Several members of the Central Council were in attendance including Grand President Franklyn Lopes, Grand 2nd Vice President Lisa Crudo, Grand Treasurer Deborah Rodondi, Grand Parliamentarian Leonard Rossi and Grand Sentinel Mike Rossi.

We had several presentations including Grand President Franklyn Lopes, Jr. presenting the 100-year sash, South San Francisco Vice Mayor Mark Addiego presenting a proclamation by the City, California State Assemblymember Diane Papan's District Director David Burruto presenting a proclamation from the State of California, a proclamation was received from Congressmember Kevin Mullin's office and locally the Santo Cristo Society, a Catholic lay organization founded in South San Francisco in 1912, presented a proclamation honoring our branch's contribution to the community over the last 100 years.

Other special guests included three Past Presidents of Branch 7 (Lola Migliore of SSF, Kelly Teglia of Bakersfield, and Frank Risso of SSF). Lou Pucci, son of the late South City based Central Council member and early ICF organizer Joe Pucci, came with his wife Melinda all the way from Cloverdale to join the celebration.

There was a silent auction and raffle to help raise funds for the Branch's charitable work with donations from businesses and members throughout the Bay Area.



Message from our Spiritual Director "Gateway to God's Bounty"

Dear Friends of the Italian Catholic Federation:

It is hard to believe that Advent is already upon us. The days have grown shorter, and the world seems to pause in anticipation, waiting for something wonderful. As we stand at the threshold of this sacred season, let us remember that Advent invites us to open ourselves to the great mystery of Christ's birth.

Each year, we are called to journey anew—to prepare our hearts, quiet our minds, and welcome the light that breaks through the darkness. It is a time to reflect, to hope, and to recognize the profound gift that God offers us through Jesus. The story of Christ's birth is not simply a tale from long ago; it is a living mystery, one that continues to shape and transform us. This Advent let us embrace its spirit with humility and joy. Let us be receptive to God's love, even when it may arrive in ways we do not expect. In opening our hearts, we make room for the peace, hope, and renewal that the Christ child brings.

May we support each other with kindness and compassion throughout this season. As we light the Advent candles week by week, let them remind us of the light that Christ brings into our lives and into the world.


But let us face it. Whether we like it or not, Christmas is generally a time when we cannot escape, even if we wanted to, from the present-buying, the dressing-up, the turkey and all the other things that we associate with this time of year. And that is O.K. So long as we understand that we

are commemorating an event so revolutionary, so completely new, so amazing that even the familiar ceremonials and traditions cannot take away its challenge to us.

What is so different and revolutionary about this event? It is just that it was so completely unexpected at the time of the birth of Jesus. The people were expecting a Messiah all right. They waited patiently for the one who would save them, just as Yahweh had brought them out of Egypt in the time of Moses. They were waiting for the outstretched arm, the mighty hand that would roll back the sea and herald the good news of salvation. The word of God was to live and dwell among them. And so, they waited for their king to arrive.

But what happened? A baby was born to a humble and poor servant girl. What is more, she was an unmarried mother, even more taboo than it is today. And this baby was born on a frosty night in December in a stable! Imagine the scene. How would you have reacted if you had heard that this was the Son of God, especially if you had heard the news from a couple of simple shepherds? Chances are you would have laughed your head off, or you would have said that they should be sent off to the hospital!

And yet, this baby was the Son of God, the Word made flesh and the one who would grow up in Nazareth and affect the lives of more people on earth than anybody else ever had or indeed has since. By choosing to be born in such a desolate and poor place, God was making a very definite statement about our value system. Change everything, he was saying, for-

get everything you once held dear, sell off your riches, give to the needy, share your cloak and follow me. The birth of Jesus in Bethlehem was the prologue to a life of service and challenge. The stable was an indication of the need for us to see grace and goodness and reality in the very poorest of places. If we call ourselves 'Christian' then this is what we cannot forget.

