Message from our Spiritual Director

Dear Friends of the Italian Cath-
olic Federation:

Wishing you many blessing for
the New Year and may God's
abiding love be with you. For the
one hope that still stands tall is
the hope of Jesus, who changes
us from within to see the gloom
without and breathe new pos-
sibilities into it. We find hope in
the Manger. The Manger is about
God's coming to us in His Son,
Jesus. We often make resolu-
tions when the New Year comes.
Sometimes, we can keep them,
and other times we don't fol-
low them, but that should never
discourage us. We all must have
a new beginning for a new year.

And so, this New Year, once
again we make some resolutions.
This is what we do at the begin-
ning of every year. But honestly,
have we really fulfilled all those
New Year's resolutions in the
past? There are two main reasons
why we have failed to accom-
plish most of our resolutions.
First, it is because most of them
are not resolutions but are mere
wishes. There is a vast difference
between a wish and a resolution.

A wish is a desire to attain a
particular goal, while a resolu-
tion specifically identifies the
concrete steps to be taken to
reach that goal. A wish says, "I
want to pass the Board Examina-
tion." A resolution will say, "I
will commit four hours of study
every day, set aside my Face-
book account and cell phone,

and have more time for prayer
each day." A wish will say, "I
want to be a better Christian this
year." A resolution says, "I will
faithfully pray the Rosary daily,
attend Mass every Sunday, go to
Confession every month, extend
my help to those who come to
me for help and volunteer in the
liturgical ministry of the parish."
When there is no concrete course
of action, it is just a wish, and not
a resolution. And, nothing will

An impactful way to take a mean-


Thalassemia (Cooley's Anemia) Trait

There are two main types of thalassemia trait: beta-thalassemia trait (more common among Italians) and alpha thalassemia trait. Individuals who have beta-thalassemia trait have one normal beta globin gene and one that is altered such that it makes little or no beta globin. There is not much scientific evidence that a person who has beta-thalassemia trait has any symptoms, although women with the trait may be more likely to develop anemia during pregnancy and thousands of people with trait report having symptoms such as fatigue and dizziness.

Thalassemia trait causes red blood cells to be a slightly smaller size, a condition caused microcytosis. Since iron deficiency is the most common cause of microcytosis Doctors often mistakenly misdiagnose thalassemia trait as iron deficiency anemia and prescribe iron supplements. However, thalassemia trait and iron deficiency are different problems, therefore before prescribing iron supplements, doctors should rule out thalassemia trait and/or perform lab tests to evaluate iron levels. A person with thalassemia trait can also be iron deficient, but if he or she is not iron deficient, iron supplements may result in excess body iron, which can deposit in many areas of the body and over time cause organ damage.

Testing for Thalassemia trait is easy!



It involves having a blood sample drawn which looks at the following:

- Hemoglobin electrophoresis with quantitative hemoglobin A2 and hemoglobin F
- Complete Blood Count (CBC)
- Iron studies (free erythrocyte protoporphyrin and ferritin)

Occasionally trait status cannot be determined by these screening tests alone. If iron deficiency is detected then an individual must be retested after completing a course of iron supplement therapy. With iron supplements iron deficiency should improve. If it does not it may be that the individual has thalassemia trait. Occasionally, DNA testing that directly examines the Alpha and/or Beta globin genes is necessary.

It is important for individuals and their partners to be aware of their thalassemia trait status, especially if you are of Italian descent (or other ancestry where Thalassemia is common). Again, since there are no symptoms, an individual may not know they have the trait until they have a child born with thalassemia major, a severe form of the disease. If both parents have the thalassemia trait there is a 25% chance that their child could be born with thalassemia major, a condition which requires lifelong treatment.

Family Recipe--Dirty Martini Dip

HAPPY NEW YEAR’S Every-one!!!

As we ended this year with Christmas parties, the ICF Executive Board had its Christmas party. Grand 1st Vice President Lauren Kilcullen from Healdsburg Br. 52 made this dip that had us all asking for the recipe. Several of the board members made it for their family Christmas parties and reported back that it was a great hit. So, if you are looking for a yummy appetizer for that special Valentine dinner or Easter family event, this is a must try.



¼ cup fresh chives, chopped
Dippers: crackers, veggies and/or chips

Make Ahead

Place cream cheese in a medium bowl. Beat with a mixer on medium 30 seconds. Add ¼ cup of the blue cheese, the sour cream, mayonnaise, vodka, olive brine, garlic and onion powder and cayenne pepper. Beat until nearly smooth. Fold in the remaining blue cheese, cheddar cheese, olives and chives. Transfer dip to an air tight container. Refrigerate at least 2 hours up to 5 days.

When ready to serve, if desired, garnish with chives and a few whole olives. Serve.

