year scholarships and more of subsequent years.

COMMITTEE RECOGNITION:

APOSTOLATE/CHARITY—led by Carmen Kilcullen was "blown away by what you've done with 60 of 87 branch es reporting." This year \$427,081 was given to Apostolate charities. This is a substantial increase from last year.

AWARDS LUNCHEON

Welcome & Opening

Convention Director and Grand 2nd Vice President Lauren Kilcullen opened the session with a warm welcome. Roselynne McNeal, Central Council Life Member, served as Mistress of Ceremonies, offering a blessing that highlighted the ICF's spirit of faith, charity, and genuine care for community.

OPENING PRAYER: Father Mario Rizzo invited all to pray intentionally for friends of every background—Italian, Chinese, Irish, and more—reminding members that "God is with us even in difficult times."

GRAND PRESIDENT'S AWARD:

Presented to Vince Saso by Grand President Denise Antonowicz, who praised him as "a person who has given so much so quietly for so long...a fixture at fundraisers and a true friend to ICF. He is a rare individual who does not see a problem, but rather sees a person, a neighbor, a friend."

In accepting, Vince said: "I am extremely honored to accept this award. We are resilient and strong like our ancestors...they taught us to be humble and help others. That makes us wise, with never-ending strength for almost 54 years." He then generously donated his award to the Cooley's Anemia Fund.

ST. 