This Christmas and throughout the coming New Year, my prayer is that increasingly you will deepen your union with Christ through prayer and the celebration of the Eucharist and make Him present in our society by your witness and love.

May you and your family be richly blessed this Christmas season and as the coming year unfolds may the Prince of Peace bless each of you and grant you the joy of His Christmas.

Grand President's Monthly Message

Merry Christmas to all the members of the Italian Catholic Federation.

Rejoice, rejoice—our Savior is born!

This time of year always reminds

me of the many Christmases spent at Nonno and Nonna's house. We would go over the day before to set up the table, complete with her fine china. Mom and Aunt would start the prep work. Our Italian Christmas always included 20–25 people seated around the table.

On Christmas Day, we would return to my grandparents' house around 10:00 in the morning to put the food in the oven. Around 1:00, the Cruci, Ghio, Saslaw, and Keating families would all arrive with the dishes they had been asked to bring. We would sit in Nonna's kitchen, enjoying appetizers while the food was cooking.

Then we would go to the table. We began with the blessing and the pouring of wine, followed by shrimp, ambrosia, cranberry salads, my Aunt Nan's boniet bell peppers, and antipasto trays. Once this was done, the table was cleared to make way for the pasta—namely, lasagna, gnocchi, and spaghetti—accompanied by Nonna's homemade sauce.

Then came the main course: roast, stuffed chicken breasts, sweet potatoes, and vegetables. Once the main course was over, we would take a break. Some family members would go for a walk, while others would help rinse off the plates, combine leftovers, and prepare dessert, which we would have much later in the evening.

The pies would come out, coffee would be poured, and the brandy, amaretto, crème de menthe, and

crème de cacao would be added. The day would end around 8:00, and my grandparents would invite everyone to come back the next night for leftovers.

This is the tradition I grew up with and cherished until just about ten years ago.

I know each of you has your own traditions, and even if those traditions have passed, hold onto the memories—they're what keep you going, especially if your loved ones are no longer here.

A quote from St. Pope John Paul II

This Christmas, as we behold the infant Jesus in the crib, let us remember that God does not leave us alone in our human experience—with its struggles, trials, and moments of loneliness, as well as its peaks and joys. Through Jesus Christ, born of Mary, He has taken our nature into His. There is nothing in our lives that we can't share with God—nothing too insignificant or too overwhelming to bring before Him in prayer. And if we do this, not only will we be comforted; we will begin to share in His divine life.





Family Recipe--Three C Cookies

Here we are in the Christmas season, my favorite time for baking. I usually spend 1 to 2 full days baking, one recipe after another of all the delicious cookie recipes that have been shared with me from



family to friends. I pull out my many recipes and select about a dozen as the chosen for the year. The interesting thing is I am not a sweets person, so in memory of my maternal nonie (an amazing baker-as a young lady she worked at the local bakery in Pleasanton, CA) I continue her tradition of keeping the family supplied with cookies.

This recipe comes from Diane Martin from ICF Branch 7 in South San Francisco (the branch just celebrated their 100th anniversary). Diane brought them to a dinner meeting and passed them around. Since they were home made I had to try them. Not only am I not into sweets, but white chocolate is definitely not my kind of chocolate (I am a dark chocolate fan) but try I must – they were delicious! The notation on Diane's recipe says "very good". Enjoy!

Three C Cookies

½ cup unsalted butter

2/3 cup packed brown sugar

½ cup granulated sugar

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. baking soda

1 egg

1 egg yolk

2 tsp. vanilla

1 ½ cups flour

2 cups flaked coconut

1 cup coarsely chopped cashews

1 cup white chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 325 degrees.


In a large mixing bowl, beat butter with an electric mixer on medium to high speed for 30 seconds. Add sugar, salt and baking soda; beat until combined. Beat in egg, egg yolk and vanilla until combined. Beat in as much of the flour as you can with the mixer. Stir in the remaining flour with a wooden spoon. Stir in coconut, cashews and white chocolate chips.