Dirty Martini Dip

Prep Time 15 minutes

Chill: 2 hours

Makes 10-12 servings

- 1 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese, at room temperature
- ½ cup crumbled blue cheese (2 oz.)
- 1/3 cup sour cream
- 1/3 cup mayonnaise
- ¼ cup vodka (delete for Virgin Dirty Martini Dip)
- 1 Tbls. brine from jar of olives
- ½ tsp. garlic powder
- ¼ tsp. onion powder
- 1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese (4 oz.)
- 1 cup pitted Castelvetrano olives, chopped

NOTE: For a totally different experience, I would also spread on baguette rounds and broil until bubbly (air fryer usually 2 minutes).

If I did not have the Castelvetrano olives in the house I would not be afraid to use pimento green olives or any other variation I might have in the fridge.

Pork, especially pork sausage (such as *cotechino* or *zampone*), is commonly served because pork symbolizes abundance and progress. The sausage is often sliced into coin-shaped pieces and served with lentils, sometimes alongside risotto. In Northern Italy, the meal may include meat or chicken served with spinach or other greens, along with lentils.



On New Year's Eve, Italians celebrate with champagne (or *prosecco*) and toast at midnight. After the fireworks, people exchange kisses and good wishes for the new year.

A long-standing (though now discouraged and often illegal) tradition involves "getting rid of the old" at midnight, symbolizing a fresh start. In the past, people would throw out old items such as shoes, furniture, pots, or dishes. If you were in Italy on New Year's Eve, you were traditionally warned to be careful of falling objects. The American tradition was to throw out your old calendar from the high-rise windows. The streets were full of paper and other items, out with the old in with the new.

No matter how you celebrate the New Year with family or friends, remember that lentils symbolize riches, good luck, and hope for the future.

They can contact their high school counselors about the **Italian Catholic Federation 1st Year \$500.00 Scholarship**, they can download the application using the link on the homepage of the ICF website or they can fill out and submit the application, with required documentation attached, online.

These are the **eligibility requirements for students**:

A High School Senior, a **total cumulative GPA (3 ½ years) of at least 3.2** and meets all of the requirements in either #1 or #2:

- 1) Are **Roman Catholic and of Italian Descent and live within the Roman Catholic Dioceses of California, Illinois and Reno, Nevada** (which also includes the other cities within the Diocese of Reno), only where Branches of the Federation are established. or
- 2) Are **Roman Catholic but need not be of Italian Descent** or live where Branches of the Federation are established if either Roman Catholic parent, guardian or grandparent is a member of the "Italian Catholic Federation" - membership of a Roman Catholic parent, guardian or grandparent is mandatory for #2.

*Please note the requirement of a parent or grandparent needing to be a member for Roman Catholic students who are not of Italian ancestry. A student cannot just meet the requirement of being a baptized Roman Catholic.

Again, please contact your local high schools where you would like to see applicants come from and make sure that they are promoting our scholarship program and have applications available.



IRS AND STATE OF CALIFORNIA FRANCHISE TAX BOARD

As you are aware, the IRS and Franchise Tax Board for the State of California require annual tax returns to be filed by our Districts and Branches.

It is important to remember that all Districts and Branches now have two numbers - a Federal Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the IRS and a State Tax ID Number for any forms filed with the State

The IRS limit for the tax year ending 2025 is the following:

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file IRS Form 990 EZ or 990.

Branches or Districts with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file IRS Form 990-N which is an e-Postcard.

The State limit for the tax year ending 2025 is the following:

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of more than \$50,000.00 will be required to file State Form 199.

Branches or Districts in California with Gross Receipts of \$50,000.00 or less will be required to electronically file State Form 199-N which is an e-Postcard.

THIS IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND MUST BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED

Both Forms must be filed no later than May 15, 2026. The IRS and State strictly adhere to this date, so please take this process seriously.

Any District or Branch who does not file for 3 consecutive years will lose its tax exempt status with the IRS and the State. If you lose your tax exempt status you will have to file paperwork and pay a fine in order to regain your tax exempt status.

Included in the Financial Secretaries' packet are materials that the District and Branch Financial Secretaries will need to help them with this process. District and Branch Presidents - please work with your Financial Secretary to go over the information when it is received and see that the appropriate forms are filed by the due date.

Please make sure all District or Branch finances are in order and that Bank Statements are reconciled through December 31, 2025. Remember that the Gross Receipts are total amounts received without subtracting any costs or expenses. These amounts include, but are not limited to, Membership and Hospitalization Dues, Dinners, Fundraisers, Raffle Tickets, Income from Convention Raffle Tickets and Calendar Sales, Interest from all Bank Accounts, Monetary Donations, etc.