Drop by rounded tablespoons onto a greased cookie sheet (I use parchment paper instead); flatten slightly. Place on top and lower racks in oven. Bake at 325 degrees for 6-7 minutes. Cool on cookie sheet for 2 minutes for easy removal. Remove cookies and cool completely on rack.

Hoping you might like to share some of your specialties or the family recipes that have been handed down with the members of the ICF. Send them to me at drodondi@comcast.net or mail to the ICF office and include a story if any. If you have questions, send them, also. I may not be able to answer them but we can put them out there for our readers and maybe find what you are looking for.

Remember a good Italian cook measures with their eyes and heart!






Book Review -- Children's Books 2025


As is customary, this month's

column is devoted to children's books that can make wonderful Christmas gifts for our children and grandchildren.





Reno Martinelli, longtime ICF member, along with Michael J. Alexander and Lauren Duran, has published their first book, Percy the Cat and the Mysterious Purr. It's a delightful children's book (for approximately ages 5–10) that is certain to entertain young readers as they follow the adventures of a mischievous feline who "roams the countryside looking for a tasty treat." This charming book is entertaining with both a clever story and engaging illustrations. Duran does a great job of expressing Percy's emotions in her illustrations, and Alexander and Martinelli delight the reader with Percy's journey. They also teach young readers to stop and think to overcome obstacles and to trust their inner "purr." This is a valuable lesson for young children who face obstacles—small and large—every day in their lives. Percy may not be perfect, but he knows that "sometimes it's good to slow down and think ... and maybe purr." This title is available on Amazon.com.



The Adventures of Cipollino




Piccolo

Heritage — Italian Christmas Traditions

For a country like the United States, which has many Italians, it's interesting that the Christmas season in Italy is very different—and refreshing—due to the relative absence of commercialism



and sales. Italian children don't make lists of toys they want; instead, they write letters to their mother and father expressing their love and appreciation. Traditionally, these letters are read after dinner on Christmas Eve. While some European traditions such as decorating an evergreen tree and giving gifts have become more common, many customs remain uniquely Italian.

One tradition familiar in the United States is the idea that "if you are not good, you will get coal in your stocking." This actually stems from the tradition of *La Befana*. According to legend, on the night Jesus was born, the Wise Men stopped at her house to ask

for directions and invited her to join them, but she refused. Later that same night, a shepherd also stopped to ask for directions and likewise invited her to come pay respect to the baby Jesus, but again she declined. After they left, she saw a bright star in the sky and reconsidered. She gathered toys that had belonged to her own child, who had died, and set out to find the stable to give them to the Christ Child. Unable to find Him, she now travels the world each year looking for Jesus and leaves toys for good children and coal for the bad ones.

In Italy, the traditional "coal," carbone dolce, is a rock candy that looks almost exactly like real coal. Another tradition still in place today is that the main celebration is held on Christmas Eve, not Christmas Day. Gift-giving traditionally occurs on January 6th, the Feast of the Epiphany—La Festa dell'Epifania.

Natale means Christmas, and *Buon Natale* is how Italians offer Christmas greetings.

I am always looking for recipes and this one came up and I remember my grandmother making this all the time when we were sick. This is a wonderful comfort soup.

450g Stellette Pastina

Two cloves garlic

One onion

Two carrots

Three celery sticks

One potato

8 cups chicken broth

1 Parmigiano Reggiano, rind

2 tbsp Parmigiano Reggiano

1 tbsp butter

1 tbsp olive oil

Chopped parsley for garnish and salt and pepper

Boil in chicken broth, onion, carrots, celery, garlic potato, for half hour to 40 minutes, you can add a little olive oil. Remove the vegetables discard the parm and in the blender add vegetables +2 scoops of broth. Blend until smooth and then add back into the pot. Boil the Pastina in a separate pot then drain and add Pastina to the soup until the consistency you like, usually thick. Ladle into a soup bowland garnished with some Parm and some butter and if you like a little parsley.

Enjoy, you will feel better soon, whether you are sick or not.


